Community Infrastructure Project Lists

C IPL is a list of ideas generated by the community for publically accessible physical improvements that could be funded local Southwark Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL). The projects are approved to be included on the C IPL by councillors at the relevant community council.

The list of community infrastructure projects is updated yearly and ideas can be submitted at anytime.

To submit any ideas for the local community infrastructure projects please email planning.cil@southwark.gov.uk. Officers will advise on the project and if it fits with the projects in our Cleaner Greener Safer programme.

Who can suggest projects

- Anyone who lives, works or studies in Southwark.
- local groups - for example: tenants and residents groups, youth groups, faith groups, community groups or sports clubs

Once funding for a suitable local development is secured an officer will develop and manage the project in consultation with the applicant and the local community.

Ideas on the list will not automatically receive funding and are dependent on funding from new developments.

Collection to date

To give some indication of the funding involved - up to 1 March 2017:

- Borough, Bankside and Walworth CC area approximately £700,000 local CIL
- Camberwell CC approximately £5,000 local CIL received.

The funding is from developments that have been granted planning permission after April 2015 **and** have started being built. Prior to this date, S106 was collected, the use of which is defined within a legal agreement with the developer.

Delivery

The project delivery mechanism would be identified when the funding is allocated. It is proposed in order to avoid duplication of resources that the council's Regeneration and CGS teams are used as:

- The teams already have the necessary management and monitoring systems in place;
- The teams have a proven track record of working with the community councils and local communities and;
- In the case of the CGS teams, they have since 2003, successfully delivered a capital programme of over £30,393,000 which has led to the implementation of 1559 projects.
