Café Nero

DECISION:

In light of the café nero planning application being refused by the council's planning committee from trading as a shop to a café. DCC notes it is likely the establishment would carry on trading until the appeals process is completed and then the council would be able to take out enforcement action.

8. Deputations and petitions

Court Lane deputation

DCC welcomed the deputation by Lizette Bang on behalf of residents of Court Lane concerning problems with motorists using Court Lane as a cut through which causes noise pollution and is potentially dangerous for the elderly and young children. C.L. residents recommend that preventative measures are introduced possibly to change the layout of Court Lane by installing a traffic signal at the top of the road or introduce a pedestrian crossing and double yellow lines at the park entrance.

DECISION:

DCC agreed to discuss proposals with officers during the break out session.

Belair car park deputation

DCC welcomes the deputation by Prof Issac Marks on behalf of the Dulwich Society concerning Belair car park. Prof Marks reported that Southeast trains recently confirmed to the Dulwich society that the frequency of trains stopping at West Dulwich (& Sydenham Hill) would double to four an hour from Nov 07 and asked DCC Members to consider the following proposals:

- 1. Encourage people to drive to the station (possibly from some distance away)': Southwark residents within, say, a kilometre of Belair could be provided with an authorisation similar to that issued in connection with controlled parking zones (CPZs) and perhaps at the same annual fee (the possibility of collaborative arrangements with Lambeth Council could be considered for Lambeth residents living within a kilometre of the car park). This authorisation would entitle holders to use the Car Park after a defined time in the evening. It would deter users from driving in from far away, and thus not encourage significant additional traffic onto the A205.
- Will prejudice the DCPS nursery pickup and drop off (and) that it will reduce the availability of space for park users': These would not be affected by the above arrangement as there will be no change in the incentive for car commuters during the hours operating at present.
- 3. 'Practical difficulties' The enforcement of permit arrangements to use the car park left open until the time of the last train, or possibly all night could be by randomly-timed visits by wardens in the evenings imposing appropriate fines.

These, together with the cost of the CPZ-type authorisations, should cover enforcement costs. The car park could be separated from the rest of Belair
