#### RECOMMENDATION

1. That the licensing sub-committee considers an application made by Roofoods Limited t/a Deliveroo applied for a premises licence to be granted under the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of the premises known as Camberwell CBR Roobox, Unit 1, Valmar Trading Estate, Valmar Road, London SE5 9NW.

#### 2. Notes:

- a) This application forms a new application for a premises licence, submitted under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003. The application is subject to a representation from a responsible authority and is therefore referred to the subcommittee for determination.
- b) Paragraphs 8 to 10 of this report provide a summary of the application under consideration by the sub-committee. A copy of the full application is attached as Appendix A.
- c) Paragraphs 11 to 13 of this report deals with the representation submitted in respect of the application. A copy of the representation submitted by environmental protection is attached to this report in Appendix B. A map showing the location of the premises is attached to this report as Appendix C.
- d) A copy of the council's approved procedure for hearings of the sub-committee in relation to an application made under the Licensing Act 2003, along with a copy of the hearing regulations, has been circulated to all parties to the meeting.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

#### The Licensing Act 2003

- 3. The Licensing Act 2003 provides a licensing regime for:
  - The sale of and supply of alcohol
  - The provision of regulated entertainment
  - The provision of late night refreshment.
- 4. Within Southwark, the licensing responsibility is wholly administered by this council.

- 5. The Act requires the licensing authority to carry out its functions under the Act with a view to promoting the four stated licensing objectives. These are:
  - The prevention of crime and disorder
  - The promotion of public safety
  - The prevention of nuisance
  - The protection of children from harm.
- 6. In carrying out its licensing functions, a licensing authority must also have regard to
  - The Act itself
  - The guidance to the act issued under Section 182 of the Act
  - Secondary regulations issued under the Act
  - The licensing authority's own statement of licensing policy
  - The application, including the operating schedule submitted as part of the application
  - Relevant representations.
- 7. The premises licence application process involves the provision of all relevant information required under the Act to the licensing authority with copies provided by the applicant to the relevant responsible bodies under the Act. The application must also be advertised at the premises and in the local press. The responsible authorities and other persons within the local community may make representations on any part of the application where relevant to the four licensing objectives.

#### **KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION**

#### The premises licence application

- 8. On 25 April 2017 Roofoods Limited t/a Deliveroo applied to this council for the grant of a premises licence in respect of Camberwell CBR Roobox Unit 1, Valmar Trading Estate, Valmar Road, London, SE5 9NW. The premises are described in the application as being:
  - '... '[a] premises consisting of 7 semi permanent, delivery only kitchen installations as well as a communal rider welfare unit/site manager's office and toilet block. The premises is not open to the public at any time and a dedicated site manager is on duty during trading hours. The premises is within a fenced area within the car park with a locked access gate and full CCTV coverage. The premises are secured within an industrial estate with an outer security coded gate and internal secure gate barriers and enveloped on one side by high fencing and residential blocks beyond basketball courts on one side and secure offices on the other.'
- 9. The application and is summarised as follows:
  - The supply by retail of alcohol (off sales only)
     Monday to Sunday
     11:00 to 23:00
  - Opening hours

Monday to Sunday 11:00 to 23:00

• The proposed designated premises supervisor of the premises is Harry Tyndall who has been granted a personal licence by London Borough of Camden.

10. The premises licence application form provides the applicant's operating schedule. Parts A, B, C, E, F, G, H, I, J, K, L, and M of the operating schedule set out the proposed licensable activities, operating hours and operating control measures in full, with reference to the four licensing objectives as stated in the Licensing Act 2003. Should a premises licence be issued in respect of the application the information provided in part M of the operating schedule will form the basis of conditions that will be attached to any licence granted subsequent to the application. A copy of the application is attached to this report in Appendix A.

#### Representations from responsible authorities

11. A representation has been submitted by this council's environmental protection authority. The representation has been made under the licensing objective of the prevention of public nuisance due to complaints that have been received in relation to excess noise created by the motorbike used to make deliveries and their subsequent impact on local residents residing in the immediate vicinity. A copy of the representation is attached to this report in Appendix B.

#### Representations from other persons

- 12. No other representations have been received.
- 13. The Planning Department have not made representation, but have written stating: "Whilst no objection is made to the licencing application, the planning department does not consider that the lawful use of the premises allows for the sale of alcohol to individual customers." A copy of this is attached to Appendix B.

