#### RECOMMENDATION

1. That the licensing sub-committee considers an application made by Floreat Ticino Limited for a premises licence to be granted under the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of the premises known as Ground and Lower Ground Floors, 177 Bermondsey Street, London SE1 3UW.

#### 2. Notes:

- a) This application forms a new application for a premises licence, submitted under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003. The application is subject to a representation from a responsible authority and representations from other persons and is therefore referred to the sub-committee for determination.
- b) Paragraphs 8 to 10 of this report provide a summary of the application under consideration by the sub-committee. A copy of the full application is attached as Appendix A.
- Paragraphs 11 and 12 of this report deals with the representations received to the premises licence application. Copies of the relevant representations are attached as Appendices B and C
- d) A copy of the council's approved procedure for hearings of the sub-committee in relation to an application made under the Licensing Act 2003, along with a copy of the hearing regulations, has been circulated to all parties to the meeting.

## **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

## The Licensing Act 2003

- 3. The Licensing Act 2003 received royal assent on 10 July 2003. The Act provides a licensing regime for:
  - The sale of and supply of alcohol
  - The provision of regulated entertainment
  - The provision of late night refreshment.
- 4. Within Southwark, the licensing responsibility is wholly administered by this council.

- 5. The Act requires the licensing authority to carry out its functions under the Act with a view to promoting the four stated licensing objectives. These are:
  - The prevention of crime and disorder
  - The promotion of public safety
  - The prevention of nuisance
  - The protection of children from harm.
- 6. In carrying out its licensing functions, a licensing authority must also have regard to:
  - The Act itself
  - The guidance to the act issued under Section 182 of the Act
  - Secondary regulations issued under the Act
  - The licensing authority's own statement of licensing policy
  - The application, including the operating schedule submitted as part of the application
  - Relevant representations.
- 7. The premises licence application process involves the provision of all relevant information required under the Act to the licensing authority with copies provided by the applicant to the relevant responsible bodies under the Act. The application must also be advertised at the premises and in the local press. The responsible authorities and other persons within the local community may make representations on any part of the application where relevant to the four licensing objectives.

#### **KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION**

## The premises licence application

8. On 6 February 2014 Floreat Ticino Limited applied to this council for the grant of a new premises licence in respect of the premises known as Ground and Lower Ground Floors, 177 Bermondsey Street, London SE1 3UW.

The application is summarised as follows:

- The sale of alcohol to be consumed on the premises:
   Monday to Sunday: 11.00 to 23.00
- Opening hours

Monday to Sunday: 11.00 to 23.00.

9. The premises licence application form provides the applicant operating schedule. Parts J, K, L, and M set out the proposed operating hours and operational controls measures in full, with reference to the four licensing objectives as stated in the Licensing Act 2003. Should a premises licence be issued in respect of the application the information provided in part M of the operating schedule will form the basis of conditions that will be attached to the licence. A copy of the application is attached to this report as Appendix A.

#### **Designated premises supervisor**

10. The proposed designated premises supervisor is Mr Christian Jensen.

## Representations from responsible authorities

11. Southwark Police Licensing Office (SPLO) have submitted a representation requesting that certain control measures be added to the operating schedule of the application and that these measures shall become conditions on any licence issued in regards to the application. The applicant agreed to the inclusion of the suggested control measures and SPLO withdrew their representation. A copy of SPLO's representation and related correspondence is attached to this report as Appendix B.

## Representations from other persons

12. 11 representations have been submitted by local residents. The representations are concerned that the intended operation of the premises will result in public nuisance and anti-social behaviour in the locale. A number of representations refer to incorrect times in respect of licensable activities and also incorrect licensable activities. All people who submitted representations were informed of the correct details of the application. Copies of the representations submitted by other persons and related correspondence are attached to this report as Appendix C.

