	The Friends of Brockwell Park submitted an alternative plan, but we understand that Lambeth officers have assessed that this alternative would be less safe for users of the junction then the scheme which has received planning approval and has been worked up over recent months. Design work on this approved scheme is almost complete and we hope for a sign off and financial allocation by Transport for London shortly.

## College Ward population

## At the time of the 2001 census:

- 15% were Black African or Black Caribbean (24% for the borough)
- 64% were White British (52% for the borough)
- 76% of people were born in Britain (70% for the borough); 5% in other EU countries (3% for the borough); 18.5% were born outside the EU (25% for the borough)
- 21 % were aged under 18 (22% for the borough); 18% were over

Every year Southwark Council implements a wide range of capital improvements to the local environment. These projects have different origins (many directly from local people), different funding sources and sometimes are delivered by different teams of people.

This quarter's update for Dulwich Community Council concentrates on College ward and attempts to show all capital improvements to the public realm (mainly streets and parks) within the ward.

The report contains an overview of all projects which are currently on site, being developed, planned or proposed. It does not generally show completed projects.

Responsibility for the delivery of most of these projects lies with the Public Realm Projects team, within the Council's Environment & Housing Department. Other projects, as well as key policy documents, strategies and funding bids, are developed by the Regeneration and Neighbourhoods Department. Contact details for key staff are found on the last page.

Projects are grouped by each main programme funding source. In a few cases projects may appear more than once if they have multiple funding sources.

## Transport for London-funded projects – current and planned

Many transport projects in Southwark are funded by Transport for London (TfL) via their 'Local Implementation Plan' (LIP). Funding bids for the LIP are prepared by the Transport Planning and Policy team in the Regeneration and Neighbourhoods Department. Once the outcome of the annual bids is known most of the approved capital projects are passed to the Public Realm Division to implement. ## **Section 106-funded projects**

When significant planning applications are approved, developers are usually obliged to enter into a 'Section 106' agreement which commits them to implementing (or paying for) improvements to the local area, in part to offset the impact of the development. This is sometimes referred to as 'planning gain'. However within Southwark the vast majority of new construction is taking place in the north of the borough, and S106 funding can generally only be used in the immediate proximity of the development. There are only four small sites in Dulwich that have S106 funds available from them for capital public realm works.

## **RECOMMENDATION(S)**

1. It is recommended that the local parking schemes detailed in the appendices to this report are approved for implementation subject to the outcome of any necessary statutory procedures.

## **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

- 2. This report presents proposals for a number of local parking amendment schemes, which are matters reserved to Community Council for decision.
- 3. The origins and reasons for the proposals are discussed in the main body of the report.

## **KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION**

## Gilkes Crescent (0809Q3064)

- 4. The network development team received an enquiry in November 2008 from a resident in regard to obstructive parking, on the public highway, adjacent to an emergency fire access gate.
- 5. Network development officers made an inspection and noted that parking was occurring close to the gate preventing access for cyclists, despite road markings indicating vehicles to 'Keep Clear'.
- 6. To ensure access is kept clear at all times it proposed to install a short length of double yellow line on either side of the road in Gilkes Crescent, adjacent to the fire gate to assist cyclists, as shown in Appendix 1.

## **Croxted Road (0809Q3015)**

- 7. The network development team received a request in September 2008 from the London Borough of Lambeth to amend existing waiting restrictions in Croxted Road, which falls within the Herne Hill (HH) Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ).
- 8. London Borough of Lambeth will be extending the double yellow lines on Croxted Road on the Lambeth side, which extends from the junction of Norwood Road.
- 9. To assist Lambeth with their scheme in order to allow unimpeded bus flow it is proposed to extend a section of double yellow line as shown in appendix 2. This will change the existing waiting restriction from CPZ hours (noon 2pm, Mon-Fri)

to operate at any time.

### **POLICY IMPLICATIONS**

- 10. The recommendations contained within this report are consistent with the polices of the PEP and associated Local Implementation Plan (LIP)
- 11. The proposals will support the council's equalities and human rights policies and will promote social inclusion by:
  - providing improved access for emergency vehicles, refuge vehicles, residents and visitors:
  - improving sight lines for all road users; and
  - improving junction and pedestrian safety, especially those with limited mobility or visual impairment

### **COMMUNITY IMPACT STATEMENT**

12. The policies within the Parking and Enforcement Plan are upheld within this report have been subject to an Equality Impact Assessment (EqIA).

### **RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS**

13. All costs arising from implementing the proposals, as set out in the report, will be fully contained within the existing local parking amendment budget.

## **CONSULTATION**

- 14. No informal consultation has been carried out.
- 23. Should the community council approve the item, statutory consultation will take place as part of the making of the traffic management order. A proposal notice will be erected in proximity to the site location and a press notice will be published in the Southwark News and London Gazette. If there are objections a further report will be re-submitted to the community council for determination.
- 16. The road network and parking manager has been consulted on the proposals and has no objections.
- 17. No consultation or comment has been sought from the borough solicitor & secretary or the chief finance officer.
