Public questions raised	
Q1	<p>Re Traffic Calton Avenue - A resident said they would welcome some help finding a solution that was fair to all. He added that many parents are terrified of the situation.</p>
A1	<p>Chair said there were two main problems</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i) At school dropping off time there is a congestion problem with lots of cars parked at the Village end. ii) When the road is not busy then vehicles travel too fast down the hill. <p>There are therefore different problems that require different solutions.</p> <p>Councillors asked officers to liaise with the residents group to bring forward proposed solutions.</p>
Q2	<p>Re Youth Provision in Dulwich A resident asked how many children were being targeted ? They added that hundreds of youngsters in Dulwich had nothing to do.</p>
A2	<p>Jackie Leck said that all young people should be able to access youth provision. The steering group would allocate resources and make the key decisions. Young people would be consulted throughout.</p> <p>Cllr Michelle Holford added that areas in Southwark would bid for slices of funding. The funding should make a real difference.</p>
Q3	<p>Re Youth Provision in Dulwich A resident asked about how the quadrants would work ?</p>
A3	<p>Jackie said that young people will often only travel so far for facilities so each quadrant would have a hub building as a focus. She added that Dulwich had about 3782 young people to cater for.</p>
Q4	<p>Soap box session Jean Hoole thanked Dulwich Community Council and Southwark Council for cross party support in the campaign to save the Maudsley 24hr Emergency Clinic. Jean asked for further support at the House of Commons on 5 February</p>

	2007 when the matter will be discussed.
A4	Cllr Richard Thomas congratulated the deputation made to the recent Council Assembly.

Q5	Soap box session Mr Yarrow asked Dulwich Community Council to scrutinise the Metropolitan Police decision to sell off small / antiquated police stations ?
A5	Chair said that the community council did not have the power to call-in a Police decision but they could ask them why ? Also we want to know about the boundaries of Safer Neighbourhood Teams.

Q6	Re Model Byelaws A resident asked if byelaws were intended to educate residents on what they should be doing ?
Q6	Joan Leary said that the approach would be a combination of education and enforcement. There will be events such as flag the poo for dog fouling but also Fixed Penalty Notices for offenders. Wardens and PCSOs (Police Community Support Officers) could issue tickets.

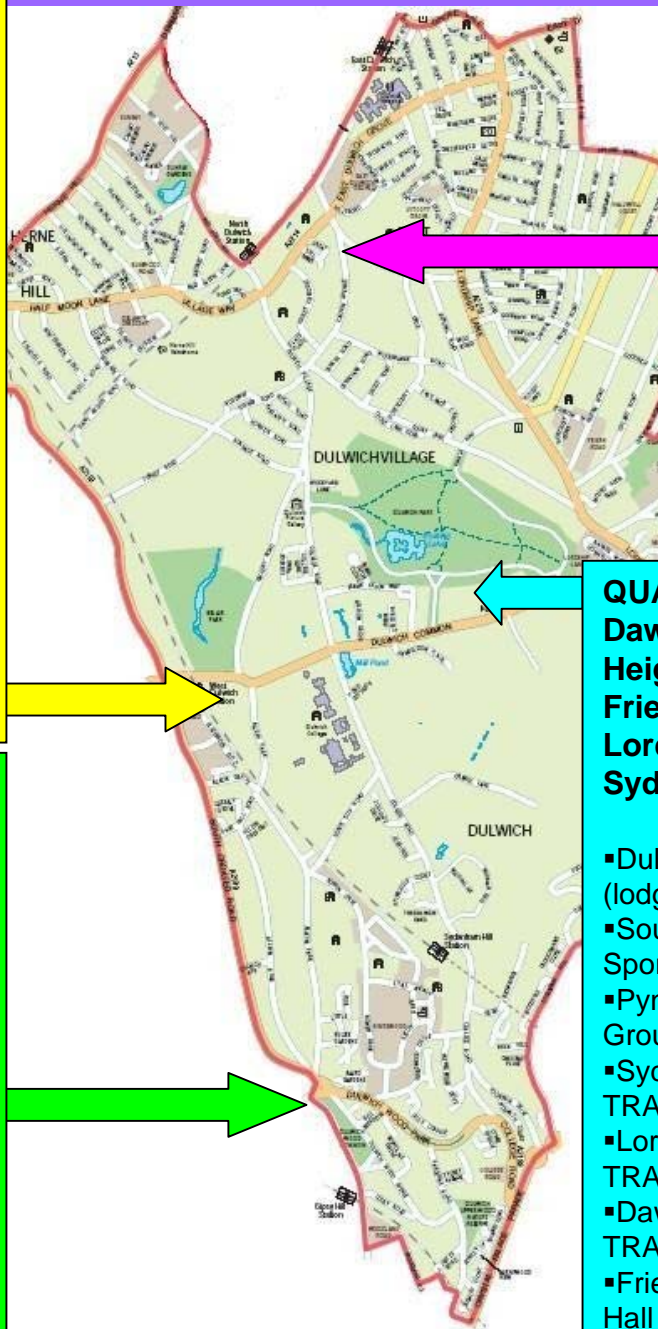

RECOMMENDATION(S)

1. It is recommended that the disabled parking bays set out in the Appendix B to this report are approved for implementation subject to the outcome of any necessary statutory procedures.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

2. This report presents proposals for a number of local traffic management schemes, which are matters reserved to Community councils for decision.
3. The origins of the proposals are indicated in the annexed schedule.

KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION

4. The reasons for the proposed traffic schemes are set out in the Appendix B.
5. The proposals are consistent with the policies set out in the draft Parking and Enforcement Plan, which in turn reflects the Council's policy priorities as set out in the Community Strategy and the emerging Transport Plan.
6. The proposals will support the Council's Equal Opportunities Policy and will promote social inclusion:
 - by providing improved access for emergency vehicles and residents
 - for disabled drivers
 - increasing parking provision

RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

7. Implementation of the proposals can be undertaken within existing budgets.

CONSULTATION

8. Preliminary consultation of the occupants of properties directly affected has been undertaken where appropriate.
9. Should the Community Council approve the item, statutory consultation will take place as part of the making of the Traffic Management Order. A proposal notice will be erected in proximity to the site location and a press notice will be published in the Southwark News and London Gazette. If there are objections the proposal, or a modified proposal will be re-submitted to the Community Council.
10. The Head of Transport Planning (Regeneration Department) and the Head of Parking Services (Environment and Leisure Department) have been consulted on the proposals and have no objections.
11. No Consultation or comment has been sought from the Borough Solicitor & Secretary or the Chief Finance Officer.