#### Conciliation

13. SPLO have submitted a representation requesting that certain control measures be added to the operating schedule of the application and that these measures shall become conditions on any licence issued in regards to the application. The applicant agreed to the inclusion of the suggested control measures and SPLO withdrew their representation. A copy of SPLO's representation and related correspondence is attached to this report as Appendix B. The applicant was advised that they could write a conciliation statement that would be distributed to any local residents who submitted representations, and also of the possibility of a conciliation meeting with such residents being arranged, however the applicant did not provide a conciliation statement or request a conciliation meeting

#### **Operating history**

14. No premises licence (or equivalent licence under prior licensing legislation) has been or is held by the applicant or any other party in regards to the premises, however temporary event notices (TENs) have been served in regards to the premises on behalf of the applicant as detailed below:

## Southwark council statement of licensing policy

- 16. Council assembly approved Southwark's statement of licensing policy 2011-14 on 12 October 2011. Sections of the statement that are considered to be of particular relevance to this application are:
  - Section 3 which sets out the purpose and scope of the policy and reinforces the four licensing objectives
  - Section 5 which sets out the council's approach with regard to the imposition of conditions including mandatory conditions to be attached to the licence
  - Section 6 details other relevant council and government policies, strategies, responsibilities and guidance, including the relevant articles under the Human Rights Act 1998
  - Section 7 provides general guidance on dealing with crime and disorder and deals with licensing hours
  - Section 8 provides general guidance on ensuring public safety including safe capacities
  - Section 9 provides general guidance on the prevention of nuisance
  - Section 10 provides general guidance on the protection of children from harm.
- 17. The purpose of Southwark's statement of licensing policy is to make clear to applicants what considerations will be taken into account when determining applications and should act as a guide to the sub-committee when considering the applications. However, the sub-committee must always consider each application on its own merits and allow exceptions to the normal policy where these are justified by the circumstances of the application.

#### **Resource implications**

18. A fee of £315 has been paid by the applicant company in respect of this application, being the statutory fee payable for premises within non-domestic rateable value band C.

#### **Consultations**

19. Consultation has been carried out on this application in accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. A public notice was published in a local newspaper and a similar notice exhibited outside of the premises for a period of 28 consecutive days.

## **Community impact statement**

20. Each application is required by law to be considered upon its own individual merits with all relevant matters taken into account.

## SUPPLEMENTARY ADVICE FROM OTHER OFFICERS

## **Director of Legal Services**

- 21. The sub-committee is asked to determine the application for a premises licence under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 22. The principles which sub-committee members must apply are set out below.

## Principles for making the determination

- 23. The general principle is that applications for premises licence applications must be granted unless relevant representations are received. This is subject to the proviso that the applicant has complied with regulations in advertising and submitting the application.
- 24. Relevant representations are those which:
  - Are about the likely effect of the granting of the application on the promotion of the licensing objectives
  - Are made by other persons or responsible authority
  - Have not been withdrawn
  - Are not, in the opinion of the relevant licensing authority, frivolous or vexatious.
- 25. If relevant representations are received then the sub-committee must have regard to them, in determining whether it is necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
  - To grant the licence subject to:
    - The conditions mentioned in section 18 (2)(a) modified to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives
    - Any condition which must under section 19, 20 or 21 be included in the licence
  - To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates
  - To refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor
  - To reject the application.

#### **Conditions**

- 26. The sub-committee's discretion is thus limited. It can only modify the conditions put forward by the applicant, or refuse the application, if it is necessary to do so. Conditions must be appropriate and proportionate for the promotion of one of the four licensing objectives, and not for any other reason. Conditions must also be within the control of the licensee, and should be worded in a way which is clear, certain, consistent and enforceable.
- 27. The four licensing objectives are:
  - The prevention of crime and disorder
  - Public safety
  - The prevention of nuisance

- The protection of children from harm.
- 28. Members should note that each objective is of equal importance. There are no other licensing objectives, and the four objectives are paramount considerations at all times.
- 29. Conditions will not be necessary if they duplicate a statutory position. Conditions relating to night café and take away aspect of the license must relate to the night time operation of the premises and must not be used to impose conditions which could not be imposed on day time operators.
- 30. Members are also referred to the DCMS guidance on conditions, specifically section 10. and Annex D.

