There are often people in there with 7+ dogs all off leads which makes for a terrifying experience if you have a toddler. None of our neighbours will go there with their children. On one occasion I arrived at the [redacted] when 3 different professional dog walkers had just arrived. each with 4-5 animals, and another came from within the cemetery. There were over 18 dogs running free near the entrance, on the graves, whilst the walkers were having a chat and catch up. It felt extremely unsafe. In Peckham Rye park there is a particular problem near the pond and ornamental gardens with large and aggressive dogs off lead. Finally the staff in both the park and cemetery have all indicated to me that the problem has gotten out of hand in recent years and it is only a matter of time before there is a very serious incident. For vulnerable older individuals who use their local space as an opportunity to meet others while walking their dog and avoid isolation. For some of these spaces keeping dogs on leads could dramatically reduce the numbers of people using these spaces on a daily basis, all year round (not just weekends and when the sun shines), which could create other anti-social behaviour problems from those looking to cause trouble in quiet spaces. I would like to know if there is a public meeting arranged to discuss this further, how much it is costing to fund this consultation and how much it will cost to enforce these orders across the borough? I would also like more clarity on question 5 as it would give this person very broad powers to impose a restriction on dogs without necessarily any reason for it. What would be better, (assuming you are asking these questions for equality monitoring) would be if you were instead to rethink question 22, There are more than two sexes, we each have one and also a gender identity, of which we have more than two choices! Add other options including "trans, mtf", "trans, ftm", "non binary", "intersex". For example, someone may id as male and be 100% physically female (if they have not medically transitioned), their sex (according to your questions) is female but their gender identity (and thus their gender) is male. It would be painful for this man to tick the "female" box, so they will probably tick the "male" box. There are lots of issues involved in the sensitive use of sexed and gendered language. Giving people options that more closely reflect their realities is crucial if you want to get accurate figures. Please do get in touch with me if you want more advice around the terminology of sex, gender and sexuality. I would also recommend that you access some professional trans-awareness training, I can help put you in touch with the right people for this if you are interested. I often walk in Nunhead cemetery I respect the areas where the new graves are and put the dogs on lead in those areas. To be honest most of the professional dog walkers do so, where as I often see private dog walkers walking straight through the new graves. The problem is not how many dogs you are walking it is the dogs temperament and the person walking them. You could be walking 1 dog that would cause more problem then 5 dogs walking in a group. It is more about how you control the dogs you walk, if they do not respect the rules give them a warning and then next time ban them from the area rather then punish all dog walkers, all dog walkers should respect the areas they walk in, not just the professional dog walkers. Where is the evidence that Southwark residents are being "attacked by packs of dogs"? Also, where does it say anywhere in the cemetery that it is a Nature Reserve? I strongly agree that not enough people pick up after their dogs; this has been a major issue for years. As a dog-walker and owner, I always pick up any I see, as I am all too aware that the blame will fall squarely on our shoulders. I am also well aware that there are some very inexperienced dog-owners, and irresponsible dog-walkers. But blaming all of the dog-walkers is neither helpful, nor going to solve the situation. A far better approach would be to monitor those who have seemingly rowdy dogs, or are seen to be neglectful about picking up. Give them a warning, and deal with them in the appropriate manner. This is where I also think licensing is a very good idea - for owners and professional walkers. And this to be awarded only after having attended a training session on basic dog-obedience and handling. After all, this is NOT a NUMBERS issue, it is a CONTROL issue. It only takes one ill-trained dog to run amok. Most of us have been earning a living this way for a considerable number of years, and have either worked in training, or are studying canine behaviour so we know exactly what we are doing. Those who don't are the ones who need to be monitored more closely. It is highly unimaginative and punitive to expect all of us to limit dogs to 4, (I am insured to walk 6) and keep them onlead at all times. Imagine if children were not allowed to run around screaming at playtimes; it's exactly the same with dogs. They are hugely energetic, and (for the most part) friendly creatures. Keeping them onlead at all times will lead to far greater behavioural consequences. Lastly, let us remember that we are talking about domestic, loving pets which are often in families with children. There seems to be an assumption that we are all responsible for a few - this includes commercial dog walkers, some of whom have far more control than individual dog owners. The re-introduction of dog licences and the checking of this by authorised officers (along with them checking for micro-chips) would go some way to establishing checks and balances. A dog which is well under control is a delight; those seeking to ban or remove them all from public spaces are often fearful of them, and this becomes a circular issue if they are removed from sight. Whatever happened to space being freely available to all (on the assumption that we behave responsibly)? Personally, I have seen a fair amount of alcohol or drug use in Nunhead Cemetery, but I believe in live and let live, so if they don't hassle me, I leave them to it. This cemetery, for the record, is completely different from many others in that there are areas in it which are, quite rightly, considered by local residents to be areas of natural beauty, rather than working cemetery, so there may be a way of fencing off the different sections? The issues of wildlife and defecation on graves are grossly misrepresented. There is a huge fox population in Nunhead Cemetery, as any local resident will tell you, and they are as likely as dogs to poop on graves (most people won't be able to tell the difference) and hassle wildlife. Before any radical change is made which restricts people's free access to open spaces, I would like to see some tangible data about the use of Nunhead Cemetery - my experience is that there are far more dog walkers than any other group. I have never seen an incident, and twice in May 2017, I have been the only visitor (as far as I could see) for the entire duration of an hour's walk. This would seem to be counter to the argument that there are packs or marauding dogs out of control.	