RECOMMENDATION(S)

- 1 That the Sub-Committee note the experience of other Boroughs in co-opting members to scrutiny.
- That the Sub-Committee note the organisations listed in Appendix 2, which could provide possible candidates for co-opted members.
- That the Sub-Committee give further consideration to identifying scrutiny reviews and investigations on the work programme attached at Appendix 3, which could benefit from additional input from co-opted members/expert advisors.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Sub-Committee considered the item on Co-opted Members and Scrutiny at its meeting held on 4th December 2002, and requested further information on the kinds of organisations which might be best placed to provided co-opted members to the Sub-Committee and the experience of other Boroughs in co-opting members.

KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION

- Two methods have been identified for appointing co-opted members to scrutiny committees from research into the means of other London Boroughs:
 - (a) By placing advertisements, conducting interviews and making appointments for permanent co-opted members to scrutiny.
 - (b) By identifying specialist experience and/or knowledge required at the beginning of a time-limited scrutiny review, then canvassing targeted individuals and groups for co-option for the period of the specific review.
- At Richmond, permanent non-voting co-opted members have been appointed to all four of its scrutiny committees. Eight Councillors sit on each scrutiny committee, and up to six co-opted member places are available on each Scrutiny Committee. For example, on Social Care and Housing Scrutiny Committee at Richmond, people drawn from voluntary sector organisations and one other from the local business sector have filled all 6 co-opted member places on this scrutiny committee. The method for appointing co-opted members to scrutiny committees was by advertising borough-wide via local press and on the Council's website and inviting applicants to submit CVs and covering letters. The Scrutiny Committees set up recruitment panels of councillors to decide on a shortlist of applicants, conduct interviews and recommend appointments to the overseeing scrutiny committee, which takes the decision to appoint co-opted members. Richmond has been operating this system of scrutiny with co-opted members since May 2000.

- In contrast to Richmond, both Newham and Camden operate with an Overview and Scrutiny Committee deciding on a scrutiny work programme and appointing time-limited commissions/panels to undertake the work. The decision to appoint co-opted members to individual scrutiny reviews is taken at the initial meeting of the scrutiny commission/panel, where Councillors suggest individuals and/or organisations to approach, and co-opted members are selected on that basis.
- Appendix 2 to this report provides contact details of local organisations listed according to the following categories: Community Safety, Hate Crimes and Youth Projects, which could provide possible candidates for co-opted members to the Sub-Committee.

LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

- 9 Under the Local Government Act 2000, Scrutiny Committees or Sub-Committees whose functions relate wholly or partly to education functions which are the responsibility of the Executive, must contain at least one representative of the Diocesan Board of Education, and at least one representative nominated by the Bishop of any Roman Catholic diocese which falls within the Council's area. The representatives are entitled to vote on any question which relates to any education functions which are the responsibility of the Council's executive, and which fall to be decided at the meeting.
- 10 The Council is also required by the Parent Governor (England) Regulations 2001 to appoint between two and five representatives of parent governors, elected by their fellow governors in accordance with the regulations. The Council's constitution provides for the appointment of two such representatives.
- 11 The Act also prohibits the Council from granting voting rights to any other cooptees.
