<p>“Why are there one-way systems operating on parts of East Street and King and Queen Street, when they are massively ignored? Half the cars parked in these zones are facing the wrong direction.”</p>	<p>Awaiting response from officers.</p>
<p>ACTION: Officers to produce a list of establishments which allow people to use their toilets, even if they are not customers.</p>	<p>In terms of council buildings, there is no set policy on the use of facilities by the general public. The majority of council buildings with the exception of Libraries, museums etc. are not open to the general public and do not generally have facilities adjacent to or easily accessible from entrances. In the Walworth area the only council building with formal arrangements is 151 Walworth Road where the facilities are open to the public as it is both a library and museum. A key issue is security and the requirement to escort and chaperone members of the public if they use facilities within the body of council buildings. The general approach is that there is no open access but clearly if a member of the public was in some distress or discomfort they would of course be allowed to use the toilets.
