### RECOMMENDATIONS

1. The Corporate Parenting Committee notes the progress of the Speakerbox action plan.

# **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

- 2. The Corporate Parenting Committee has undertaken to meet with Speakerbox on a bi-annual basis to develop an ongoing dialogue to shape and review service delivery for Looked-After children.
- 3. The inaugural meeting in October 2007 was externally facilitated and developed a joint action plan.
- 4. To support this process, the Head of CLA Services (and Senior CLA Service Managers) would meet on a termly basis to assist action plan implementation.
- 5. The main components of the action were:
  - 1. Delivery of programme to routinely seek feedback from young people leaving care to inform service delivery and appraisal "tell it as it was"
  - 2. Review and clarification of Southwark's policy to support care leavers attending university.
  - 3. Delivery of free access to Southwark's leisure facilities.
  - 4. Improving direct access to specialist nurses to improve health outcomes.
- 6. The second scheduled meeting took place on 10 April to provide updated information with regards to the action plan and to receive a presentation concerning the implementation of "tell it as it was".
- 7. This meeting was also attended by the Lead JAR inspector for children in care.

#### **KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION**

- 8. The action plan has been amended and updated following the meeting on 10 April and is presented as Appendix 1.
- 9. Speakerbox have undertaken the planned consultation process concerning the "tell it how it was" initiative with key teams in CLA services to shape the proposal and raise awareness/commitment.
- 10. Speakerbox undertook some research process with other local authorities to establish what services could be provided for care leavers attending university. These were discussed with CLA managers and presented as a revised strategy to the Corporate Parenting Committee.

- 11. Budgets have been identified to support the revised university strategy from April 2008 and Speakerbox have been involved in agreeing the contents of the leaflet.
- 12. The suggestions made by Speakerbox concerning how the CLA nurses can be contacted by text to a single (well publicised) phone have been implemented enabling young people to communicate at virtually no cost and determine the time and venue of meeting/conversations with the designated nurse.
- 13. Negotiations with Fusion have identified free places available to Looked-After children and care leavers from 13-19 years of age (Lifestyle membership).
- 14. Speakerbox have been involved in developing the leisure leaflet title and imagery for the leaflet which will launch the scheme.
- 15. Negotiations with Fusion are being undertaken to confirm that free swimming at Southwark's leisure facilities will also be available for younger children and their foster families.
- 16. The University and "tell it as it was" policies were approved by the March Corporate Parenting Committee.

#### POLICY IMPLICATIONS

17. There are regular meetings between Speakerbox and the Corporate Parenting Committee linked with the overall Corporate Parenting and CLA Participation Policies.

#### **COMMUNITY IMPACT STATEMENT**

18. The role of corporate parenting requires all agencies working with Southwark children to assume responsibility for parenting Looked-After children who are recognised as being amongst the most vulnerable. Whilst over 55% of Looked-After children are placed outside of the Southwark boundary, nearly all of them return to live in Southwark post-18. Effective corporate parenting will result in care leavers being able to make a positive contribution as they return to the community in adult life.

#### **RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS**

19. The work of Speakerbox is supported through the work of Southwark's Children's Rights Officer. Children's Specialist Services have also identified funding for a parttime Speakerbox representative to work alongside the Children's Rights Officer and facilitate the work of Speakerbox.

# CONSULTATION

20. The Speakerbox/Corporate Parenting Committee initiative is targeted to enable young people in Southwark's care to inform service development and service review.
