There were three members of staff behind the counter one of whom I recognised as the owner/dps George Nwachukwu who approached me, I asked Mr Nwachukwu why was he still open and why there were customers in the restaurant to which he stated that he was closed and everyone present were staff, I asked about the people at the rear of the property and he confirmed they were also staff, we then walked through the restaurant to the rear of the property where a female					
informed me that the four persons present were staff and they were clearing up after an event, I then turned around and saw a male who was drinking from a spirit glass his eyes were glazed and he mumbled something towards me, in my opinion this male was drunk, I counted about 11 people inside the bar all of which Mr Nwachukwu said were staff.
