## **RECOMMENDATION**

1. That the cabinet consider whether to hear a deputation from a representative from Southwark home care workers.
2. That the cabinet consider whether to hear a deputation from a representative of 'Peckham Vision' and businesses in Holly Grove and Blenheim Grove in respect of item 12 on the agenda 'Gateway to Peckham - Public Square and Station Regeneration.

## **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

3. When considering whether to hear the deputation request, cabinet can decide
  - To receive the deputation at this meeting or a future meeting; or
  - That the deputation not be received; or
  - To refer the deputation to the most appropriate committee/sub-committee.
4. A deputation shall consist of no more than six people, including its spokesperson. Only one member of the deputation shall be allowed to address the meeting for no longer than five minutes. After this time cabinet members may ask questions of the deputation for up to five minutes. At the conclusion of the questions, the deputation will be shown to the public area where they may listen to the remainder of the open section of the meeting.

## **KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION**

### **Southwark home care workers**

5. A deputation request has been submitted by a representative of Southwark home care workers in respect of an item on the cabinet agenda "Developing a quality strategy and best practice principles for home care services: initial review of Unison's ethical care charter."

### **Peckham Vision and Businesses in Holly Grove and Blenheim Grove**

6. A deputation request has been submitted by a representative of 'Peckham Vision' in respect of the report on 'Gateway to Peckham – Public Square and Station Regeneration. The deputation wish to make representations on the impact the regeneration may have on properties and businesses in the immediate area.

## Community impact statement

7. The Southwark Constitution allows for deputations to be made by groups of people resident or working in the borough.

## REASONS FOR URGENCY

8. The deputation requests were received in line with the constitutional deadline for the receipt of deputation requests and is therefore eligible for consideration by cabinet as to whether or not to hear the deputation at this meeting.

## REASONS FOR LATENESS

9. The deadline for the receipt of deputation requests was 11 April 2013, after the main cabinet agenda despatch on 8 April 2013. It has therefore not been possible to send out this report five clear days in advance of the meeting because of the need to ensure that all deputation requests received by the deadline were included in this report.
