## **RECOMMENDATION(S)**

That the Executive considers and responds to the Housing Scrutiny Sub-Committee's comments on the Private Sector Housing Renewal Policy as set out below

## **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

- 2 The Housing Scrutiny Sub-Committee had the opportunity to consider the draft policy at their meeting on 2<sup>nd</sup> July. Having considered the policy and its practical implications, the committee wishes to make the following comments:
  - a) that the Executive should address the issue of monitoring of standard of contractors' work and behaviour in respect of renewal works, and to address whether contractors might be held liable for the work and behaviour of their sub-contractors
  - b) whilst the Sub-Committee recognises that the Regulatory Reform Order requires the Council to publicise this policy, it asks the Council to be positively proactive in disseminating information to those to whom the Private Sector Renewal Scheme is targeted. Such action should include producing information in community languages [in particular Vietnamese], and talking to a range of relevant community groups about the scheme
  - c) that officers involved in providing advice to individuals about the scheme should be properly trained in giving financial advice
  - d) that officers should ensure that individuals signing up to the scheme are competent to do so, in order to avoid problems at such time as any loan is called-in
  - e) that the Executive consider the implications of the financial structure of such a scheme on the Muslim community, and take proper advice in respect of whether the scheme might be structured in such a way as to meet approval under Sharia Law and approval as an Islamic product
