My name is [REDACTED] and I live [REDACTED] Arnold Estate.

I have lived on the Arnold Estate for 20 years and whilst I support the idea of vibrant business in our neighbourhood I am disappointed that Hawkes are causing a nuisance and breach of the following Southwark Licensing Policy objectives:

1. The prevention of crime and disorder:

This establishment is part of what is colloquially known as 'The Bermondsey Mile' where groups, mostly of men, visit these establishments with the intention of getting drunk. The consequences of this are regular skirmishes where the groups argue and fight amongst themselves.

People are also leaving the premises and going on to the estate to take drugs.

2. Ensuring public safety:

There are regularly broken glasses and bottles on the pavement on Druid St. My family also fear for their safety when fights are occurring.

3. The prevention of public nuisance:

The noise coming from the premises is affecting our lives. During hot weather when this place is particularly busy and at it's noisiest we have to close our windows in order to hear our television. This makes us extremely uncomfortable. There are crowds of people outside shouting until very late in the evening.

People are also urinating and vomiting in the street and on the estate.

4. The protection of children from harm:

As mentioned people are taking drugs on the estate and others are urinating. During the day and evening this is in full view of the children playing outside.

3. The prevention of public nuisance

It concerns me that I hear a lot of noise including people shouting, singing, obviously intoxicated in the evening and night, which on occasion has woken me up. I have a 2 year old child so I need to keep her safe and when there is such behaviour so close to where we live it worries me. It's obvious to me that this is the result of people drinking alcohol that's purchased on Druid St.

Bouncers/security personel must intervene more when those drinking at their premises are causing a nuisance especially late at night when people are trying to sleep. They should be deescalating problem situations, rowdy behaviour and communicating with the other establishments so that those individuals or groups don't go on to cause more problems down the street.

I strongly believe that more has to be done to protect the residents who have to put up with this noise. Especially when those like The Barrel Project are in breach. License fees are taken from these establishments therefore Southwark Council is making money out of this so they have a responsibility to enforce when establishments are in breach.
