

Canada Water master plan – Rotherhithe Library

David Taylor from environment & leisure provided an update on the Canada Water masterplan. He explained that a public consultation with private owners and tenants recently took place and that details were also presented



at the Canada Water forum. Key changes to sites A and B concerning planning consent will be submitted to the council in September 2006. Residents were also invited to put forward their suggestions for how they would like the Rotherhithe Library to look and came up with some excellent ideas. Younger residents were keen to see a 'chill out' area for young people, PCs, computer games and for the library to offer activities such as music and drama. Parents requested facilities such as a pushchair lobby for prams and child height toilets. Other suggestions included good access for the disabled and books in large print; a café; and that the library is open seven days a week to take into account those that work. The library will have community meeting rooms and story telling sessions for young children

Police update

Local Met police officers from Surrey Docks ward provided the meeting with feedback on the last community steering group meeting held at Rotherhithe Police Station.

Met officers work very closely with the police community support officers and community wardens to tackle crime in local areas. For example, school age robberies have been a major concern in the area and the suspects were recently caught with the help of the safer neighbourhood office. The Rotherhithe officer also let residents know that there has been a split of the old wards, north – Bermondsey East and Rotherhithe New Road and explained how this might affect them.