#### Reasons

31. If the sub-committee determines that it is necessary to modify the conditions, or to refuse the application for a premises licence application, it must give reasons for its decision.

## **Hearing procedures**

- 32. Subject to the licensing hearing regulations, the licensing committee may determine its own procedures. Key elements of the regulations are that:
  - The hearing shall take the form of a discussion led by the authority. Cross examination shall not be permitted unless the authority considered that it is required for it to consider the representations.
  - Members of the authority are free to ask any question of any party or other person appearing at the hearing.
  - The committee must allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights to:
    - Address the authority
    - o If given permission by the committee, question any other party.
    - o In response to a point which the authority has given notice it will require clarification, give further information in support of their application.
  - The committee shall disregard any information given by a party which is not relevant to the particular application before the committee and the licensing objectives.
  - The hearing shall be in public, although the committee may exclude the public from all or part of a hearing where it considers that the public interest in doing so outweighs the public interest in the hearing, or that part of the hearing, taking place in private.
  - In considering any representations or notice made by a party the authority may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice (as applicable) either before the hearing or, with the consent of all the other parties, at the hearing.

33. This matter relates to the determination of an application for a premises licence under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regulation 26(1) (a) requires the subcommittee to make its determination at the conclusion of the hearing.

#### Council's multiple roles and the role of the licensing sub-committee

- 34. Sub-committee members will note that, in relation to this application, the council has multiple roles. Council officers from various departments have been asked to consider the application from the perspective of the council as authority responsible respectively for environmental health, trading standards, health and safety and as the planning authority.
- 35. Members should note that the licensing sub-committee is meeting on this occasion solely to perform the role of licensing authority. The sub-committee sits in quasi-judicial capacity, and must act impartially. It must offer a fair and unbiased hearing of the application. In this case, members should disregard the council's broader policy objectives and role as statutory authority in other contexts. Members must direct themselves to making a determination solely based upon the licensing law, guidance and the council's statement of licensing policy.
- 36. As a quasi-judicial body the licensing sub-committee is required to consider the application on its merits. The sub-committee must take into account only relevant factors, and ignore irrelevant factors. The decision must be based on evidence, that is to say material, which tends logically to show the existence or non-existence of relevant facts, or the likelihood or unlikelihood of the occurrence of some future event, the occurrence of which would be relevant. The licensing sub-committee must give fair consideration to the contentions of all persons entitled to make representations to them.
- 37. The licensing sub-committee is entitled to consider events outside of the premises if they are relevant, i.e. are properly attributable to the premises being open. The proprietors do not have to be personally responsible for the incidents for the same to be relevant. However, if such events are not properly attributable to the premises being open, then the evidence is not relevant and should be excluded. Guidance is that the licensing authority will primarily focus on the direct impact of the activities taking place at the licensed premises on members of the public, living, working or engaged in normal activity in the area concerned.
- 38. Members will be aware of the council's code of conduct which requires them to declare personal and prejudicial interests. The code applies to members when considering licensing applications. In addition, as a quasi-judicial body, members are required to avoid both actual bias, and the appearance of bias.
- 39. The sub-committee can only consider matters within the application that have been raised through representations from other persons and responsible authorities. Other persons must live in the vicinity of the premises. This will be decided on a case to case basis.
- 40. Under the Human Rights Act 1998 the sub-committee needs to consider the balance between the rights of the applicant and those making representations to the application when making their decision. The sub-committee has a duty under section 17 Crime and Disorder Act 1998 when making its decision to do all it can to prevent crime and disorder in the borough.

41. Other persons, responsible authorities and the applicant have the right to appeal the decision of the sub-committee to the magistrates' court within a period of 21 days beginning with the day on which the applicant was notified by the licensing authority of the decision to be appealed against.

#### Guidance

42. Members are required to have regard to the DCMS guidance in carrying out the functions of licensing authority. However, guidance does not cover every possible situation, so long as the guidance has been properly and carefully understood, members may depart from it if they have reason to do so. Full reasons must be given if this is the case.

