M Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

The venue's purpose is to house our running club which been going for over 8 years. The emphasis therefore is promoting free exercise and giving advice and help to our thriving running community. We've won 3 awards for volunteering and are supported by MP Neil Coyle as we were by his predecessor Simon Hughes. We've also featured recently on BBC breakfast promoting our Couch to 5k programme, as well as on ITV news and the local press. All of this makes us quite unlike any of the breweries and establishments nearby which we feel will help us provide something new in the area promoting health and wellbeing.

We have been meeting in other venues along Druid Street for many years, and therefore are not going to be increasing the volume of people visiting the area once our venue opens. For over a year we have been meeting within 100 feet of the new venue in a nearby pub without any complaint from nearby residents.

As a long established club, we already have terms and conditions to ensure that the safety and welfare of the public is protected. We revoke membership of the club to anyone who behaves non-respectfully to other members, the venue staff, or members of the public. Over the years this has happened very rarely and we have a community of long-established members, many of whom are well-respected professionals and members of the local community. A number of our members live in the housing estate directly opposite the venue.

The venue will also serve and be visited by members of the public outside of our main club session times, but they would be in the minority and are expected to observe our rules in relation to the license objectives.

Very few of our runners smoke so there should not be a need for large numbers to continually congregate outside. In warmer weather some runners may stand in the outside space on Druid Street next to the road, but we will make sure this number is always low and we'll ensure that it is cordoned off and that the number of people never exceeds 30. SIA staff will be employed if necessary to make sure that the number doesn't go over x25 in order to give us a buffer.

Often we will have running related workshops within the arch, but these will be ticketed to limit numbers and will not be heard from the outside of the venue. We give water to our members on running nights and these will be served in recyclable cups with our logo. All bottles and refuge will be disposed of very quietly and before 10pm at night.

All staff will be trained to enforce Challenge 25 and to use the incident log in case of any incidents.

Any music will just be ambient music kept at low volume. Tuesday is our busiest night of the week and usually almost all runners have left the venue by 9.30pm

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV will be put on the premises both at the counter and the entrance to the property. The staff will be trained to look out for any suspicious activity and if crimes are suspected this will be reported to the police.

c) Public safety

If at any point a member of staff sees a customer who appears to be intoxicated they will immediately inform the duty manager. Service will be refused should they try to buy another drink. The duty manager will ask them politely to leave explaining that it's not personal but it's for professional reasons. They will also be offered water. If they become unruly they will be asked to leave the premises and on all occasions this will be recorded in the service log.

Glassware will be regularly collected from inside and outside the area and any broken glass swept up and disposed of immediately. We will also conduct regular head counts inside and outside the property every half an hour. We'll have all the relevant fire and safety notices in place.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Any patrons inside who are causing nuisance by shouting, chanting or causing trouble which could cause annoyance to nearby residents will be asked to keep the noise down. If they ignore this then they will be reported to the duty manager and they will be asked to leave. The incident will be recorded in an incident log. We'll add posters on drinking and driving in the toilets and drink aware posters.

e) The protection of children from harm

Membership of our running club is only open to adults over the age of 18. Children do occasionally visit the club but always accompanied by a parent/guardian and under no circumstances would ever be served alcohol.

We will use challenge 25 to prevent anyone under the age of 18 buying or consuming alcohol. Staff will be trained to recognise the internationally recognised IDs and will check the photos and dates.




