Summary of SE London Housing Strategy

The South East London Housing Strategy (SELHS) covers the boroughs of Bexley, Bromley, Greenwich, Lewisham and Southwark, building on the individual boroughs' housing strategies. The SELHS provides a framework and action plan to meet the following strategic objectives across the sub-region:

- To increase the supply of housing and affordable housing and promote choice, ensuring that there are sufficient homes across all tenures to meet need in the sub region. This includes supported housing needs and housing needs of key workers.
- To ensure that all social rented housing is of a decent standard by 2010.
- To promote quality homes in the private sector by ensuring that housing for vulnerable tenants in this sector meets the decent home standard and is well managed.
- To create sustainable communities by using housing and regeneration resources.
- To reduce homelessness and seek alternatives for Bed & Breakfast accommodation for families.
- Tackle housing inequalities amongst the diverse population of South East London.

It is also intended that the strategy will

- complement each borough's housing strategies,
- develop better understanding of housing needs across the sub-region,
- inform the sub-regional approach within the Thames Gateway and the distribution of resources in the region as a whole under the London Housing Strategy
- influence resource distribution within the sub-region.

These objectives seek to address issues set out at national, regional and sub-regional level in "Quality and choice: a decent home for all. The way forward for housing," "Sustainable Communities: Building for the Future", the Supporting People initiative, the London Housing Strategy and the Thames Gateway Sub-regional Housing Strategy which is currently being developed.

Development of the Strategy

The strategy has been developed by the South East London Housing Group which consists of the following sub-groups with lead boroughs

Housing Director's Group - all Strategy Group – Greenwich Development group – Lewisham Nominations Group – Bexley Supporting People – Southwark Homelessness – Bromley Private Sector – Southwark NHS/Key Workers - Lewisham.

The strategy will be endorsed by each local authority and monitored by the strategy group.

Key steps in the future development of the sub-regional housing strategy include:

- Building on the consultation and partnership working already taking place across the boroughs
- Sharing information in order to gain greater understanding of the housing needs
 of the diverse communities across South East London. This is particularly
 relevant for numerically smaller black and minority ethnic groups and those with
 special housing needs
- Developing sub-regional partnering in relation to its approach to Housing Corporation investment and relationships with RSLs
- Developing a clear approach with the NHS and Lambeth to the development of key worker housing
- Developing closer working between S.E London boroughs and Lambeth to develop Supporting People schemes
- Developing best practice in the private sector.

Housing Needs and Delivering Objectives

The Strategy includes a socio-economic profile and housing needs analysis of the region which form the basis for strategic development.

Resourcing the Strategy

Resources for housing are allocated across the London sub-regions by the London Housing Board. Projected resources for South East London are:
