### Satisfaction with 'things to do, places' to go in Camberwell

#### MORI (06)

- A low proportion (28%) of CYP were satisfied that there was enough to do in Camberwell. This was third lowest satisfaction across all CC's.
- A low proportion of CYP (50%) considered that it was a good place to live – the lowest satisfaction across all CC's.
- A low proportion (13%) considered inadequate facilities stopped them doing more sport/ exercise.
- A relatively low proportion of CYP considered they have a say in decisions affecting the area .
- 39% of CYP had been a victim of bullying, theft or attack – average across all CC's.

#### Focus groups (07)

- Most common activities: Sport and physical activities; dance/ drama/ music; and hanging out with friends.
- Top three things young people would like to do: Adventure activities (i.e. as painting balling , go-karting, rock climbing); leisure activities (i.e. bowling, laser tag, ice skating); more sports./ physical activities (gym).
- Top three barriers to participating in activities: Cost; safety; territorial issues.