The window of our bedroom faces directly onto Bermondsey Street and there is a considerable amount of noise at week-ends from existing restaurants and bars close by as people leave the restaurant or go outside to smoke on the pavement. 

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

1. That the licensing sub-committee considers an application made by Village Venues Ltd for a premises licence to be granted under the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of the premises known as Kaspa's 321- 323 Walworth Road, London SE17 2TG.

#### 2. Notes:

- a) This application forms a new application for a premises licence, submitted under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003. The application is subject to representations from a responsible authority and 11 other persons and is therefore referred to the sub-committee for determination.
- b) Paragraphs 8 to 10 of this report provide a summary of the application under consideration by the sub-committee. A copy of the full application is attached as Appendix A.
- c) Paragraphs 11 to 17 of this report deals with the representations received to the premises licence application. Copies of the relevant representations are attached as Appendices B and C.
- d) A copy of the council's approved procedure for hearings of the sub-committee in relation to an application made under the Licensing Act 2003, along with a copy of the hearing regulations, has been circulated to all parties to the meeting.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

## The Licensing Act 2003

- 3. The Licensing Act 2003 received royal assent on 10 July 2003. The Act provides a licensing regime for:
  - The sale of and supply of alcohol
  - The provision of regulated entertainment
  - The provision of late night refreshment.
- 4. Within Southwark, the licensing responsibility is wholly administered by this council.

- 5. The Act requires the licensing authority to carry out its functions under the Act with a view to promoting the four stated licensing objectives. These are:
  - The prevention of crime and disorder
  - The promotion of public safety
  - The prevention of nuisance
  - The protection of children from harm.
- 6. In carrying out its licensing functions, a licensing authority must also have regard to:
  - The Act itself
  - The guidance to the act issued under Section 182 of the Act
  - Secondary regulations issued under the Act
  - The licensing authority's own statement of licensing policy
  - The application, including the operating schedule submitted as part of the application
  - Relevant representations.
- 7. The premises licence application process involves the provision of all relevant information required under the Act to the licensing authority with copies provided by the applicant to the relevant responsible bodies under the Act. The application must also be advertised at the premises and in the local press. The responsible authorities and other interested parties within the local community may make representations on any part of the application where relevant to the four licensing objectives.

#### **KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION**

### The premises licence application

8. On 28 February 2014 Village Venues Ltd applied to this council for the grant of a new premises licence in respect of the premises known as Kaspa's 321-323 Walworth Road, London SE17 2TG.

The application is summarised as follows:

- Late night refreshment (on and off the premises)
  Monday to Sunday from 23.00 to 04.00
- Opening hours Monday to Sunday from 07.00 to 04.00.
- 9. The premises licence application form provides the applicant operating schedule. Parts I, K, L, and M set out the proposed operating hours and operating controls in full, with reference to the four licensing objectives as stated in the Licensing Act 2003. Should a premises licence be issued in respect of the application the information provided in part M of the operating schedule will form the basis of conditions that will be attached to the licence.
- 10. A copy of the application is attached to this report as Appendix A.

#### Representations from responsible authorities

11. A representation has been received from the Metropolitan Police Service.

- 12. The representation received from the Metropolitan Police Service is concerned with crime and disorder and asked for two conditions to be added with regards to CCTV. being installed at the premises.
- 13. The applicant agreed to add the two conditions to the operating schedule and as result the police have withdrawn their representation.
- 14. A copy of the police representation and withdrawal statement is attached as Appendix B.

# Representations from other persons

- 15. 11 representations have been received from other persons which includes a local councillor.
- 16. The representations from other persons are concerned that the late operation of the premises till 04.00 will have and adverse impact on crime and disorder, public nuisance, and public safety, and ask for the premises to close earlier.
- 17. Copies of the representations from other persons are attached as Appendix C

#### Conciliation

18. At the time of writing this report conciliation talks are taking place. The applicant has agreed to amend the application and remove late night refreshment from Sunday through to Wednesday. The application now requires late night refreshment for Thursday, Friday and Saturday from 23.00 until 00.00. The other persons that submitted the representations shall be informed of this and invited to withdraw their representations and the licensing sub-committee shall be updated with any further changes at the hearing on 25 April 1014.

