<b>Apologies received</b>	Cllrs, Barber and Robinson submitted their apologies for lateness.  An apology for absence was received from Cllr Michelle Holford.
<b>Urgent items</b>	There were no urgent items.
<b>Members' interests and dispensations</b>	Cllr Jonathan Mitchell declared a personal and non prejudicial interest in respect of the deputation request item – as a school governor of Harris Girls School.  Cllr Nick Vineall declared a personal and non prejudicial interest regarding the same item as he sat on the steering group for Harris Girls School and agreed to stand down as chair for this item.

Public questions raised	
<b>Q1</b>	Resident from Upland Rd: I am disappointed that the board was against the idea of forming a joint forum. The only consultation has been with the architects, not Harris, not the Council. We need the support of the Councillors of the community to ensure that Harris/Southwark do not rail road through a scheme that will not work.
<b>A1</b>	DCC suggested that this be re-addressed at a future meeting.
<b>Q2</b>	Has the Council decided that the proposed Harris boys school in Peckham Rye should accommodate 950 pupils. And if not, who has decided it? Who should we talk to?
<b>A2</b>	Cllr Eckersley agreed to find out more information about who made the decision regarding the proposed number of pupils for Harris Academy.
