#### RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. To note the issues raised at the joint meeting of the Corporate Parenting Committee and Speakerbox on 25<sup>th</sup> October and the action plan agreed as set out in appendix 1.
- To note that the next meeting between Speakerbox and the CPC will be scheduled for week commencing the 7<sup>th</sup> April 2008

### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 3. Speaker Box is a supported group of children in Southwark's care who provide a forum for enhancing communication, consultation and service development activity.
- 4. It was agreed as part of Southwark' s Children Looked After (CLA) participation policy that meetings of the Corporate Parenting Committee and Speakerbox would be held twice a year at a venue appropriate for young people.

### **KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION**

- 5. The main issues raised during the meeting in October were:
  - Access to recreation facilities in Southwark;
  - Enhancements to health advice and consultations;
  - Delivery of exit interview process for CLA at 18 years;
  - Clarification of support options available for attending university.

#### **Policy implications**

- 6. The Corparate Parenting Committee has approved a participation strategy for children in Southwark's care. Bi-annual meetings and agreed action plans between the committee and Speakerbox are a major component.
- 7. Southwark's Children and Young People's Plan (CYPP) has identified children's participation as a key service development area.

#### **Community Impact Statement**

8. Making a positive contribution is one of the five *Every Child Matters* outcomes. Speakerbox provides an opportunity for empowerment and involvement of children looked after.

#### **Resource implications**

9. Several recommendations contained within the action plan have resource implications. It is envisaged that service enhancements will be achieved through improved partnership processes within the Council and with key partners to prioritise children in care.

## Consultation

10. Speakerbox provides invaluable feedback from children looked after about current services and how they can be improved for the future.

Four main issues raised:

- Health Issues Free phone service, LAC nurse monthly surgery, access to leisure centres
- Care Leavers Exit Interviews "Tell it how it was"
- Education further education funding
- Access to Free Leisure Activities –via Southwark providers

The advice line for young people to call if they do not want to go in person to speak to the LAC nurse is not free. If young people have no money, or no phone credit they cannot use the service. Speakerbox would like to request that a free phone number is set up for them to call. It was noted that nurses will phone back if young people ring them and request this – keeping costs down to a minimum for young people.	The processes and feasibility of setting up this will be undertaken and free phone/text number included in new leaflet for CLA advocating awareness and access to Nurse specialists. The location of the monthly surgeries was raised as an issue. Speakerbox said young people would prefer more anonymous locations such as at Peckham Pulse.
