

River of Life Centre, 12-38 Hatchem Road, London SE15 1TW

Police are in receipt of an application from the above for a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) to be granted for Saturday the 3rd December 2016 between 20.00hrs to 04.00hrs.

The premises are situated in a mainly industrial area, which are used for a variety of uses including churches, community halls, offices and manufacturing. Police have observed an increase in late night activities in the area and many of the units are now used for what police would deem as night club activity with pay parties, with loud music, dancing and alcohol consumption.

The area is not suited to this type of activity and the above premises have been a major contributing factor to an increase of complaints of anti social behaviour and crime and disorder in the area. This has culminated in a dispersal order being authorised by an inspector and a closure Notice was issued against the River of Life Authorised by a Superintendent closing the premises for 48 hours due to violence in the area and such events including GBH. The premises are also linked to a number of GBH assaults, if the premises were licensed the metropolitan Police would have reviewed the licence and asked the committee to revoke the licence.

I enclose a copy of a letter from Wellers law Group LLP who acted on behalf of the River of Life subsequent to the closer Notice. In paragraph 4 point 1. Their client will not agree to any event that involves alcohol or allow alcohol to be sold on the premises. Point 2 clearly agrees that no event shall go past 11pm.

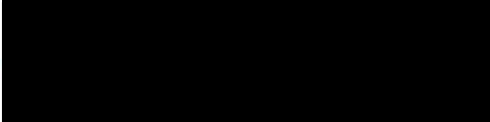
The area is blighted by parking issues; rubbish dumping and noise nuisance. I enclose a letter regarding planning issues that list the problems associated with the premises in the area and any late night is likely to have a negative impact on the wellbeing of those that live in the immediate vicinity. I enclose statements taken By PC Spedding from local residence detailing ongoing issues on the estate and the River of Life.

The Police object to the granting of the Notices on the grounds that any event involving large numbers of people drinking alcohol and playing music in the area will undermine the crime and disorder objective of the Licensing Act 2003 as previous events at the venue have resulted in serious violence.

We refer to our letter of 10 November 2015.

As we have stated, we consider that the criticisms levelled at our client by both Southwark Council and the police are misconceived and it is denied that the violent incidents alleged to have taken place have anything at all to do with our client.

We reiterate that our client is a respectable church and its venue is primarily utilised for activities directly related to the church. As an illustration we enclose a list of those events booked at our client's premises from 14 November 2015 to the end of December 2015. This illustrates the nature of the functions put on at our client's premises.

Our client has taken on board the concerns of the police and the local authority and has, consequently, decided to make two significant adjustments with immediate effect:-

1. With immediate effect our client will not allow alcohol sold on its premises. This means that our client will not agree to any event on its premises that involves, in any way, the sale of alcohol.
2. All events booked at our client's premises must end on or before 11pm.

We do hope that these changes to our client's procedures will reassure the council that steps have been taken to rectify whatever local complaints there have been.

Concerns over Serious Violence Associated with Late Night Parties and Events on the Manor Grove Estate

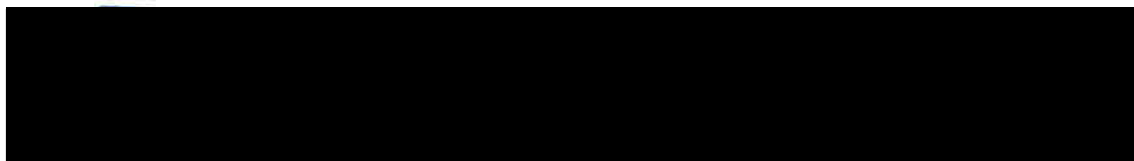
We are writing to you in the light of growing concerns over the escalating level of serious violence recently associated with late night parties and events being held within premises on the Manor Grove estate.

In recent weeks, several incidents have seen one victim suffer life-changing injury and others receive serious wounds.

This situation cannot be allowed to continue. The next incident could lead to loss of life. Such events are generally in contravention of licensing and/or planning law and alongside the serious violent incidents, they also give rise to local anti-social behaviour and disturbance to residents who are telling us they expect us to take action. The council and police, in partnership, reserve the right to take formal enforcement action against any operator staging any illegal party or event. We have no wish to impact upon the legitimate operations of your business, but it should be understood that these could be affected in the event of any full premises closure.

We will be in further contact with all operators on the estate in due course. In the meantime, we ask you to support us by declining to hire your premises out for any private party or event and refusing to take on bookings displaced from other local premises following their cancellation.

I have to inform you that the Metropolitan Police Service will be issuing a Closure Notice at the address, River of Life Pentecostal Church, 12-38 Hatcham Road, London SE15 1TW under Section 76 of the Anti Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014.

The Police are required under Section 76(6) of the Anti Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 to inform people who live or work on the premises (whether habitually or not) that a Closure notice will be issued.

Once a Closure Notice has been issued, a Court Hearing at a Magistrates Court will be heard within 48 hours of the notice being served. The date of the hearing will be on the Closure Notice.

The Closure Notice is issued by the Police when an Inspector or above is satisfied on reasonable grounds (a) that the use of particular premises has resulted, or (if the notice is not issued) is likely soon to result, in nuisance to members of the public, or (b) That there has been, or (if the notice is not issued) is likely soon to be, disorder near those premises associated with the use of those premises, and that the notice is necessary to prevent the nuisance or disorder from continuing, recurring or occurring.

