Main items discussed at this meeting:

- Red Post Hill – bridge renewal and road closure
- Cleaner greener safer – awards
- Herne Hill Junction – local traffic road scheme
- City Car Club – presentation

Red Post Hill – bridge renewal and road closure

Representatives from Network Rail (Phil Daniel, Phil Avery and Janet Anderson) were at the meeting to explain that the North Dulwich bridge is to undergo some reconstruction so it can be a 40 tonne capacity bridge as opposed to the current 7.5 tonne capacity.

This project is jointly funded by Network Rail and Transport for London.

The presenters outlined that they propose to:

- Divert traffic via Half Moon Lane and Village way
- Install temporary bus stops
- Diverting the bus route
- Proposed road closure for 19 weeks
- Minor road works in advance of diversion

Members of the public and Cllrs expressed concern about the lack of consultation particularly as the road closure would cause severe disruption to the area.

Andrew Downes agreed to work closely with local ward Councillors, community representatives, local Schools and residents. It was suggested that a public meeting be convened on this issue as soon as possible.

City Car Club – presentation

James Finlayson chief executive from City Car Club presented this item and outlined:

- Car Club is a practical way of reducing parking and general congestion.
- Members of car club rent cars by the hour which can be parked near a person's house or designated place that have parking bays.
- The scheme is very similar to hiring a car and you can book on online.

How it works?

- The person is issued with a smart card and membership card.
- You can book by the hour at a fixed rate.
- Key in your membership no. and are billed at the end of using the car.
- All cars are environmentally friendly.

Who joins the club?

- All ages minimum age is 21 yrs.
- Be in employment.
- Suitable for people who want to give up owning a car or who are thinking of buying a second car.

During questions, the following was discussed:

- Encourage City Car club to use hybrid cars which has the lowest CO2 omissions.
- Car clubs are responsible for cleaning and general maintenance of cars.
- Published newsletter to encourage car club operators to get started in their area.
- Group of individuals who live within close proximity of one another can join the scheme.
- Designated car parking bays for those who wish to join the scheme.
- S106 monies could be used to fund car club schemes and possibly secure money from Transport for London.

Herne Hill Junction improvements

Andrew Downes, (environment & housing) and Alastair Hanton (Dulwich Society) presented this item.

This is a joint scheme between Lambeth and Southwark Councils. The scheme proposes works to Dulwich Road, Railton Road, Norwood Road, Half Moon Lane, Herne Hill and Milkwood Road and the section of Half Moon Lane under the railway bridge which are boundary roads between Lambeth and Southwark.

Dulwich CC formally agreed this proposal in principle and requested the executive member for environment supports the scheme. Officers took on board comments from those present and said they would feedback these issues to Lambeth Council. Some concern was expressed about the loss of existing park space and whether this would improve pedestrian access.
