<p><b>Early Review of Community Wardens Scheme</b> [Work Programme]</p>	<p><b>COMPLETED: 04.12.02</b> Two meetings: 06.11.02 and 04.12.02, and site visit to Bermondsey Neighbourhood Warden Scheme and Peckham Street Warden Scheme 27.11.02</p>	<p>Report to Executive to be submitted in conjunction with Director's report recommending:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Executive endorses that the Council continue to press ODPM for environmental enforcement powers to be available to all Warden Schemes, but that such enforcement powers were they forthcoming, should be implemented after consultation with the Police and the local community in Southwark.</li> <li>• The Executive endorses the recruitment of Wardens from black and ethnic minority groups and women through extending the standard recruitment process.</li> <li>• The Executive continues to ensure that all Community Warden Schemes work towards fostering social inclusion and community development.</li> <li>• Warden Uniforms should clearly identify the particular area within Southwark where each of the Schemes operate as well as carrying the Southwark logo.</li> <li>• That each of the Warden Schemes should have a seconded Police Officer, as at Bermondsey.</li> </ul>

Included initial presentation and detailed briefing report from officers.</p>	<p>Recommendations to the Executive Member:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Consider feasibility of convening a conference of all agencies involved in dealing with graffiti to determine a better coordinated approach to dealing with graffiti</li> </ul>

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		<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Receive report back to the Sub-Committee on feasibility of the above by 7 January 2003</li><li>• A database be set up to collate information relating to graffiti tags and occurrences and that this be geographically coded.</li><li>• A voluntary code of conduct on the sale of spray paints, marker pens and other such graffiti related paraphernalia be drawn up, and sent with a letter to all retailers concerned asking them to sign up to the Code of Conduct. Liaise with the police for jointly promoting such a scheme.</li><li>• Liaise with the local media and through Southwark Life to publicise and support the recommendations above.</li><li>• Hold Graffiti seminar to encourage integrated approach to combating graffiti</li><li>• Engage community and media.</li></ul>
