<b>Absent</b>	Cllr James Barber
<b>Apologies received</b>	An apology for absence was submitted on behalf of Cllr James Barber.  Cllr Richard Thomas gave his apologies for lateness.
<b>Urgent items</b>	The chair agreed to accept as late and urgent an additional traffic report (Goodrich Rd) which was considered under item 12. – Members' decisions.
<b>Members' interests and dispensations</b>	None were declared.

<b>Public questions raised</b>	
<b>Q1</b>	Charlie Smith asked if DCC could give an update on the planning application for Café Nero on Lordship Lane.
<b>A1</b>	Response from Cllr Vineall: This matter was discussed in closed session at DCC planning on 6 Sept 07. Café Nero applied to the Council to change its use; the council refused to grant permission and served an enforcement notice against the premises for changing its use without permission. Café Nero are appealing against the enforcement and proceedings are currently pending and as such the Council are seeking external legal advice which East Dulwich ward Cllrs said they should contest with vigour.
<b>Q2</b>	Ron Halden congratulated the Council for the re-cycling information sent through the post to residents however there are items which are not yet recyclable in the area - e.g. hard cover folders, envelopes, batteries and household cutlery. The Council also need to provide more street bins and poop scoop bins.
<b>A2</b>	Response from Cllr Richard Thomas: We have made good progress over the last 5 years particularly as there no recycling facilities before then and 18% of waste is now recycled. The plan is to have a new recycling centre on the Old Kent Rd which will help dispose of batteries and food waste.
<b>Q3</b>	<p>Vic Bisikor (Sydenham Hill Estate TRA) referred to previous public question raised at the July 07. Following the meeting Vic Bisikor provided the following information:</p> <p>At the Dulwich Community Council meeting of the 10 Sept in answer to my question with regards to allocation of 20,000 pounds for a study of traffic to be carried out in the Underhill Road area (including Melford Road, Wood Vale and London Road/Lordship Lane no left turn), it was stated that there was no evidence of that commitment.</p> <p>In response, I stated that I had documentary evidence confirming that my request is valid.</p> <p>An email sent to me on 10 March 2004 by Cllr Humphreys, (and copied to Trevor Wilding, Southwark's (then) head of transport) which reads as follows:</p> <p><i>"I thought you would be interested to know that £20,000 has been allocated from TfL, to spend in this financial year to allow further studies of traffic to be carried out in the Underhill Road area (including Melford Road, Wood Vale, and London Road/Lordship Lane no left turn). This information will then be used to</i></p>

	<i>assist the Council's funding submission to TfL in June 2004 which hopefully can provide a long term solution to this problem. "</i>
<b>A3</b>	Officers to provide follow up at the next meeting
<b>Q4</b>	Steven Smith said he received no response to the questions raised in the June/July DCC meetings concerning the double yellow lines on the drop down. Also, mentioned grass frontage by the Bishop PH, Lordship Lane.
<b>A4</b>	Cllr Vineall said he would discuss matter with the officers in planning.  Cllr Mitchell provided response under matters arising and further added the roads - Frogley Rd, Archdale Rd & Crawthrew Grove could still take up 14 car parking spaces and people need access up and down the kerb.
<b>Q5</b>	A resident mentioned scaffolding along the pavement around North Cross Rd.
	Agreed to speak to ward councillor, Cllr Richard Thomas.

