Members' interests and dispensations	Cllr Kim Humphreys declared a non personal prejudicial interest in respect of item 13, Pickwick Road/Dulwich Village traffic report. Cllr Jonathan Mitchell declared a personal prejudicial interest in respect of the same item because he lives in Pickwick Rd and withdrew from the meeting when the item was considered.

Public questions raised	
Q1	John Payne from Crystal Palace CA said large developments plans which are yards from each other will change and impact the area. He suggested that DCC should look more closely at addressing cross border issues.
A1	The chair said they would consider cross boundary issues at future DCC meetings.
Q2	<p>Marilyn Roy from Red Post Hill residents committee: Following the special meeting on 19 Nov 07 concerning North Dulwich Bridge, Red Post Hill, Dulwich Hamlet School have still not yet been consulted and the Council's planning section have not notified residents. She is hoping to put together a petition.</p> <p>Also, When is the planning application going to committee – main planning or DCC planning?</p>
A2	<p>Responses from Cllrs:</p> <p>Planning application is subject to the 3 week consultation period. Consideration needs to be given to the weight restrictions and traffic management study etc.</p> <p>In addition,</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) There will a meeting on 9 Jan 2008 with officers, residents of Red Post Hill and the Dulwich Society to discuss this issue further. 2) Agreed that this will be an agenda item for the next meeting on 28 Jan 2008 to discuss the design aspects and parapet of the bridge. 3) That officers (in planning) as part of the consultation process write formally to the relevant schools in the area - Dulwich Hamlet School about the bridge's planning application.

The draft residential design standards SPD which sets out what standard of design is expected from residential development like: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Floor space for minimum size houses • Quality of storage space, size of gardens or roof terrace etc. • New homes built to be bought up to expected standard 2. Formal consultation on the draft SPD is due at the end of December but the proposal is to extend the deadline until Jan 2008.

Sgt Jenkinson reported on priorities for the month of November 07.

- Responding to nuisance calls about fireworks going off indiscriminately
- Street robbery, youth engagement
- More patrols in Dulwich park after school closures
- Tackling anti social behaviour in Lytcott Estate

During questions, Cllr Eckersley raised the issue of the spider frame equipment installed at Lytcott Grove play area (£15K CGS allocation) which was vandalised by youths.

The police were fully aware of the situation and are currently investigating the matter. They agreed to keep local Cllrs informed on any further developments.

The area housing manager was present to explain that they were also investigating. If there is sufficient evidence then criminal prosecution could be served and tenancy arrangements restricted.