#### Conciliation

14. The applicant was sent copies of the representation that was submitted. At the time that this report went to print, the applicant and the objector had not formally mediated.

#### **Premises history**

- 15. This is a brand new premises, with no history of having been licensed previously.
- 16. The licensing department has received a complaint since the premises came into operation. The complaint came to the department via a ward councillor. The complaint was concerned with the noise produced by motorbikes conducting deliveries from the premises. The complainant was advised as to the current application. Licensing officers conducted late night observations of the premises on 5 May 2017. It was noted that there were regular motorbikes entering and leaving the Valmar Trading Estate. There were motorbikes entering and leaving the premises after 23:00h, but it was not evident if the bikes were conducting deliveries. The applicant's agent has given the licensing authority assurances that no deliveries have been made after 23:00.
- 17. The content of the initial complaint has formed the basis of the representation from the council's environmental protection authority and features in Appendix B.

#### **Deregulation of entertainment**

- 18. It is noted that the applicant has applied for regulated entertainment in the form of recorded music, which the application describes as being 'background'. On 6 April 2015 entertainment became deregulated and as a result:
  - Live unamplified music is deregulated between 08:00 and 23:00 on any premises.
  - Live amplified music is deregulated between 08:00 and 23.00 at on-licensed premises provided the audience does not exceed 500 people. However, live music can become licensable in on-licensed premises if the licensing authority removes the effect of the deregulation following a licence review ('licence review mechanism').

#### Map

- 19. A map showing the location of the premises is attached to this report as Appendix C. The following licensed premises are in the immediate vicinity of the premises application:
  - Co-Operative Food 28-32 Denmark Hill, SE5 8RZ, licenced for:
    - The sale of alcohol (off sales) Monday to Sunday from 07:00 to 23:00
  - Supersave Express 350 Camberwell New Road, SE5 0RW, licensed for:
    - The sale of alcohol (off sales) Monday to Sunday from 08:00 to 01:00 (the following day)
  - Camberwell Grill Chicken 336 Camberwell Bew Road, licensed for:
    - The provision of late night refreshment (indoors and outdoors) Monday to Friday from 23:00 to 02:00 (the following day) and Saturday and Sunday from 23:00 to 03:00 (the following day)
  - Pesh Flowers 31 Denmark Hill, SE5 8RS, licenced for:
    - The sale by retail of alcohol (off sales) Monday to Saturday from 08:00 to 23:00 and Sunday from 10:00 to 22:30
  - Joiners Arms 35 Denmark Hill, SE5 8RS, licensed for:
    - The sale by retail of alcohol (on and off sales) Monday to Thursday from 10:00 to 00:00 (midnight), Friday and Saturday from 10:00 to 01:00 (the following day) and Sunday from 12:00 to 00:00 (midnight)
    - The provision of regulated entertainment in the form of recorded music (indoors) Monday to Thursday from 10:00 to 00:00 (midnight), Friday and Saturday from 10:00 to 01:00 (the following day) and Sunday from 12:00 to 00:00 (midnight)
    - The provision of regulated entertainment in the form of live music (indoors) Friday and Saturday from 23:00 to 01:00 (the following day)

- Morrisons Butterfly Walk, SE5 8RW, licensed for:
  - The sale by retail of alcohol (off sales only) Monday to Sunday from 06:00 to 23:00

#### Southwark council statement of licensing policy

- 20. Council assembly approved Southwark's statement of licensing policy 2016 to 20 on 25 November 2015. The policy came into effect on 1 January 2016. Sections of the statement that are considered to be of particular relevance to the sub-committee's consideration are:
  - Section 3 Purpose and scope of the policy. This reinforces the four licensing objectives and the fundamental principles upon which this authority relies in determining licence applications.
  - Section 5 Determining applications for premises licences and club premises certificates. This explains how the policy works and considers issues such as location; high standards of management; and the principles behind condition setting.
  - Section 6 Local cumulative impact policies. This sets out this authority's approach to cumulative impact and defines the boundaries of the current special policy areas and the classifications of premises to which they apply. To be read in conjunction with Appendix B to the policy.
  - Section 7 Hours of operation. This provides a guide to the hours of licensed operation that this authority might consider appropriate by type of premises and (planning) area classification.
  - Section 8 The prevention of crime and disorder. This provides general guidance on the promotion of the first licensing objective.
  - Section 9 Public safety. This provides general guidance on the promotion of the second licensing objective.
  - Section 10 The prevention of nuisance. This provides general guidance on the promotion of the third licensing objective.
  - Section 11 The protection of children from harm. This provides general guidance on the promotion of the fourth licensing objective.
- 21. The purpose of Southwark's statement of licensing policy is to make clear to applicants what considerations will be taken into account when determining applications and should act as a guide to the sub-committee when considering the applications. However, the sub-committee must always consider each application on its own merits and allow exceptions to the normal policy where these are justified by the circumstances of the application.
- 22. Within Southwark's statement of licensing policy, the premises are identified as being inside of the Camberwell cumulative impact zone. Relevant closing times recommended in the statement of licensing policy for licensed premises in residential areas are as follows:

