- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require, encourage, individuals to -
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional poster or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner; and
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- **487** The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

- **488** (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
- (a) a holographic mark; or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 489 The responsible person shall ensure that -
- (a) Where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
- (i) Beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
- (ii) Gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) Still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available,
- **491** 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purpose of the condition set out in paragraph (1):
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liqour Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula $P = D + (D \times V)$, where-
- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence:
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence; or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (iv) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (v)"value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall

be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax; (2) the permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Extra Conditions:

- 1. That a CCTV system be installed at the premises and be maintained in good working order and be continually recording at all times the premises are in use under the licence. The CCTV System must be capable of capturing a clear facial image of every person who enters the premises.
- 2. That all CCTV footage shall be kept for a period of thirty one (31) days and shall, upon request, be made immediately available to Officers of the Police and the Council.
- 3. That a member of staff should be on duty at all times the premises is open that is trained in the use of the CCTV and able to view and download images to a removable device.
- 4. That all staff are trained in their responsibilities under the licensing act 2003 and training records to be kept and updated every 6 months and shall, upon request, be made immediately available to Officers of the Police and the Council.
- 5. That suitable notices shall be displayed requesting people to leave the premises in a quiet and orderly manner so as not to disturb local residents.
- 6. That alcohol for consumption off the premises is not sold for immediate consumption in the area around the premises and is supplied in sealed containers.
- 7. Details of the premises opening and closing will be clearly displayed upon the premises for the information of customers
- 8. That staff shall make regular periodic patrols of the internal and external areas of the premises to monitor customer behaviour. If any customers are behaving in a disorderly manner staff will advise the customers to behave in an orderly manner.
- 9. That clearly legible signage will be prominently displayed throughout the premises, where it can easily be seen and read by customers, indicating all areas of the premises to which customer access is prohibited. Such signage shall be maintained from obstructions at all times that the premises are in use.
- 10. That when customers are leaving the premises at the end of trade on each day staff shall request to the effect that customers leave the premises and locale in a quiet and orderly manner.
- 11. That external waste handling, collections, deliveries and the cleaning of external areas shall only occur between the hours of 08.00 and 20.00.
- 12. That the accommodation limit for the premises is 25 people (including staff)
- 13. That a written dispersal policy shall be kept at the premises with the licence and be made available for inspection by authorised officers on request.
- 14. That clear legible signage shall be prominently displayed where it can be easily seen and read, requesting that alcohol sold as off sales should not be opened and consumed in the vicinity of the premises.

- 15. That all staff shall be trained in the use of the dispersal policy.
- 16. That a challenge 25 scheme shall be maintained at the stalls selling alcohol requiring that staff selling alcohol request that any customer who looks under 25 years old, and who is attempting to purchase alcohol, provides valid photographic identification proving that the customer is at least 18 years old. Valid photographic identification is composed of a driving licence, passport, UK armed services ID card and any Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS) accredited card such as the Proof of Age London (PAL) card.
- 17. That all staff involved in the sale of alcohol shall be trained in the prevention of sales of alcohol to underage persons, and the challenge 25 scheme in operation at the stall. A record of such training shall be kept / be accessible at the stall at all times and be made immediately available for inspection at the stall to council or police officers on request. The training record shall include the trainee's name (in block capitals), the trainer's name (in block capitals), the signature of the trainee, the signature of the trainer, the date(s) of training and a declaration that the training has been received.
- 18. That clearly legible signs shall be prominently displayed where they can easily be seen and read by customers stating to the effect that a challenge 25 policy is in operation at the premises, that customers may be asked to provide proof of age and stating what the acceptable forms of proof of age are. Such signage shall be displayed at all entrances, points of sale and in all areas where alcohol is displayed for sale. The signage shall be kept free from obstructions at all times.
- 19. That a register of refused sales of alcohol shall be maintained in order to demonstrate effective operation of the challenge 25 policy. The register shall be clearly and legibly marked on the front cover as a register of refused sales, with the address of the premises and with the name and address of the licence holder. The register shall be kept / be accessible at the premises at all times. The register shall be made immediately available for inspection at the premises to council or police officers on request.
- 20. No unaccompanied children under the age of 16 will be permitted any time.
- 21. No gambling machines will be on the premises.

Billy Franks Dispersal Policy

Billy Franks ensures it maintains a close working relationship with neighbouring businesses (along Druid Street & Maltby Street), and statutory authorities. The bottle shop manager is expected to deal with any complaints quickly and effectively. In relation to dispersal, our premises operates the following dispersal procedure:

- 1. Appropriate signage will be placed at exit doors asking customers to leave in an orderly & quiet manner and be respectful of local neighbours.
- 2. A transport to/from map/flyer will be created, showing local train/bus stops. There is an Uber 'meeting point' adjacent to Billy Franks.
- 3. A local taxi number will be available upon request

- 4. Last orders will be called at least 30 minutes before closing time. Customers will then be permitted 20 minutes drinking up past closing time, before being asked to finish their drinks before they leave.
- 5. A Strong management and staff presence will be maintained in customer areas during closing time to ensure customers leave in an orderly fashion.
- 6. Road safety in respect of customers leaving the premises: We shall display signs to the effect of: "Please keep off the road, keep an eye out for vehicles and stick to the footpaths and pedestrian crossings"
- 7. Management of ejections from the premises: A refusals log shall be maintained. The Shift manager (security if applicable) will ensure if people are refused service and asked to leave, they do so in an orderly manner.
- 8. Refuse / waste in the local vicinity arising through the operation of the premises: We will ensure the use of on-site rubbish bins, waste and recycling skips. Close of shift checklist ensuring staff check and tidy outside area, bins at a reasonable time.
