RECOMMENDATION

1. That the sub-committee decide whether or not to issue counter notices in respect of three temporary event notices (TENs) 859128, 859129, 859126, served by Mr Simon Cotton, in regards to events to be held at three individual locations at 133 Copeland Road, London SE15 3SN.
2. Temporary Event Notice 859128 has been submitted for 133 Copeland Road, London SE15 3SN (Carpark), between 12:00hrs on 22 July 2017 and 02:00hrs on 23 July 2017.
3. Temporary Event Notice 859129 has been submitted for Bussey Building (D), Block A Roof Top Rear of D, 133 Copeland Road, London SE15 3SN between 12:00hrs and 23:00hrs on 21 July and on 22 July 2017.
4. Temporary Event Notice 859126 has been submitted for Copeland Gallery (9L), Unit 9L, Caravan Unit, 133 Copeland Road, London SE15 3SN on 21 July 2017 between 12:00hrs and 00:00hrs; on 22 July 2017 between 0:00hrs and 02:00hrs, and 12:00hrs and 00:00hrs; and on 23 July 2017 between 00:00hrs and 02:00hrs.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Licensing Act 2003

5. On 24 November 2005 the Licensing Act 2003 came into effect establishing a licensing regime for the following licensable activities:
 - a) The retail sale of alcohol
 - b) The supply of alcohol to club members or on behalf of a club
 - c) The provision of regulated entertainment
 - d) The provision of late night refreshments.
6. The Act established a process for the giving of “temporary event notices” (TENs).
7. Amendments to the Licensing Act 2003 were brought about by way of the Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011 as of 25 April 2012.

8. A premises user may serve a TEN, where it is proposed to use the premises concerned to provide one or more licensable activities for a period not exceeding 168 hours for less than 500 persons.
9. A person holding a personal license issued under the Act may serve up to 50 TENs in a calendar year. Non-personal licence holders may serve up to five TENs in the same period. No premises may be used for more than 12 TENs in a calendar year or for more than 21 days in a calendar year.
10. No premises may be used for temporary events that are less than 24 hours apart.
11. The police or environmental health authority may intervene to prevent such an event taking place or agree a modification of the proposed arrangements, and their intervention may in some cases result in the licensing authority imposing conditions on a TEN.
12. If the police or environmental health team believe that allowing the premises to be used in accordance with the TEN will undermine the licensing objectives, they must give the premises user and the licensing authority an objection notice. This must be given within three working days of the receipt of the TEN.
13. A TEN does not relieve the premises user from any requirements under planning law for appropriate planning permission where it is required.
14. The police or environmental health may contact the premises user to discuss their objections and attempt to come to an agreement which will allow the proposed licensable activities to proceed. The TEN can be modified. If there is no agreement, the licensing authority must hold a hearing to consider the notice.
15. If the licensing authority receives an objection notice from the police or environmental health that is not withdrawn, it must (in the case of a standard TEN only) hold a hearing to consider the objection (unless all parties agree that this is unnecessary). The licensing committee may decide to allow the licensable activities to go ahead as stated in the notice. If the notice is in connection with licensable activities at licensed premises, the licensing authority may also impose one or more of the existing licence conditions on the TEN if it considers that this is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. If the authority decides to impose conditions, it must give notice to the premises user which includes a statement of conditions, and provide a copy to each relevant party. Alternatively, it can decide that the event would undermine the licensing objectives and give a counter notice. This prohibits the event from taking place.

KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION

The temporary event notices

16. On 9 June 2017 three separate TENs were served by Mr Simon Cotton in respect of events intended to be held at various sites located at Copeland Road Industrial Park.

