## RECOMMENDATIONS

1. That, in light of the representations received as part of the consultation on the second draft of the Southwark Plan, the executive recommends to council assembly the adoption of the suggested changes in the pre-inquiry deposit Southwark Plan (as set out in appendices 1 and 2), and the following proposals being included within the plan:

- Appendix 1 to the report (Appendix 11 to the Plan) OS42 - Newington Gardens, extension to Borough Open Land (please refer to the map attached to this report);
- Appendix 1 to the report (Appendix 14 to the Plan) OS191 - Lamlash Street Allotments, addition of Other Open Space (please refer to the map attached to this report).

Note: This recommendation is not a general invitation to make changes to the plan as a whole, but merely an opportunity to consider those areas where officers are suggesting a change in the revised draft in the light of the consultation.

2. That the draft consultation plan for the pre-inquiry changes to the Southwark Plan (Appendix 5) be used as the basis for consultation purposes.
3. That officers be given the authority to make any necessary corrections to spelling, grammar and punctuation without changing the substantive content of the plan.

## BACKGROUND

4. At its meeting on 12 October 2004, the executive considered the report on pre-inquiry changes for deposit Southwark Plan 2004 (Unitary Development Plan). The recommendations of the executive are set out in paragraphs 1 – 3 above. The Southwark Plan 2004 is a matter reserved for decision to the council assembly as it forms part of the policy framework.
5. The officer report was circulated on the main agenda of the council assembly dispatched on October 8 2004. Due to their size, appendices 1, 2 and 5 are contained within a separate large document circulated with a covering letter dated October 7 2004 to all members.

## KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION

6. Members are invited to consider the recommendations of the executive. The key issues for consideration are set out in the officer report on the main agenda.

## REASONS FOR LATENESS

7. This report is late due to the close proximity of reporting to the executive on the October 12, which was after the agenda dispatch date for the council assembly agenda.

## REASONS FOR URGENCY

8. This report is urgent as it is imperative that the Southwark Plan meets the following deadlines:
- Adoption for consultation by council assembly on 20 October;
  - Consultation from 29 October to the 10 December;
  - Final modifications back to council in January;
  - Exchange of proofs of evidence for the public inquiry in February and March;
  - Public inquiry from April 12 for 8 weeks.