#### The local area

19. A map of the area is attached to this report as Appendix D. The premises is identified by a triangle at the centre of the map. For purposes of scale-only the circle on the map has a 100-metre radius. The following licensed premises terminal hours are also shown on the map.

# Southwark council statement of licensing policy

- 20. Council assembly approved Southwark's statement of licensing policy 2011-14 on 12 October 2011. Sections of the statement that are considered to be of particular relevance to this application are:
  - Section 3 which sets out the purpose and scope of the policy and reinforces the four licensing objectives

- Section 5 which sets out the council's approach with regard to the imposition of conditions including mandatory conditions to be attached to the licence
- Section 6 details other relevant council and government policies, strategies, responsibilities and guidance, including the relevant articles under the Human Rights Act 1998
- Section 7 provides general guidance on dealing with crime and disorder and deals with licensing hours
- Section 8 provides general guidance on ensuring public safety including safe capacities
- Section 9 provides general guidance on the prevention of nuisance
- Section 10 provides general guidance on the protection of children from harm.
- 21. The purpose of Southwark's statement of licensing policy is to make clear to applicants what considerations will be taken into account when determining applications and should act as a guide to the sub-committee when considering the applications. However, the sub-committee must always consider each application on its own merits and allow exceptions to the normal policy where these are justified by the circumstances of the application.

#### **Resource implications**

22. A fee of £315 has been paid by the applicant company in respect of this application being the statutory fee payable for premises within non-domestic rateable value band C.

#### **Consultations**

23. Consultation has been carried out on this application in accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. A public notice was published in a local newspaper and a similar notices exhibited outside of the premises for a period of 28 consecutive days.

#### **Community impact statement**

24. Each application is required by law to be considered upon its own individual merits with all relevant matters taken into account.

# SUPPLEMENTARY ADVICE FROM OTHER OFFICERS

# **Director of Legal Services**

- 25. The sub-committee is asked to determine the application for a premises licence under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 26. The principles which sub-committee members must apply are set out below.

#### Principles for making the determination

- 27. The general principle is that applications for premises licence applications must be granted unless relevant representations are received. This is subject to the proviso that the applicant has complied with regulations in advertising and submitting the application.
- 28. Relevant representations are those which:
  - Are about the likely effect of the granting of the application on the promotion of the licensing objectives
  - Are made by an interested party or responsible authority
  - Have not been withdrawn
  - Are not, in the opinion of the relevant licensing authority, frivolous or vexatious.
- 29. If relevant representations are received then the sub-committee must have regard to them, in determining whether it is necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
  - to grant the licence subject to:
    - The conditions mentioned in section 18 (2)(a) modified to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives
    - Any condition which must under section 19, 20 or 21 be included in the licence
  - to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates
  - to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor
  - to reject the application.

#### **Conditions**

- 30. The sub-committee's discretion is thus limited. It can only modify the conditions put forward by the applicant, or refuse the application, if it is necessary to do so. Conditions must be necessary and proportionate for the promotion of one of the four licensing objectives, and not for any other reason. Conditions must also be within the control of the licensee, and should be worded in a way which is clear, certain, consistent and enforceable.
- 31. The four licensing objectives are:
  - The prevention of crime and disorder
  - Public safety
  - The prevention of nuisance
  - The protection of children from harm.
- 32. Members should note that each objective is of equal importance. There are no other licensing objectives, and the four objectives are paramount considerations at all times.
- 33. Conditions will not be necessary if they duplicate a statutory position. Conditions relating to night café and take away aspect of the license must relate to the night

- time operation of the premises and must not be used to impose conditions which could not be imposed on day time operators.
- 34. Members are also referred to the DCMS guidance on conditions, specifically section 10, and Annex D.