I pick up after my dog and do not think there is a problem. My perception is that over that time, whilst dog ownership has increased, dog related fouling and irresponsible ownership has decreased - for example, dog mess on goose Green and on the local streets has reduced and where offenses occur it is down to a very few inconsiderate and irresponsible dog owners. I have walked in Nunhead cemetery for many years, with my wife for many years and with my children over the last 15 years, and, in the last few years as a dog owner, several times a week. I have not in this time had first hand experience of the problems reported regarding commercial dog owners, unless I am to assume that the dog mess that isn't picked up is down to commercial dog walkers. Individual dog walkers make up a large proportion of the users of the cemetery and I in the main are good custodians of the space and value it highly. As in all walks of life there are a few irresponsible individuals but to my mind it would be totally unfair to penalize responsible dog walkers by introducing blanket enforcement of regulation such as 'on leads at all times'. I do agree with limiting commercial dog walkers to four dogs at a time - whilst many of these people are also responsible, it is very difficult for them to keep track of a larger number. A fairly small number of warden visits would hopefully quite quickly change any anti social culture that may have developed as a response to clamp downs in neighboring boroughs. Dog free areas, (which need adequate fencing) and on lead areas are a good idea and appear to me to function well in Peckham Rye Park. Dogs aren't and to my mind shouldn't be allowed in children's play areas and the adult supervisors of children need to take care to keep gates to these areas closed. If the restrictions are put in place and dogs are made to be kept on lead at all times, only the dogs with behavioural issues will be walked through the cemetery. The reason why there is a concentrated amount of dog walkers here in southwark is because other boroughs have put legislation like this in place. It's passing on the "problem". Like most dog walkers I am insured to have 6 dogs in my care. However, as I don't own my own dogs I restrict my numbers to 5 dogs per walk. Other dog walkers walk more at a time because they have their own dogs too. Dog walking is our livelihood and a service people need. If restrictions are put in place we will have to raise prices to be able to make a living. Prices that most everyday working people won't be able to afford. Therefore dogs will get less exercise and you'll see much more antisocial dog behaviour in parks. As for dog mess.. I always pick it up, sometimes even if it isn't from one of my dogs because it's unpleasant and because it's my reputation on the line. For the same reason I always keep my dogs on lead through the new burials where the signs are placed. This legislation is not the answer. Far from it, I think dogs and their owners have a hugely positive impact on these spaces - ensuring that these are safe spaces for everyone to use.☺ ☺ If dogs were banned from these spaces their use would plummet which would have an overall detrimental affect on these spaces. I currently feel safe as a lone woman walking through these spaces at dusk or even late in the evening but I would not feel the same if dogs were banned. If I knew that there would hardly be anyone in Nunhead Cemetery, for example, I would be much less likely to walk through at 6pm in the evening for fear of being attacked. I imagine that crime, littering and general antisocial behaviour would start to increase in these areas once dog owners were no longer using them. It's purpose, according to the original report approving the consultation, is to seek the public view on specific proposed PSPO provisions, and yet it does not set out what those specific proposed provisions actually are. In particular, it does not state that one of the proposed PSPO provisions is that dogs should be kept on a lead in or excluded from Nunhead Cemetery. Further, it does not make it clear that only a part of Nunhead Cemetery is a working cemetery and that the greater part of it is a nature reserve made up of wild woodland. This lack of clarity has serious implications. Many people will assume, as I did originally, that the wild parts of Nunhead are a nature reserve and that only the working parts are regarded as a cemetery. This view appears to be supported by the fact that in the consultation there are different questions applying to cemeteries and nature reserves. It has now dawned on me, however, that this might not be the case and that, in fact, all of Nunhead might be being regarded as a cemetery and that, therefore, a vote for dogs to be kept on leads in working cemeteries might be interpreted as a vote to keep dogs on leads in the wild parts of Nunhead; the very opposite of the view I wished to express. I fear a great number of people have been similarly misled. The consultation, to be of any real value, needs to set out the specific proposed PSPO provisions and, especially considering that this is the most contentious issue in the proposals, make it clear that a well-trained and well-behaved dog that is off the lead and under the control of a responsible owner does not cause anti-social behaviour. It is the handling of the dog by an irresponsible owner that causes anti-social behaviour, and it is only those irresponsible owners that should be penalised. It is grossly unfair to penalise the vast majority of responsible dog owners and the freedom and well-being of their well-behaved dogs. Responsible owners use common sense to keep dogs on leads in such areas where it is highly appropriate to do so, and those same responsible owners always remove dog mess.
