The 2019 LBS multi-ward survey for South Southwark showed that the Champion Hill Ward has higher than average levels of childhood obesity and higher levels of 0-15s in out-of-work benefit households. Our project will target these groups specifically through a programme of outreach before the project begins. The new circus and performance skills that participants will gain will increase their confidence levels, improve health, and overcome isolation. This type of activity is valuable for people who may not yet be confident in speaking English but have vast amounts of untapped talent. Draper Residents Action TRA	Winter Lights 2020	Now in its fifth year, the Winter Lights Festival is an extremely popular and much anticipated appointment for our community to mark the beginning of seasonal holidays and celebrate togetherness. Each edition has been developed and managed by Draper Together CIO in collaboration with local residents, reflecting the diverse and thriving communities that make it. Originally a one day event, it has grown into a three week craft workshop leading up to the festive four weeks month, a family celebration and a special gathering for residents of all ages to meet their neighbours at a distance. To comply with this year's COVID-19 restrictions, the craft workshop designed to take place at Draper Hall will be moved to each household. The Festival team will identify interested residents, prioritising council tenants and families with small children. A series of weekly online craft session will be broadcast on Zoom for the households who can access it, to get together and learn new skills safely. Residents will be then encouraged to leave their decorations at their Reception (or at their front door) once ready.
