#### **DECISION(S)**

1. That the current recommended CPZ is split into two separate areas known as East Dulwich CPZ, with zone operational hours of 8.30am to 6.30pm, and Peckham West CPZ, with zone operational hours of Mon-Fri and 9am to 11am.
2. The Peckham West CPZ is to have the same boundaries as those proposed in the consultation process. The East Dulwich boundary is to reflect Dulwich Community Council feedback to the interim revised boundaries.
3. The implementation of each zone is subject to separate statutory consultation.
4. That decisions relating to further minor amendments to the detailed engineering design be delegated to officers.
5. That the statutory consultation be extended to longer than the minimum 21 days to allow consideration of the recommendations and to account for overlap with school holiday time if applicable.
6. That officers bring any representations that cannot be entirely dealt with back before the cabinet member for determination.
7. That officers review the zone operation within six to nine months of implementation (Subject to the outcome of necessary statutory procedures).
8. That the public realm improvements included in the scheme design under the healthy streets approach be noted.
9. That the financial implications of delivery detailed in the report be noted.

## REASONS FOR DECISION

Representation from Councillor McAsh, Goose Green ward, requesting an all day operational parking zone for the East Dulwich section of the proposed CPZ in order to address potential parking problems associated with the new school and health centre.

This representation by Councillor McAsh (received on 30 July) stated:

*"Dulwich Community Council asked for an all day CPZ in the East Dulwich area, and this outcome had majority support in the proposed area. Residents want this because they are concerned that a 2 hour zone will not make parking possible around the new secondary school and health centre, and potentially even the train station."*

Whilst these points regarding the hours of operation relating to the station, hospital and school are covered in the report, I am persuaded that more weight needs to be given to them and I have therefore decided to amend the recommendation to allow for a separate zone that can operate between 8:30am and 6:30pm on the south side of Grove Vale.

Furthermore, this amendment would bring the controlled parking zones more in line with those initially consulted on and the recommendations made by Dulwich Community Council, which proposed an East Dulwich controlled parking zone operating 8:30am to 6:30pm.

As the consultation outcomes reported in the report show, these hours were also supported by those residents and businesses on the streets within the proposed revised East Dulwich study area: More than twice as many respondents supported an all-day zone (50% of respondents) than a two hour zone (23% of respondents).

A letter from residents in streets including 69 signatories surrounding East Dulwich station dated 7 July 2019 emphasised their support for an all-day zone.

The residents and businesses within the Peckham West study area were divided in regards to preference for all day versus two hour zone (35% and 29% respectively) however community meetings (Dulwich Community Council and two informal Peckham meetings) identified support for a two hour zone. Officers have indicated that a two hour zone should be sufficient to address the commuter parking issue in this area.

Therefore keeping two separate CPZs, as set out in the consultation process, would allow for these different hours of operation.

It is important to note that the statutory consultation will give the opportunity for further feedback which will be considered in the final decision, and that it's possible to decrease restrictions from an all day zone to a two hour zone but not possible to increase restrictions from a two hour zone to an all day zone.

Finally, officers are instructed to carry out a review of the operation of both zones six months after implementation of the zone to identify further changes to operation, boundaries or design details that need to be made.


