RECOMMENDATION(S)

- 1. That the budget of £28,923,370 for 2003/2004, recommended by the London Boroughs Grants Committee be approved.
- 2. That the shortfall of £14,000 in the Council's contribution be met on a pro rata basis from other grant giving departments.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 3. The London Boroughs Grants Scheme was established following the abolition of the Greater London Council as a means of maintaining support to voluntary organisations providing London-wide services. Organisations supported by the scheme are required to provide services across at least two London boroughs in order to qualify for support.
- 4. Constituent Councils are required to contribute to any London Boroughs Grants Scheme expenditure that has been incurred with the approval of at least two-thirds of the constituent Councils. Contributions are, under Regulations 6(8) of the Levying Bodies (General) Regulations 1992, to be proportionate to constituent Councils' populations.
- 5. For 2003/2004, the apportionment is based on the OPCS mid-year estimates for 2001.
- 6. In accordance with the Grants to Voluntary Organisations Order 1992, which came into effect on November 1992, and remains in force, the required two-thirds of constituent Councils must agree the budget by 1 February 2003. If not, the overall level of expenditure will be deemed to be the same as that approved for 2002/2003 i.e. £28,974,340.
- 7. Southwark Council is required, under paragraph 7.5 of the Scheme to respond formally on the London Boroughs Grants Committee's recommended budget by no later than Friday, 17 January 2003.

KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION

8. At its meeting on 30 October 2003, the London Boroughs Grants Committee considered proposals for expenditure in 2003/2004 and resolved to recommend the following to constituent Councils, representing a 1.08% decrease (compared to the current year) in the overall level of borough contributions.

Made up of:

Grants 27,400,000

Administrative Expenditure 1,523,370

Income would comprise:

Borough contributions 27,573,370

Bank Interest and balances 1,350,000

Policy implications

9. For 2001/2002 financial year, the sum of £2,254,376 was awarded to 31 voluntary organisations based in Southwark to carry out various services/activities covering education, social, housing, community safety, civil liberty, employment, health, etc (see appendix A). The Council influences the pattern of LBGS support through its representation on the Committee as a constituent council. The borough's residents benefit form a wider range of organisations than those simply based within the borough. Those based in the borough also serve the populations of other London boroughs.

Resource implications

- 10. Southwark Council's contribution to the 2002/2003 budget was £902,190 (based on a population of 238,700). If the proposed budget is approved, the contribution in 2003/2004 will be £941,374 (based on a population of 245,400).
- 11. Compared with last year's figure, the shortfall in the Council's budget to fund its contribution in 2003/4, after inflation is applied, is £14,000. No provision has been made to meet this shortfall. Although the budget for the contribution is held within the Strategic Services Division, the Scheme supports activity across a wide range of Council service areas. Benefiting service areas should therefore contribute financially on a pro rata basis to these costs. It is therefore proposed that the £14,000 shortfall should be found from other grant giving services on a pro rata basis to the size of their grants programmes. Because of the late notification of the LBGS budget arrangements it has not been possible to consult on this proposal with relevant service areas. A commitment will therefore have to be made to meet any shortfall from the Social Inclusion Division's budget.
- 12. The cost falling to other grant giving departments based on a pro rata share would be as follows:

Consultation

13. The Council's contribution is based on decisions made by the London Boroughs Grants Committee. The Council is represented on the Committee. The Scheme requires two thirds of constituent Councils to support a budget. If this is not achieved then the budget will remain at last year's higher level with a correspondingly higher level of contribution from the Council.

SUPPLEMENTARY ADVICE FROM OTHER OFFICERS Chief Finance Officer

14. The Council's contribution in 2003/4 can be met from within the budget of the Social Inclusion Division. However the additional shortfall of £14,000 has not been provided for within this budget. The Chief Finance Officer has advised that this will have to be found from elsewhere within the Division's budget if it cannot be recharged to grant giving departments on a pro rata basis.
