Public questions raised	
Q1	<p>A woman asked about the smoking of cannabis near Peckham Pulse and why it was allowed by the Police ?</p> <p>Sergeant Mike Bruget said that cannabis had been downgraded by the government. However anyone who openly smoked drugs would be arrested. He added that Nigel had been given the responsibility of tackling this in the square.</p>
Q2	<p>Re the problems caused by drinkers around Peckham Pulse ?</p> <p>Sgt Bruget said that the Pulse was not a place where drinking was barred but if offences were committed they would be dealt with.</p>
Q3	<p>Patrick Yorke asked that residents be reminded of the monthly meetings of the North Sector Police with the people of Peckham ?</p> <p>Chair said these were a good place to ask questions and said if anyone left their details he would make sure they were given further information.</p>
Q4	<p>Roger said that a few meetings ago he had raised the problem of communications with the Police and that nothing had changed. He asked that someone be available to answer calls ?</p> <p>Sgt Bruget said that he appreciated the communications issue and that it had been raised with management. He added that if you call and there is no answer you should leave a message and an officer would contact you.</p>
Q5	<p>Re the problem of mopeds/off road vehicles causing anti-social behaviour.</p> <p>Sgt Bruget said that bikes had been seized. On some occasions parents were advised and reassurances were given that the problem would not happen again. If there was a second offence then there would be a prosecution. In this way they could effectively use the Road Traffic Act.</p>
Q6	<p>Errol asked that something be done about illegal sales of dvds, and cigarettes on Rye Lane ?</p> <p>Sgt Bruget that illegal dvds were a big problem and that the Police station were running out of storage space to put those seized. He added that the smuggling issue needed to be addressed and there was no quick solution.</p>
Q7	<p>Re the lengthy delay over the Peckham Pulse swimming pool.</p> <p>.Jo Rham said that the pool was eight months behind schedule because they</p>

	could not re-design until they knew what the problem was. He said there was a crack in the main supply pipe going into the pool which had in turn caused other cracks. Completion date was September 2006.
Q8	Patrick asked if there was insurance in place to cover the work needed on the pool ? Jo said that the loss of service and revenue would cost about £1.5 million and that had been allocated. He added that there was a logbook of evidence and that if contractors were liable they would go through the courts.
