- Mobile phones are involved in 28% of street robberies with under-18s being the most common victims.
- The recent Government initiative to develop a national mobile database allowing handsets to be cancelled and barred across all networks.
- 2. That Council resolves:
 - To work with the police, heads of local schools and other agencies to ensure that mobile phone users particularly the under 18's, are aware of recent developments and basic steps they can take to ensure mobile phone safety.
