Herne Hill CPZ

The review of Herne Hill CPZ was discussed at length at the meeting. Officers explained that there was a need for traffic calming measures in the area due to the problems of traffic generation in the area. Due to its proposed extension in notably Burbage Road, Carver Road and Ruskin Walk North, residents voiced their concerns. These were regarding the proposed extension in Burbage Road and that Carver Road should be restricted to residents parking bays only. Ruskin Walk residents highlighted the issue of changes in the parking enforcement plan and said this would have serious parking implications for the area.



It was suggested that CPZ proposals in Half Moon Lane would be re-visited in 2007 along with North Dulwich Station. That the parking situation in Burbage Road could be reviewed after the end of the six-month experimental period particuarly if there is further public interest. Suggestions were also made about changing the position of the controlled parking bays on the north west part of Red Post Hill. In addition that sympathetic consideration be given to issues raised at the meeting on behalf of Herne Hill School.

Deputation from the residents of Stradella Road and Springfield Residents Association

Residents concerned with traffic speeds in Winterbrook, Stradella and Burbage Road, called for speed humps (across the width of the road) to be installed. They believe this will ensure that motorists pay more attention to the existing 20mph zone.

The deputation presented a petition to the meeting signed by 140 residents in the area who were in favour of the installation of full width speed humps as they were concerned that vehicles, particularly large vehicles, were regularly reaching speeds of 40mph. 75% of the Stradella Road and Springfield residents association were in favour of this course of action with the rest preferring to see the speed limits enforced.

Members were concerned that their did not appear to be consistency in when full width speed humps verse bumps were installed and requested that the Executive Member for Environment report back on the criteria used to install full width speed humps and to investigate the most up to date research into effective traffic calming.

Statement of Community Involvement - Planning

Community involvement is central to the new planning system and a 'statement of community involvement' (SCI) is required to show how and when the council will involve the community in planning applications and policy development. By commenting on the SCI you will help ensure that planning consultation effectively reaches the community. An early draft of the Statement was brought to the Community Council back in September and final consultation closes shortly.
