#### RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. That Dulwich Community Council allocate the unallocated amount of £21,042 from the 2012-13 Cleaner Greener Safer funding to two proposed schemes in College ward; £15,642 be allocated to 120711 Sydenham Hill estate improvements and £5,400 be allocated to 120417 Living Walls and Security/safey improvements at Dulwich Upper Wood LNR.
- 2. That Dulwich Community Council note that an additional £1,000 is needed to install three finger posts in Village ward. £1,000 be reallocated from 103639 Cherry Blossom Festival, reducing that award from £5,000 to £4,000, to 103641 2012 Finger posts, increasing that award from £5,000 to £6,000.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

- 3. Cleaner Greener, Safer (CGS) is part of the London Borough of Southwark's capital programme. Between 2003 and 2010 £3.25m has been made available each year for local residents to apply for awards to make their local area a better place to live. The programme attracts hundreds of proposals ranging from a few hundred pounds for bulb planting to brighten up open spaces to tens of thousands of pounds to create community gardens. These projects often introduce new ideas such as outdoor gyms in public spaces, community gardens, public art and energy saving projects which not only make the borough cleaner, greener and safer but greatly contribute to a sustainable public realm by involving residents in the funding process and in the delivery of projects.
- 4. Dulwich Community Council approved a total of 37 schemes at the meeting on 14 March 2012, totalling £219,162. A total of £21,042 remained unallocated.

#### **KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION**

- 5. It is recommended that unallocated amount of £21,042 contained within the 2012-13 capital programme be allocated to two proposals submitted by local community organisations for funding from 2012-13 programme.
- 6. It is recommended that the available funding can be awarded as follows £15,642 to 120711 Sydenham Hill estate improvements and £5,400 to 120417 Living Walls and Security/safey improvements at Dulwich Upper Wood LNR.
- 7. It is recommended that the award for 103641- 2012 Fingerposts is increased from £5,000 to £6,000 enabling the installation of three fingerposts. The award to 103641 Cherry Blossom Festival is reduced by £1,000 to £4,000.

8. The award of £4,000 for additional tree planting through 103641 Cherry Blossom Festival is not affected by the reduction of £1,000 as the number of trees to be planted will be determined by the total available budget.

#### **Community impact statement**

- 9. The reallocation of funding will have a positive impact on the community and improve the public space and residents' safety on Sydenham Hill estate and improve security at Dulwich Upper Wood LNR in College ward.
- 10. The replacement of three finger posts will improve the public space in Village ward.

#### **Resource implications**

11. This is the allocation of remaining 2012-13 CGS funding and reallocation of £1,000. CGS funding is devolved to Community Councils to spend on suitable projects. Management of the reallocation of the funding will be contained within existing budgets.

#### Consultation

12. All Cleaner Greener Safer projects require consultation with stakeholders, including the project applicant, local residents and Tenants and Residents Associations where appropriate. This consultation has already taken place and further consultation will be carried out with Sydenham Hill estate TRA and College ward members in respect of that scheme.

#### **REASONS FOR URGENCY**

- 13. The decisions on the reallocation of funding are required urgently as the residents living on Sydenham Hill estate are suffering from anti-social behaviour. The Cleaner Greener Safer award is needed to carry out some preventative measures.
- 14. The project 103641 2012 Finger posts requires an additional £1,000 to implement and prices from the supplier are likely to increase in the next two months. Increasing the award from £5,000 to £6,000 will result in best value for the council.

#### **REASONS FOR LATENESS**

15. The report has been delayed in order to verify the costs of projects.