17. The site locations as per the TENs which have been submitted to Southwark Council Licensing are detailed in TENs applications as 133 Copeland Road, London SE15 3SN (Car Park), Bussey Building (D), Block A Roof Top Rear of D, 133 Copeland Road, London SE15 3SN and Copeland Gallery (9L), Unit 9L, Caravan Unit, 133 Copeland Road, London SE15 3SN.
18. Copies of the TENs are attached to this report as Appendix A.
19. The TENs are summarised as follows:
 - 133 Copeland Road, London SE15 3SN (Carpark) - TEN 859128: To allow the sale of alcohol to be consumed on and off the premises and the provision of regulated entertainment from 12:00hrs on 22 July 2017 to 02:00hrs on 23 July 2017. The maximum number of people expected at any one time at the premises is 499. The activities are to take place on & off the premises only.
 - Bussey Building (D), Block A Roof Top Rear of D, 133 Copeland Road, London SE15 3SN - TEN 859129: To allow the sale of alcohol to be consumed on and off the premises and the provision of regulated entertainment on 21 July 2017 and on 22 July 2017 between 12:00hrs and 23:00hrs. The maximum number of people expected at any one time at the premises is 250. The activities are to take place on and off the premises only.
 - Copeland Gallery (9L), Unit 9L, 133 Copeland Road, London SE15 3SN - TEN 859126: To allow the sale of alcohol to be consumed on and off the premises, provision of regulated entertainment on 21 July 2017 between 12:00hrs and 00:00hrs; on 22 July 2017 between 00:00hrs and 02:00hrs, and between 12:00hrs and 00:00hrs; and 23 July 2017 between 00:00hrs and 02:00hrs. The maximum number of people expected at any one time at the premises is 499. The activities are to take place on and off the premises only.

The objection notices

20. On the 13 June 2017 the Environmental Protection Team (EPT) served objection in respect of the TENs.
21. The EPT objection has been made on the grounds that these 3 TENs are submitted as a way to exceed the 499 capacity limit, which therefore undermines the Licensing Act.
22. EPT also state that the TENs submitted exceed the 499 event capacity limit, creates a risk that licensing objectives, specifically prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, and the prevention of public nuisance will not be upheld.
23. A copy of the EPT objection is attached to this report in Appendix B and a response to the objection from EPT is attached to this report as Appendix C.

25. The premises licence for Roof A, Bussey Building, Rear 133 Rye Lane, London SE15 4ST was granted on the 1 July 2013. The premises operates as a bar located on the rooftop of the Bussey Building.
26. The current premises licence holder is a Mr Jonathan Wilson and Mrs Lorelie Wilson. The designated premises supervisor of the premises is a Mr Gerry Cottle.

27. 133 Copeland Road, London SE15 3SN (Carpark) and Copeland Gallery (9L), Unit 9L, 133 Copeland Road, London SE15 3SN do not currently benefit from a premises licence.

Policy considerations

32. Section 4 of the Southwark statement of licensing policy on “administration, exercise and delegation of function” deals with the parameters under which TENs may be considered.

Consideration by the sub-committee

33. The sub-committee is asked to consider whether the issue of a counter notice is necessary for the promotion of the prevention of public nuisance and protection of public safety licensing objectives.

Community impact statement

34. Members are advised that under the Act, the matters to which consideration may be given in this instance are the crime and disorder and public nuisance objectives.
35. In considering the TENs in terms of community impact the sub-committee must restrict its considerations to this matter.

Resource implications

36. A fee of £21.00 has been paid by the applicant in respect of each TEN, this being the statutory fee payable.

Consultation

37. The Act provides for no consultations to take place other than the process outlined in this report.

SUPPLEMENTARY ADVICE FROM OTHER OFFICERS

Director of Law and Democracy

38. The sub-committee is asked to determine the notification of this temporary event under Section 105 of the Licensing Act 2003 and to consider whether or not counter notice should be issued in the circumstance. It must only issue a counter notice if they believe the event would undermine the crime prevention objective set out in the Act.
39. The principles which sub-committee members must apply are set out below.

Principles for making the determination

40. The general principle is that temporary event notices must be accepted unless a relevant objection is received from the police. This is subject to the proviso that the premises user has complied with regulations and submitted the notice within a prescribed time.

41. A relevant objection is that which:
- Is about the likely effect of the TEN on the promotion of the crime prevention of the licensing objectives
 - Is made by the metropolitan police
 - Has not been withdrawn
 - Are not, in the opinion of the relevant licensing authority, frivolous or vexatious.
42. If a relevant objection notice is received then the sub-committee must have regard to it in determining whether it is necessary for the promotion of the prevention of crime prevention and the prevention of public nuisance licensing objectives of the Licensing Act to:
- Issue a counter notice by adding to, omit, and/or alter the conditions of the licence or
 - Reject the whole or part of the application for TEN.

