# Request

On 15 January 2013 Southwark Council Planning Committee approved the outline planning application number 12/AP/1092 for the redevelopment of the former Heygate Estate including new landscaping, park and public realm, car parking, means of access and other associated works.

The developer subsequently developed the design for the public realm works and this design was submitted to the Planning Committee and approved under planning application 13/AP/3582.

A highways officer has reviewed the proposals and found them to be acceptable from a highway design perspective. In order to implement these changes it is now necessary to make traffic regulation orders.

## Location

This section of Larcom Street is located between the junction of Brandon Street and Content Street. The road is designated as one way (towards Content Street) except for cycles, which are also permitted to continue on Larcom Street beyond Content Street (where there is a motor vehicle ban) to Rodney Road.

Currently there are two permit holder bays on this section of Larcom Street.

### **Investigation and conclusions**

Previous parking usage surveys have indicated that parking in the area is highly subscribed. As part of the redevelopment proposals for the area Highways are seeking to maximise the parking provision in the area.

It is proposed to create two short stay parking bays on Larcom Street abutting the existing two permit holder bays.

## Recommendation

To create two additional short stay bays on Larcom Street.

A detailed drawing of the proposal is provided within this document.

#### **Next steps**

Should the community council approve this traffic order amendment, it is expected that statutory consultation will commence in December.

Should objections be received during the statutory consultation period, these will be presented at the next community council meeting for determination.

Following the statutory consultation period, if no substantive objections are received, a traffic order will be made during the following month and the works required to implement the change on site will be carried out as soon as practical thereafter.