#### Reasons

35. If the sub-committee determines that it is necessary to modify the conditions, or to refuse the application for a premises licence application, it must give reasons for its decision.

# **Hearing procedures**

- 36. Subject to the licensing hearing regulations, the licensing committee may determine its own procedures. Key elements of the regulations are that:
  - The hearing shall take the form of a discussion led by the authority. Cross examination shall not be permitted unless the authority considered that it is required for it to consider the representations.
  - Members of the authority are free to ask any question of any party or other person appearing at the hearing.
  - The committee must allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights to:
    - Address the authority
    - o If given permission by the committee, question any other party.
    - o In response to a point which the authority has given notice it will require clarification, give further information in support of their application.
  - The committee shall disregard any information given by a party which is not relevant to the particular application before the committee and the licensing objectives.
  - The hearing shall be in public, although the committee may exclude the public from all or part of a hearing where it considers that the public interest in doing so outweighs the public interest in the hearing, or that part of the hearing, taking place in private.
  - In considering any representations or notice made by a party the authority may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice (as applicable) either before the hearing or, with the consent of all the other parties, at the hearing.
- 37. This matter relates to the determination of an application for a premises licence under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regulation 26(1) (a) requires the subcommittee to make its determination at the conclusion of the hearing.

# Council's multiple roles and the role of the licensing sub-committee

38. Sub-committee members will note that, in relation to this application, the council has multiple roles. Council officers from various departments have been asked to

- consider the application from the perspective of the council as authority responsible respectively for environmental health, trading standards, health and safety and as the planning authority.
- 39. Members should note that the licensing sub-committee is meeting on this occasion solely to perform the role of licensing authority. The sub-committee sits in quasi-judicial capacity, and must act impartially. It must offer a fair and unbiased hearing of the application. In this case, members should disregard the council's broader policy objectives and role as statutory authority in other contexts. Members must direct themselves to making a determination solely based upon the licensing law, guidance and the council's statement of licensing policy.
- 40. As a quasi-judicial body the licensing sub-committee is required to consider the application on its merits. The sub-committee must take into account only relevant factors, and ignore irrelevant factors. The decision must be based on evidence, that is to say material, which tends logically to show the existence or non-existence of relevant facts, or the likelihood or unlikelihood of the occurrence of some future event, the occurrence of which would be relevant. The licensing sub-committee must give fair consideration to the contentions of all persons entitled to make representations to them.
- 41. The licensing sub-committee is entitled to consider events outside of the premises if they are relevant, i.e. are properly attributable to the premises being open. The proprietors do not have to be personally responsible for the incidents for the same to be relevant. However, if such events are not properly attributable to the premises being open, then the evidence is not relevant and should be excluded. Guidance is that the licensing authority will primarily focus on the direct impact of the activities taking place at the licensed premises on members of the public, living, working or engaged in normal activity in the area concerned.
- 42. Members will be aware of the council's code of conduct which requires them to declare personal and prejudicial interests. The code applies to members when considering licensing applications. In addition, as a quasi-judicial body, members are required to avoid both actual bias, and the appearance of bias.
- 43. The sub-committee can only consider matters within the application that have been raised through representations from other persons and responsible authorities. Interested parties must live in the vicinity of the premises. This will be decided on a case to case basis.
- 44. Under the Human Rights Act 1998. the sub-committee needs to consider the balance between the rights of the applicant and those making representations to the application when making their decision. The sub-committee has a duty under section 17 Crime and Disorder Act 1998 when making its decision to do all it can to prevent crime and disorder in the borough.
- 45. Other persons, responsible authorities and the applicant have the right to appeal the decision of the sub-committee to the magistrates' court within a period of 21 days beginning with the day on which the applicant was notified by the licensing authority of the decision to be appealed against.

#### Guidance

46. Members are required to have regard to the DCMS guidance in carrying out the functions of licensing authority. However, guidance does not cover every possible

situation, so long as the guidance has been properly and carefully understood, members may depart from it if they have reason to do so. Full reasons must be given if this is the case.