Conditions

43. The sub-committee may attach conditions on the carrying on of permitted licensable activities. The sub-committee's function is to determine whether a counter notice should be issued.
44. Members are also referred to the Home Office revised guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 on conditions, specifically section 10.

Reasons

45. The sub-committee must give reasons for its decision to issue or not to issue a counter notice.

Hearing procedures

46. Subject to the licensing hearing regulations, the licensing committee may determine its own procedures. Key elements of the regulations are that:
- The hearing shall take the form of a discussion led by the authority. Cross examination shall not be permitted unless the authority considered that it is required for it to consider the objection.
 - Members of the authority are free to ask any question of any party or other person appearing at the hearing.
 - The committee must allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights to:
 - Address the authority
 - If given permission by the committee, question any other party.

- In response to a point which the authority has given notice it will require clarification, give further information in support of their submission.
 - The committee shall disregard any information given by a party which is not relevant:
 - To the particular submission before the committee
 - To the licensing objectives prevention of crime and disorder.
 - The hearing shall be in public, although the committee may exclude the public from all or part of a hearing where it considers that the public interest in doing so outweighs the public interest in the hearing, or that part of the hearing, taking place in private.
 - In considering the objection and notice the authority may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their objection or notice (as applicable) either before the hearing or, with the consent of all the other parties, at the hearing.
47. This matter relates to the determination of a notification for a temporary event notice under section 105 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regulation 26(1) (c) requires the sub-committee to make its determination at the conclusion of the hearing.
48. Members should note that the licensing sub-committee is meeting on this occasion solely to perform the role of licensing authority. The sub-committee sits in quasi-judicial capacity, and must act impartially. It must offer a fair and unbiased hearing of the application. In this case, members should disregard the council's broader policy objectives and role as statutory authority in other contexts. Members must direct themselves to making a determination solely based upon the licensing law, guidance and the council's statement of licensing policy.
49. As a quasi-judicial body the licensing sub-committee is required to consider the temporary event notice on its merits. The sub-committee must take into account only relevant factors, and ignore irrelevant factors. The decision must be based on evidence, that is to say material, which tends logically to show the existence or non-existence of relevant facts, or the likelihood or unlikelihood of the occurrence of some future event, the occurrence of which would be relevant. The licensing sub-committee must give fair consideration to the contentions of the police objection.
50. Members will be aware of the council's code of conduct which requires them to declare personal and prejudicial interests. The code applies to members when considering licensing applications. In addition, as a quasi-judicial body, members are required to avoid both actual bias, and the appearance of bias.
51. Under the Human Rights Act 1998, the sub committee needs to consider the balance between the rights of the applicant and those making the objection to the application when making their decision. The sub-committee has a duty under section 17 Crime and Disorder Act 1998 when making its decision to do all it can to prevent crime and disorder in the borough.

52. Where the relevant counter notice under section 105(3) is given the premises user may appeal against that decision. Where a counter notice is not given, the chief officer of police may appeal against that decision. The appeal must be made to the Magistrates' Court within a period of 21 days beginning with the day on which the applicant was notified by the licensing authority of the decision to be appealed against. No appeal may be brought later than five working days before the day on which the event begins.

Guidance

53. Members are required to have regard to the Home Office revised guidance in carrying out the functions of licensing authority. However, guidance does not cover every possible situation, so long as the guidance has been properly and carefully understood, members may depart from it if they have reason to do so. Full reasons must be given if this is the case.

REASONS FOR URGENCY

54. The TENs process is time limited, and due to legislative time constraints it would not be possible to wait for a further meeting to be held to consider this report.

REASONS FOR LATENESS

55. This report was not available for circulation within five clear days before the meeting due to legislative time constraints.

I am considering your Temporary Event Notices on behalf of the Environmental Health Responsible Authority for 3 areas of Copeland Park, for a beer festival. These areas are adjacent on the plan (although Roof B is vertically separated).

The two ground floor areas have also got regulated entertainment on the TEN.

There are concerns over the legality of authorising events for more than 499 people by using multiple TENs, especially where the TENs are on adjacent property. There are additional concerns where there may be more than 499 people in the same audience for regulated entertainment.