Restaurants, cafés and off licences: Monday to Sunday 23:00.

#### **Resource implications**

23. A fee of £315.00 has been paid by the applicant company in respect of this application being the statutory fee payable for premises within non-domestic rateable value bands D/E.

#### Consultation

24. Consultation has been carried out on this application in accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. A public notice was published in a local newspaper and similar notices were exhibited outside of the premises for a period of 28 consecutive days.

#### **Community impact statement**

25. Each application is required by law to be considered upon its own individual merits with all relevant matters taken into account.

#### SUPPLEMENTARY ADVICE FROM OTHER OFFICERS

#### **Director of Law and Democracy**

- 26. The sub-committee is asked to determine the application for a premises licence under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 27. The principles which sub-committee members must apply are set out below.

#### Principles for making the determination

- 28. The general principle is that applications for premises licence applications must be granted unless relevant representations are received. This is subject to the proviso that the applicant has complied with regulations in advertising and submitting the application.
- 29. Relevant representations are those which:
  - Are about the likely effect of the granting of the application on the promotion of the licensing objectives
  - Are made by an interested party or responsible authority
  - Have not been withdrawn
  - Are not, in the opinion of the relevant licensing authority, frivolous or vexatious.
- 30. If relevant representations are received then the sub-committee must have regard to them, in determining whether it is necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives to:
  - To grant the licence subject to:
    - The conditions mentioned in section 18 (2)(a) modified to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives

- Any condition which must under section 19, 20 or 21 be included in the licence
- To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates
- To refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor
- To reject the application.

#### **Conditions**

- 31. The sub-committee's discretion is thus limited. It can only modify the conditions put forward by the applicant, or refuse the application, if it is necessary to do so. Conditions must be necessary and proportionate for the promotion of one of the four licensing objectives, and not for any other reason. Conditions must also be within the control of the licensee, and should be worded in a way which is clear, certain, consistent and enforceable.
- 32. The four licensing objectives are:
  - The prevention of crime and disorder
  - Public safety
  - The prevention of nuisance
  - The protection of children from harm.
- 33. Members should note that each objective is of equal importance. There are no other licensing objectives, and the four objectives are paramount considerations at all times.
- 34. Conditions will not be necessary if they duplicate a statutory position. Conditions relating to night café and take away aspect of the license must relate to the night time operation of the premises and must not be used to impose conditions which could not be imposed on day time operators.
- 35. Members are also referred to the Home Office revised guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 on conditions, specifically section 10.

#### Reasons

36. If the sub-committee determines that it is necessary to modify the conditions, or to refuse the application for a premises licence application, it must give reasons for its decision.

#### **Hearing procedures**

- 37. Subject to the licensing hearing regulations, the licensing committee may determine its own procedures. Key elements of the regulations are that:
  - The hearing shall take the form of a discussion led by the authority. Cross examination shall not be permitted unless the authority considered that it is required for it to consider the representations.
  - Members of the authority are free to ask any question of any party or other

person appearing at the hearing.

- The committee must allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights to:
  - Address the authority
  - o If given permission by the committee, question any other party.
  - o In response to a point which the authority has given notice it will require clarification, give further information in support of their application.
- The committee shall disregard any information given by a party which is not relevant to the particular application before the committee and the licensing objectives.
- The hearing shall be in public, although the committee may exclude the public from all or part of a hearing where it considers that the public interest in doing so outweighs the public interest in the hearing, or that part of the hearing, taking place in private.
- In considering any representations or notice made by a party the authority may
  take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in
  support of their application, representations or notice (as applicable) either
  before the hearing or, with the consent of all the other parties, at the hearing.
- 38. This matter relates to the determination of an application for a premises licence under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regulation 26(1) (a) requires the subcommittee to make its determination at the conclusion of the hearing.