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



I would like to register my objection to the above Licence application under the prevention of nuisance category.

Whilst I welcome the introduction of a new enterprise to the area my support would be greater if reasonable opening hours, for example to 11pm and perhaps 10pm on Sundays were enforced.

I live in Sutherland Walk close to the junction with Walworth Road, the proposed ice cream parlour is directly opposite this junction. Parking is permitted on Sutherland Walk outside business hours and it is common for users of the premises on Walworth Road to park directly outside my house which in normal circumstances is not an issue.

This new cafe will bring additional traffic and parking onto Sutherland Walk as parking is restricted on Walworth Road; previous experience has shown that late night users of the premises on Walworth Road are generally high spirited and very noisy and tend to have their car stereos at high volumes.

Granting a licence to serve refreshments between 11pm and 4am, 7 days a week will mean serious disruption to our lives, with the noise and nuisance disrupting the sleep of everyone in the street.

# Licensed Premises - Licence Application 844200

I wish to object to the granting of a licence to serve refreshments at 321-323 Walworth Road SE17 2TG, between the hours of 11pm and 4am, 7 days a week.

Firstly, it appears that the established Planning use is "Minor retail, distribution, servicing", according to the Planning Consent for a new shopfront (Ref. 13/AP/2836). I have not been able to find an application for change of use to A3 Restaurants and cafés – (For the sale of food and drink for consumption on the premises - restaurants, snack bars and cafes), assuming such consent is needed.

I object to a licence on the grounds that the provision of late night refreshment will cause a nuisance, because Sutherland Walk/Square is the nearest parking to the unit (off the main road) and the proposed late opening will bring more traffic into the area at anti-social hours causing noise, when most people will be hoping to have a good night's sleep. The offering of Kaspas emphasises ice cream, which will be most popular in the summer, when residents are most likely to leave windows open.

We have suffered for many years from disturbances, shouting, fights, prolonged loud conversations, noise from cars leaving in the early hours of the morning and urination in the street and on private property. We always believed but never proved that this anti-social behaviour was mainly from customers of the Temple Bar PH (284-286 Walworth Road), which had late opening hours. The closure of this pub has coincided with a reduction but not elimination of the problem.

It is acknowledged that this licence application does not include sale of alcohol but I think the granting of consent to late night refreshments will still result in noise in the early hours of the morning and it will be 'the thin end of the wedge'. It would be much more difficult to stop the granting of a liquor licence with late hours, if a pattern of late opening for refreshments is established. I believe that the operator of Kaspa's says there is no intention to sell alcohol but this position may change or another operator may take over in future.

Although I think there are more than enough restaurants, snack bars and cafes in the area, I don't want to take away someone's living. I am sure an ice cream parlour will be appreciated by many people, especially children and teenagers but they certainly should not be encouraged to be out until 4am in the morning.

There seems to be a concentration of late-opening restaurants, snack bars, cafes and a club, as well as all night gambling in this part of Walworth. The area is likely to be a magnet, not only for honest, late workers but for all types of anti-social people who indulge in criminal activities late at night. Adding a late opening ice cream bar will just attract another, different group, which is likely to wake us all up.

Dear Licensing,

I would like to object to the application on the following grounds:

- 1. The proposed opening hours would encourage crime and disorder In the area. It would be impossible to prevent customers spilling out onto the street, especially in the summer, and this could cause disturbances. There is an alleyway beside it and I can see that this would be a perfect place for people to gather and a potential venue for drug dealing. The hours would also encourage people who had been drinking in the area to go there after the pubs have closed and the clientele for the hours after 11pm will potentially be inebriated. This, coupled with potential drug dealing, will cause fights. As the venue will not have an alcohol license they will under no obligation to provide Security to deal with this. It is also entirely possible that people will bring alcohol with them and consume it in the street/alleyway and there will be no way, legal or otherwise, of preventing this.
- 2. If it then becomes a venue for drug dealing, there will then be an issue with public safety. It will require constant policing at huge expense. The alleyway will also become a public toilet and a health hazard. On a personal note, I work evenings and come home late, getting off the bus at the East Street stop. Currently, I do not feel threatened by my walk home, but in order to get to the traffic lights to cross the road I have to walk past the premises and the alleyway. However, I will not feel comfortable about doing this if I am going to walk past undesirable events (such as drug dealing) and people blocking the pavement and will be forced to cross the road where there are no traffic lights and this is dangerous. This will constitute a violation of personal safety for those living in Sutherland Walk/ Square and those needing to use the traffic lights. Also, as many of the buses in the Walworth Road are "24 Hour" there could also be issues with inebriated people traveling there by bus causing a nuisance on the bus.