Following recent similar applications, Licensing Sub Committee has indicated that in line with the House of Lords select committee report, Environmental Health are expected to make a representation, so the matter can be considered in detail by a Licensing Sub Committee.

Before I make my representation, I would like to hear anything you have to say about these multiple TENs, and the detailed way the beer festival will operate.

Dear Paul,

I am writing in regard to the Peckham Craft Beer Festival that The London Beer Factory are organising in Copeland Park on 22nd July 2017.

The aim of the festival is to celebrate the beer being brewed in South London by bringing together the breweries within South London and giving them an opportunity to showcase some of their most interesting beers.

Copeland Park was chosen as the location because of it's central location within south London and lay out of the industrial estate suits a market style festival.

The festival itself will consist of 16 micro breweries from South London. They will each have a trestle table from which they will be able to showcase their most interesting beers. These are sometimes one offs beers but generally produced in low quantities with the aim of showing the public the skill in craftsmanship they can produce.

The festival will be set up in a similar manner to a market, with each brewery having a stall either in the Copeland Car Park or in The Gallery.

In terms of controlling numbers, we will have security on the door of Copeland Gallery making sure that the capacity will not be exceeded. The capacity in The Gallery will be limited to 250 people, so we can amend the TEN: 859126 to show this. The Copeland gallery is where we will have regulated entertainment, the only music in the Car Park will be background music therefore we can amend the TEN: 859128 to show this.

We will have 3 security staff who will have radio contact with each other. They will be responsible for managing the capacity at the event as well as preventing any public nuisance and make sure that people leave in an orderly manner. This will be assisted by six staff from The London Beer Factory who will have radio contact with the security and each other. All of the members of staff working for the breweries involved will be briefed on security measures and fire safety procedures. I will be present throughout the festival and ultimately responsible for making sure that the event is carried out in the correct manner.

To clarify the event being held on Roof D under TEN 859129 is a separate event. This is a pop up that we're hosting on various Fridays and Saturdays throughout the summer. This is run by a separate team within The London Beer Factory but overseen by Neil Pickford. This will have separate security who will make sure the

capacity of 250 people is not exceeded. The security will also make sure that there is no anti social behaviour and prevent any public nuisance.

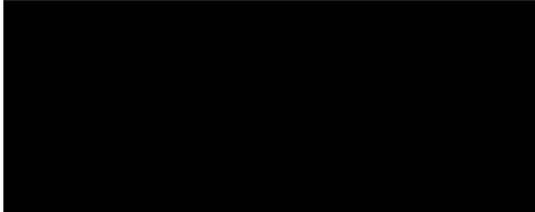

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

100 No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence -

a. At a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence; or

b. At a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended

101 Every supply of alcohol under the Premises Licence must be made, or authorised by, a person who holds a Personal Licence

102 The admission of children to films given under this licence must be restricted in accordance with the recommendations of the British Board of Film Classification or of the licensing authority itself

485 (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require, encourage, individuals to

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-

- (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process; or
- (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

486 The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

487 The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

488 (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

489 The responsible person shall ensure that -

(a) Where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -

(i) Beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) Gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) Still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) Customers are made aware of the availability of these measures

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

288 CCTV shall be installed and have the ability to capture a clear identifiable facial image of all patrons entering the venue. Images will be stored for a minimum of 31 days and will be made available to Police or other relevant authority upon request.

336 A personal licence holder will be on duty at the premises at all times that intoxicating liquor being supplied. Should there be an occasion where a personal licence holder cannot be present, a member of staff suitably trained with regards to their responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003 will be on duty, A record of the date and time of training will be kept and updated every 6 months and will be made available for inspection by the Police or other relevant authorities on request.

340 Entry and or exit to the premises via the corridor between Rye Lane and the court yard to the front of the Bussey Building is restricted and will only be used up until 21:30. After 21:30 entry and egress from the premises will be via the entrance on Copeland Road.

341 That clear signage shall be displayed directing customers to the entrance.

342 All beverages shall be consumed from plastic/polycarbonate glasses or bottles i.e. no glassware to be used by customers at any time.