#### Council's multiple roles and the role of the licensing sub-committee

- 39. Sub-committee members will note that, in relation to this application, the council has multiple roles. Council officers from various departments have been asked to consider the application from the perspective of the council as authority responsible respectively for environmental health, trading standards, health and safety and as the planning authority.
- 40. Members should note that the licensing sub-committee is meeting on this occasion solely to perform the role of licensing authority. The sub-committee sits in quasi-judicial capacity, and must act impartially. It must offer a fair and unbiased hearing of the application. In this case, members should disregard the council's broader policy objectives and role as statutory authority in other contexts. Members must direct themselves to making a determination solely based upon the licensing law, guidance and the council's statement of licensing policy.
- 41. As a quasi-judicial body the licensing sub-committee is required to consider the application on its merits. The sub-committee must take into account only relevant factors, and ignore irrelevant factors. The decision must be based on evidence, that is to say material, which tends logically to show the existence or non-existence of relevant facts, or the likelihood or unlikelihood of the occurrence of some future event, the occurrence of which would be relevant. The licensing sub-committee must give fair consideration to the contentions of all persons entitled to make representations to them.

- 42. The licensing sub-committee is entitled to consider events outside of the premises if they are relevant, i.e. are properly attributable to the premises being open. The proprietors do not have to be personally responsible for the incidents for the same to be relevant. However, if such events are not properly attributable to the premises being open, then the evidence is not relevant and should be excluded. Guidance is that the licensing authority will primarily focus on the direct impact of the activities taking place at the licensed premises on members of the public, living, working or engaged in normal activity in the area concerned.
- 43. Members will be aware of the council's code of conduct which requires them to declare personal and prejudicial interests. The code applies to members when considering licensing applications. In addition, as a quasi-judicial body, members are required to avoid both actual bias, and the appearance of bias.

The sub-committee can only consider matters within the application that have been raised through representations from other persons and responsible authorities. Other persons must live in the vicinity of the premises. This will be decided on a case to case basis.

- 44. Under the Human Rights Act 1998, the sub-committee needs to consider the balance between the rights of the applicant and those making representations to the application when making their decision. The sub-committee has a duty under section 17 Crime and Disorder Act 1998 when making its decision to do all it can to prevent crime and disorder in the borough.
- 45. Other persons, responsible authorities and the applicant have the right to appeal the decision of the sub-committee to the magistrates' court within a period of 21 days beginning with the day on which the applicant was notified by the licensing authority of the decision to be appealed against.

#### Guidance

46. Members are required to have regard to the Home Office revised guidance in carrying out the functions of licensing authority. However, guidance does not cover every possible situation, so long as the guidance has been properly and carefully understood, members may depart from it if they have reason to do so. Full reasons must be given if this is the case.

#### **Strategic Director of Finance and Governance**

47. The head of community safety and enforcement has confirmed that the costs of this process are borne by the service.



This letter is on behalf of a number of residents on the East side of Valmar Road SE5 9NG, which backs onto the Valmar Trading estate. We are deeply concerned about the recent arrival on the estate of a number of pizza, warm-up, and other kitchens, housed in apparently temporary buildings and associated with the Deliveroo company. This has taken us very much by surprise as there was no prior notification regarding any application for planning permission. Previously, such notifications have always been served prior to any developments on the estate which might affect us.

For several weeks now, the new kitchens, have been operating from between approximately 5.30pm and midnight every evening, and from about midday at weekends. During these hours there is a constant stream of Deliveroo motorbikes driving at speed into and out of the estate. This considerable increase in the volume of traffic is highly disruptive throughout the street, and has various implications as described below.

<u>Safety</u>. The increased traffic potentially increases hazards in road safety. One resident has reported that recently she was nearly hit when a Deliveroo motor scooter mounted the corner of the curb when leaving the estate. We have also noticed in the last week that the Estate's pedestrian rather than vehicle gate is being left open for the riders to enter and exit. This means they are actually riding along one section of pavement, which is concealed by a wall, then crossing another section where they could very easily collide with pedestrians. A further consideration, is that the estate is directly opposite Crawford Primary School, and that there are sometimes children still around for After-School Clubs etc. by the time Delieveroo's activities begin.

