Local consultation (Peckham programme, wardens, community)	Sternhall Lane, corner of footpath at the rear of 204 Rye Lane.	Corner attracts regular fly tips and is used as a toilet. Corner can also act as blind cover for muggers. Identified as one of Peckham's 'Top Ten Grot Spots'	Medium	Yes	20,000
		Abolish corner by boxing/fencing off and re-directing footpath, cutting off corner of unused carriageway.			

Local consultation (Peckham Programme, wardens, community)	Rye Passage	Improve lighting throughout. Look at possibilities of replacing some of the wooden fencing with secure metal fencing to improve visibility. With consent/co-operation of property owners, paint walls/fences etc in bright colours (may be murals painted by local school children?) to improve light and to make more attractive. Re-surface in coloured asphalt to improve appearance and tidy up areas particularly adjacent to housing association land/electricity substation access road (side of 47 Relf Road). Provide dog-waste bins and litter bins. Install dog fouling and litter warning notices.	Medium	Yes (although painted murals are not usually funded as a capital item)	12,000