343 That live music will be acoustic only. Any loud instrumentation, drums and brass shall be muted or damped.

344 That after 20.00hrs live acoustic music will be played at background volume, on any day.

345 That the closing time shall be 30mins after the cessation of licensable activities.

346 That cleaning/vacuuming will take place during daylight hours to reduce noise.

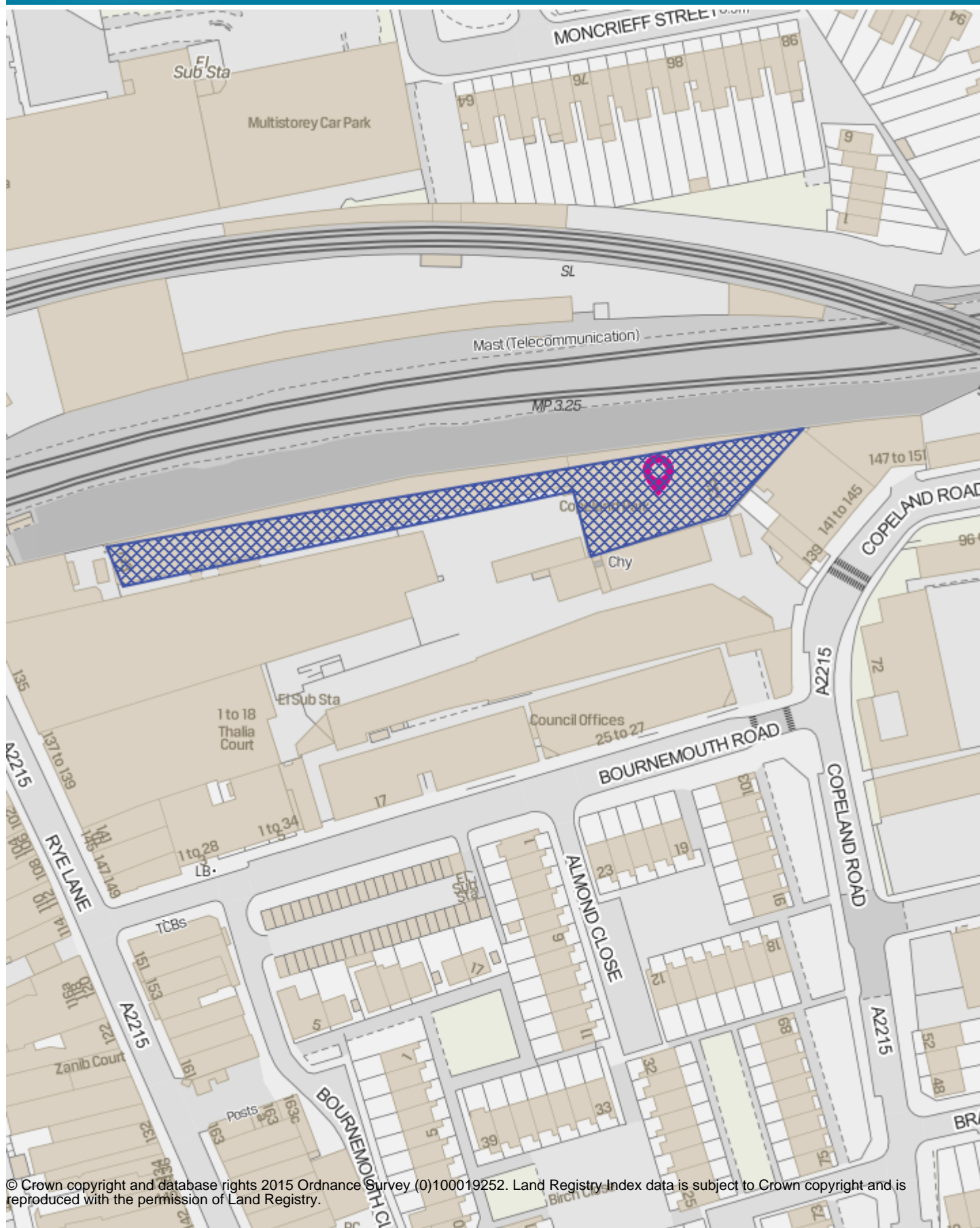