#### Noise

The sound made by the motorbikes is relentless, impinging especially on those of us living near the gates to the trading estate. Some neighbours are, we understand, experiencing disturbed sleep as a consequence. If the noise continues, it will also make it impossible for any of us to enjoy our gardens, terraces or open windows during the summer evenings and weekend afternoons.

<u>Security</u>: The constant flow of traffic means that the electronic gates to the trading estate are now open at weekends and throughout every evening until midnight. Prior to the installation of these gates a few years ago, a significant number of our houses were burgled, being accessed through back gardens via the estate. We are all very concerned that this problem could now recur. Some residents have also been upset in recent weeks by Deliveroo riders loitering and sitting on walls in front of their homes

We would very much appreciate your giving this distressing and possibly dangerous situation your urgent attention. We feel that the location of the kitchens and associated traffic is quite inappropriate on a residential street such as this. We would ask that the kitchens be relocated, or a least the access arrangements changed. (The kitchens are somewhere near the back of the Denmark Hill Co-op where estate might be accessed via a commercial rather than residential area). Failing either of these solutions, the introduction of safety, speed and noise reducing measures would need to be thoroughly examined.

As previously mentioned, this letter is on behalf of a number of residents in addition to ourselves. 

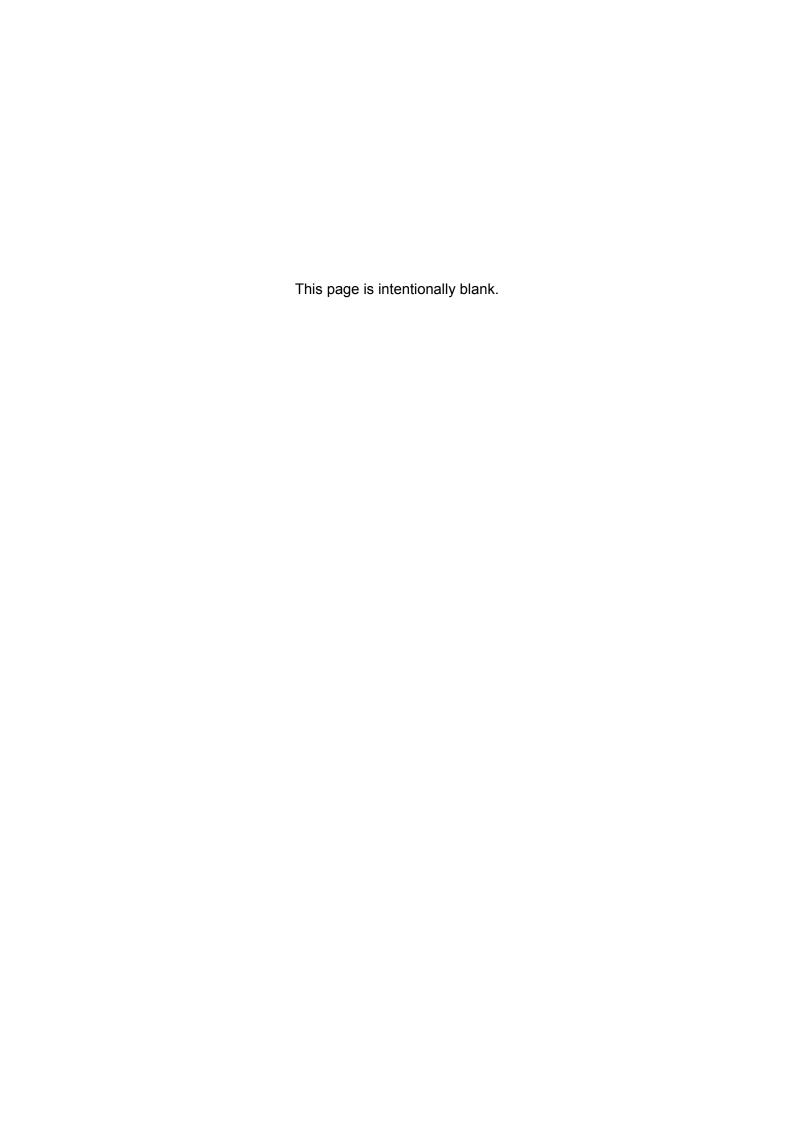