<p>7.</p>	<p><b>Matters arising from previous meeting</b></p> <p><b>10 July 2007 - public questions:</b></p> <p><b>Question 1 on page 7</b>  Cllr Holford reported that the Maudsley Emergency Clinic currently remains open, but predominantly as a sign-posting facility. The final decision on its closure will be made by the PCT board at its meeting in November 2007.</p> <p>The £6m capital spend allocated to improve the A&amp;E facilities at Kings is in pre-consultation phase. Full consultation is envisaged in the New Year.</p> <p><b>Decision:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. It was agreed that efforts be focussed on opening a dialogue with the PCTs (Southwark &amp; Lambeth) to prevent it's closure rather than to continue to press the Secretary of State for Health as the focus of decision-making had now changed (this follows a motion passed at full council on September 13 2006).</li> <li>2. In addition, it was reported that conditions in accident &amp; emergency (A&amp;E) had not improved for patients with mental health issues (i.e. no increased privacy, no male/female separation for treatment etc). Cllr Holford agreed to raise these points with Rod Caig, chair of the Crisis Implementation committee which is responsible for implementing such changes.</li> </ol> <p><b>Question 2 on page 7</b>  A response to Mary Wallis's soapbox question is to be attached to the minutes agreement form for this meeting.</p> <p><b>Question 3 on page 8</b>  Chair's Report back from Officers confirmed that there was no record of £20k being allocated to Woodvale for improvements. Further information is being sought from the Council's design team and for Vic Bisiker to discuss with Cllr Humphreys.</p> <p><b>Question 4 on page 8</b>  Charlie Smith agreed to write formally to the executive member for regeneration (Cllr Richard Thomas) to get a response about the community council signs.</p>	<p>Cllr Holford</p> <p>Beverley Olamijulo</p> <p>Head of transport planning</p>
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	<p><b>Question 5 on page 8</b>  Cllr Mitchell confirmed there could be proposals to install double yellow lines at Frogley Rd, Archdale Rd &amp; Crawthorpe Grove but in the interim the drop down kerbs will remain in place.</p>	
<p>9.</p>	<p><b>Police update/community safety issues</b>  Sgt Colin Edge (SNT, College) reported on ward priorities and announced the next ward panel meeting - 24 Sept 07 at East Dulwich Police Station.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• More foot patrols at Kingswood and Glazebrook Estates</li> <li>• School dispersal: internet bus placed at Kingsdale Sch. for 10 weeks was a success.</li> <li>• Beltwood Estate – noise nuisance and animals escaping. The person in question has been banned from keeping animals.</li> </ul> <p>During questions College ward Members agreed to pass on details to police about criminal activity and anti social behaviour at Gipsy Hill Station &amp; Gipsy Hill Estate. In addition problems with traffic congestion and people encountering difficulties going through Sydenham Estate when the Horniman Museum hold their events.</p> <p>Sgt Edge agreed to liaise with SNT in Gipsy Hill and British Transport Police to address these specific problems.</p> <p>Sgt Jenkinson (SNT, Village) reported on ward priorities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Herne Hill Triangle – anti social behaviour late at night – tackling street robberies and under age drinking</li> <li>• More patrols on Saturdays (evening &amp; at night)</li> <li>• Robbery &amp; anti social behaviour in Dulwich Park</li> <li>• Encourage through local youth club to attend ward panel meetings</li> <li>• Lytcott Estate – problems with graffiti, police trying to identify individuals that do the graffiti.</li> </ul>	

<p>9.</p>	<p>It was noted that the Village ward SNT meeting had been well attended.</p> <p>During questions, Sgt Jenkinson confirmed Herne Hill SNT (Lambeth side) had been contacted about identifying shops that sell alcohol to under age drinkers – further action is being taken on this issue which could not be disclosed at this stage.</p> <p>Sgt Jackson (SNT East Dulwich) - ward priorities over the summer were:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Anti social behaviour – mopeds and scooters</li> <li>• Youth priority</li> <li>• Automatic number plate check for anti social driving</li> <li>• Working closely with antisocial behaviour unit and Council</li> <li>• Working closely with young people &amp; local agencies</li> </ul> <p>The last East Dulwich SNT ward meeting had only 3 attendees.</p>	
<p>11.</p>	<p><b>Cleaner greener safer programme 2007/08</b></p> <p>DCC received around seventy four applications and a budget of £370,00 would be divided amongst the three wards.</p> <p>Representatives from the various projects addressed the meeting.</p> <p><b>DECISION:</b> DCC agreed successful applicants would be announced at the DCC meeting on 15 October 2007.</p>	<p>DCC Cllrs</p>
