The following gives you information about the priorities that have been set and the actions we are taking to tackle them. Priority	Tackling Drugs on Meeting House Lane SE15
Date set	17 November 2011
Action taken/going to be taken	Following complaints from residents this area has been of local concern and has the therefore been made a long term priority to Livesey Team. In March 2012 Seven search warrants were executed. In September Five suspects have been charged with being involved in the supply of drugs and allowing premises to be used for supply. The environment is much improved with a second shop closed permanently. The work has continued through the summer with seizure of gambling machines in a social club to challenge further anti social behaviour.

Priority	Tackling anti social behaviour linked drugs on Queens Road
Date set	28 June 2012
Action taken/going to be taken	Following the reduced crime levels and related anti social behaviour in the Meeting House lane area our ward panel has asked us to look to improve the environment experienced by residents on our ward, North of Queens Road SE15. We have started a problem solving process. Increasing after school Robbery patrols and drugs detections in this area. I will keep you up dated with our progress.

Priority	General Anti-social behaviour on Ward
Date set	November 2011
Action taken/going to be taken	I am pleased to report that for the second period, crime figures for the ward and the level of anti social behaviour has been much reduced compared to last year and this reduction has been maintained over the last four months. PCSO's continue their daily patrol of the whole ward concentrating on areas reported to us on the above number. Areas reported for extra patrols are, Kings Grove through to the Acorn estate.
