Public ques	Public questions raised		
Q1	Tom White from the Southwark Pensioner Action group asked a question about the mental day care services/mental health emergency service and Felix post unit.		
A1	The response was that £6 mill. of capital spend has been allocated to Kings Coll. Hospital for mental care and some spent on A&E which will be implemented at various stages.  Cllr Holford agreed to speak to officers in health & social care and provide feedback at the Sept 07 meeting.		
Q2	<ul> <li>Mary Wallis submitted a soap box question concerning the public consultation undertaken recently on Underhill Road/ Melford Road road safety improvements –</li> <li>What is the Council's GIS database is and how it has been constructed?</li> <li>Since it does not contain all the addresses in the borough, how can it be deemed to be useful in seeking to gain the opinions of residents in cases of public consultation?</li> <li>Underhill Rd/Melford Rd public consultation – does the Council accept that the results of the consultation cannot be deemed to be representative when a majority of the properties in the immediate surroundings of the junction were effectively disenfranchised since they did not receive the consultation documents. (The Appendix to the report indicates that of the three properties on each side of the two roads forming the junction (i.e. 24 in all) only 5 received the consultation materials – 3 of which are made of rented flats with a relatively transient population)</li> <li>Not all properties received the letter sent recently informing residents that work would be starting following consultation?</li> <li>Summary of the public consultation on this issue was not available for the public to see on the Council website.</li> <li>Has a written response been received following a meeting which took place between interested parties concerning the routing of the P13 bus</li> </ul>		
A2	The Chair said the above questions would be sent to officers to respond

Q3	Vic Bisikor (Sydenham Hill residents) mentioned Woodvale were promised £20k for improvements – a decision made by TfL which he feels has little accountability if bids for schemes are made on behalf of the Council.
А3	Follow up response to be provided by officers in traffic & transport.
Q4	Charlie Smith said DCC took a decision sometime ago about community council signs located around the borough. As a result of a local protest the signs were then taken down – who was responsible for this?
A4	Reply from Cllr Eckerlsey: was to write to the executive member for Regeneration (Cllr Thomas) in order to get a response.
Q5	A resident spoke about a public question raised at 4 June 07 DCC meeting concerning parking spaces on the junctions of Frogley Rd, Archdale Rd & Crawthew Grove were removed by further white lines being painted to accommodate drop downs. The suggestion was that double yellow lines should be placed at each junction.
A5	Cllr Jonathan Mitchell (East Dulwich ward member) agreed to speak to Cllr Barber about this and report back on progress.

## 8. Deputations and petitions

#### **Herne Hill Traders – deputation**

DCC heard the deputation from representatives of Herne Hill Traders who felt that Norwood Rd has suffered as a result of neglect because they fallen in the gap between Lambeth and Southwark. The deputation expressed concerns about on going drug dealing, street fighting, illegal trading (btw 3am to 5am) and constant intimidation of local traders.

The deputation urges the Council and Police to further invest in CCTV, more enforcement action on anti social behaviour, provide solar power/low energy lights to make it environmental sustainable for the area and ensure refuse is emptied on a regular basis.

### In response to questions to the deputation:

The deputation would like to see more police presence (long term) and for the Council and Police got together to alleviate the problems in the area.

Cllr Crookshank Hilton explained she had been in contact with the neighbouring Lambeth ward Cllr about these issues.

Inspector Parrott said that there is a similar situation at Crystal Palace and advised that Southwark Police met with the Croydon Borough Commander recently about the above. He would endeavour to arrange liaison meetings between the 3 SNT teams operating in Herne Hill.

### 9. Police update/community safety issues

Sgt Parrott (SNT for Dulwich & Camberwell) was present to confirm that sergeants from the three wards would give an overview of what is happening in their wards.

Sgt Colin Edge (SNT, College) advised that ward panel meetings are set every six weeks. He urged those interested in being a ward panel member should leave their contact details with officers. They would like the panels to represent people from diverse backgrounds e.g. age, ethnicity and religion and so forth.

Sgt Edge reported on priorities for College ward:

- Bellwood Estate, Sydenham Hill animals escaping and biting people and causing a nuisance. 40 calls logged in two months now being reduced to five.
- School dispersal comm. safety officers disperse to move children on after school hours to avoid anti social behaviour. Sgt spoke to Head at Kingsdale School dispersal of pupils.
- Tackling antisocial behaviour Glazebrook Estate.

Sqt Jenkinson (SNT, Village) reported on ward priorities:

- Late evening anti robbery patrols
- School patrols during term time
- Youth diversion diary for school holidays
- Dulwich park e.g. bicycle theft, anti social behaviour, robbery and missing persons

Sgt Jackson (SNT, East Dulwich) reported on ward priorities:

- Burglaries there has been a marked increase and more patrols were undertaken during the month of June. He confirmed two suspects had been arrested.
- Vehicle crime marked increase
- Anti social cycling with scooters. Two PCSOs on bikes to deal with the problem

#### ACTION:

Agreed that each SNT representative would have eight minutes allocated for future police/community safer updates.

- Area resources
- Arts & culture
- Community safety
- Youth

but Youth should be extended to cover 10 to 19 year olds.