3. The resulting debris from drug dealing and the refuse from the venue which will undoubtedly end up on the street, will also constitute a nuisance and health hazard. There are already problems with urban foxes and rubbish and this will exacerbate them.

My further objection is that if a license for opening is granted past midnight, it will only be a matter of time before they apply for an alcohol license to cover that opening time as well. They will say that having that license will deal with the issue of people consuming alcohol outside and force them to employ Security. Granting them the initial license will play straight into their hands for this.

Finally, I can see no reason for an ice cream parlour to be open past midnight. Who is going to want to eat ice cream or other sweet delights at that hour? There must be another agenda and the Council should investigate extremely thoroughly. The endgame is probably a full-blown nightclub and this is not what we need in this area.

As a resident of Sutherland Square (full address below) I am writing in a personal capacity to support the following objection by the Residents Association. A requirement for Kaspa's to close at 11.00 pm is perfectly reasonable, and I personally would not object if this were extended to midnight on Fridays and Saturdays, for a train period: anything beyond that involves an unacceptable risk of nuisance and antisocial behaviour at a time when residents of this area are working hard to promote it as a desirable and increasingly safe area to live and work:

Sutherland Residents Association represents the households in Sutherland Square and Sutherland Walk in West Walworth. We are a fully constituted residents group and represent some 120 households. We are objecting to the application by Kaspa's (844200) for a licence to serve refreshments between 11pm and 4am the next morning 7 days a week. Overall their proposed opening hours are from 7am every day through to 4am.

As Sutherland Walk/Square offers the nearest parking to the retail unit (away from the main Walworth Rd on which parking is not allowed/possible), the proposed late opening will bring more traffic into a residential area at anti-social hours thus causing noise and nuisance during and potentially throughout the night.


Residents are supportive of the local economy and keen to encourage the success of local businesses. We have, however, experienced considerable problems with anti-social behaviour from late-night openings of businesses on the Walworth Rd in particular from customers arriving and departing from the area late at night by car.

I understand that Kaspa's, a new shop providing food on Walworth Road, is requesting a licence to be able to continue to sell food and refreshments from 23.00 to 04.00 every day of the week including Saturdays and Sundays.

I wish to object to this licence for the following reasons:

Parking. The shop is immediately opposite Sutherland Walk which will be the parking place of choice for the late night visitors to Kaspa. Sutherland Walk is a quiet residential road where the bulk of residents are in bed and asleep by midnight at the latest. Experience from previous stores in the Walworth Road that were permitted to stay open after 23.00 was that people moving to and from their cars and starting them created sufficient noise to wake people in the Walk and keep them awake. Please, not again.

Kaspa group. There are two other Kaspa shops in London, Croydon and Purley, that are only open during the day and up until 23.00. Neither of these stores opens after 23.00 and they must be sufficiently profitable on this basis to encourage the opening of a third shop in Walworth Road. This objection is based on the licening objectives:

I have recieved objections from residents of Sutherland Walk and from the Fielding st residents association both of which represent areas close to the shop. These objections and my own are based on the opening hours (11am-4am) and the fact that this will be 7 days per week.

The application requests worryingly late opening hours considering current anti-social behaviour on walworth road - specifically in establishments which have late opening hours. These hours will result in noise from customers and cars which are parked or will use sutherland street, McLeod Street and Fielding street - all residential areas - at very early hours of the morning.

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
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
