BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 3. Southwark Council published its Outbreak Prevention and Control Plan (OPCP) on 30 June 2020. Instructions were made to Local Authorities in late February to refresh their plans. The refreshed plan for Southwark can be found in Appendix 1 of the report.
- 4. The refreshed OPCP:
 - Sets out the aims and objectives for prevention and control as we move through the pandemic 12 months on.
 - Within the main body of the report, the developments in testing, contact tracing, vaccination and emergence of variants of concern are reflected in the objectives, action plans and appendices.
 - The action plans for the key areas of prevent, test and trace, vaccination and surveillance have been updated.

- The appendices are additional and provide greater detail on the more developed processes that we now have for these programmes and the more evolved regional and London work. They include response processes to outbreak identification including variants of concern, the test and trace arrangements, the London testing strategy and the find and treat approach for inclusion health.
- The document also signposts to other key local documents such as the vaccine strategy and the related communications and engagement plan, the community ambassadors programme, Southwark Standing Together and the Health inequalities framework.
- 5. The document is very much a 'live' document and implementation and actions are informed very much by the changing context of the pandemic including central government, DHSC and PHE guidance.