Also on the Closure Notice will be the contact details of the Citizens Advice Bureau and of Southwark Council. The Closure Notice will also advise you that a Solicitor will be able to give you legal advice in regards to what happens when a Closure Notice is served and the Court Procedures that follow.

The effect of this Closure Notice is that:

accessing this Premises is hereby **PROHIBITED** for any persons other than those who habitually reside in the Premises or the owner of the Premises, or those specified below, for a period of up to **24/48 hours** starting at **10.30 hours**, on **18/09/2015** and ending at **10.30 hours**, on **20/09/2015** – subject to the following exceptions:

An application for a Closure Order will be made under Part 4, Chapter 3, section 80 of the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 for the closure of the Premises specified above.

To be heard at Camberwell Magistrates Court on 21/09/2015 at 10.00 hours, when evidence for the issue of a Closure Order will be considered.

A Closure Order under section 80 of the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014, would have the effect of closing the premises to all persons for a specified period (not exceeding three months).

A person who without reasonable excuse remains on or enters premises in contravention of a closure notice commits an offence under section 86 of the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014, liable on summary conviction to a maximum of three months' imprisonment and / or an unlimited fine.

A person who without reasonable excuse remains on or enters premises in contravention of a closure order commits an offence under section 86 of the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014, liable on summary conviction to imprisonment not exceeding 51 weeks and / or an unlimited fine.

Advice relating to this Notice and housing and legal matters generally can be obtained from any firm of solicitors or from the Citizens' Advice Bureau (Tel.). With this notice is a list of additional local service providers who may be able to assist with further advice.

Joint enforcement meetings held with council officers and police to formulate action plan. Regular patrols by N.T.E. over weekends to prevent ASB and violence. Local policing team have been doing directed patrols and reassurance visits.

events have thrown beer cans, bottles, food containers and food thrown on the flats + grass this is happening virtually every weekend.

If there was a fire there is no way HFB could get there to take down.

My sleep and my partners sleep is regularly disturbed every weekend, people are regularly going into the industrial units as well gates being opened, gates being slammed I don't know why they are going in there I have never had anybody from the Southwark Council come down to speak even though I know several of my neighbours are having the same issues.

I have not personally met the council as I believe they are a waste of time and are involved with the people who run these venues.

I am not willing to attend court but am willing for this statement to be read out and disclosed, I believe these events are held at ROVER OF LIFE + GILBERT DEVA CHURCHES.

This statement is a true and honest account of my experiences in relation to continuing anti-social behaviour at GILBERT DEYA RESTAURANT + ROOMS OF LIFE CENTRE, WATNUM ROAD, SE15.

The incidents of anti-social behaviour always occur on FRIDAY + SATURDAY nights and SUNDAY mornings. In my opinion it is getting worse round here at these events with more violence shootings, stabbings, fights, noise I have called the police in excess of twenty (24) times to complain about these venues.

I genuinely feel more concerned for my families safety and my own personal safety as these venues are getting worse.

I would be happy for the venues to close or just be used as churches, I have even had people knock on my door telling me their was going to be a party and to not ring the police.

If these premises were to close my and my families life would be better as we would not have to deal with these anti-social issues, I am happy for this statement to be used in court. I wish to remain anonymous in making this statement as I am concerned for any possible repercussions. out, also there is increased sign of rabbits around the area with the amount of waste food left after the events, we see people getting drinks from kettle drums in the early hours of the morning, we also see empty cans of beer and empty glass bottles left lying on the street and by our house after the events.

I know that these events are held at the name of LIFE as I have gone out on numerous occasions at Sam when my sleep has been disturbed and seen the people coming from the venue often seem to be heavily intoxicated shouting, urinating on their feet they even get in their cars and driving away.

Lots of my neighbours are having the same problems, the police have been called down to the venue on lots of previous occasions as well as the council noise team I have personally called them about the noise problems the last time was approximately four (4) months ago.

In the time I have lived here in just over the past fifteen (15) months the situation has got worse with the noise, violence, litter, drunken anti-social behaviour that I feel very worried for my own personal safety and the safety for my family as this venue is becoming worse for bad behaviour from the people attending the venue.

It would be beneficial if this facility was closed down it would improve the quality of my and my families life, and I am happy for this statement to be used in court.



On Tuesday 4th August 2015 at 19:00 I attended a public meeting at the TRA Hall Tustin Estate, Old Kent Road, SE15.

The meeting was organised to discuss the issues around the ongoing ASB issues from within the Manor Grove estate and in particular the problems associated with the use of Church premises for rave type events.

It was clear that there was a lot of anger and bad feeling from within the local community, the local residents were particularly critical of the premises that operate within Hatcham Road in particular a premises known as the River Of Life.

One resident that lives in very close proximity of the River Of Life, gave verbal evidence of incidents where she and her family have been subjected to threats of violence from the organisers of club nights at this venue if they continue to call the authorities.

During this meeting a male who identified himself as Pastor Felix voiced his concerns that the issues in the area were caused by the presence of late night BBQs which operated outside of his premises following late night events.


It was quickly pointed out to Pastor Felix in very strong words that the fact that his premises was operating late into the night was the sole reason for the presence of the BBQs.

He maintained it was an issue outside of his premises and not associated with his venue.

After the meeting had finished I was approached by Pastor Felix who again tried to plead his innocence in this matter and that the issue was with the BBQs and not his premises.

It was clear that Pastor Felix was not making the connection that the late operation of his premises for night club type events was the reason these BBQs were in the area.

It became apparent that he was maintaining this stance and distancing himself from any responsibility in relation to the ASB issues in the area.


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

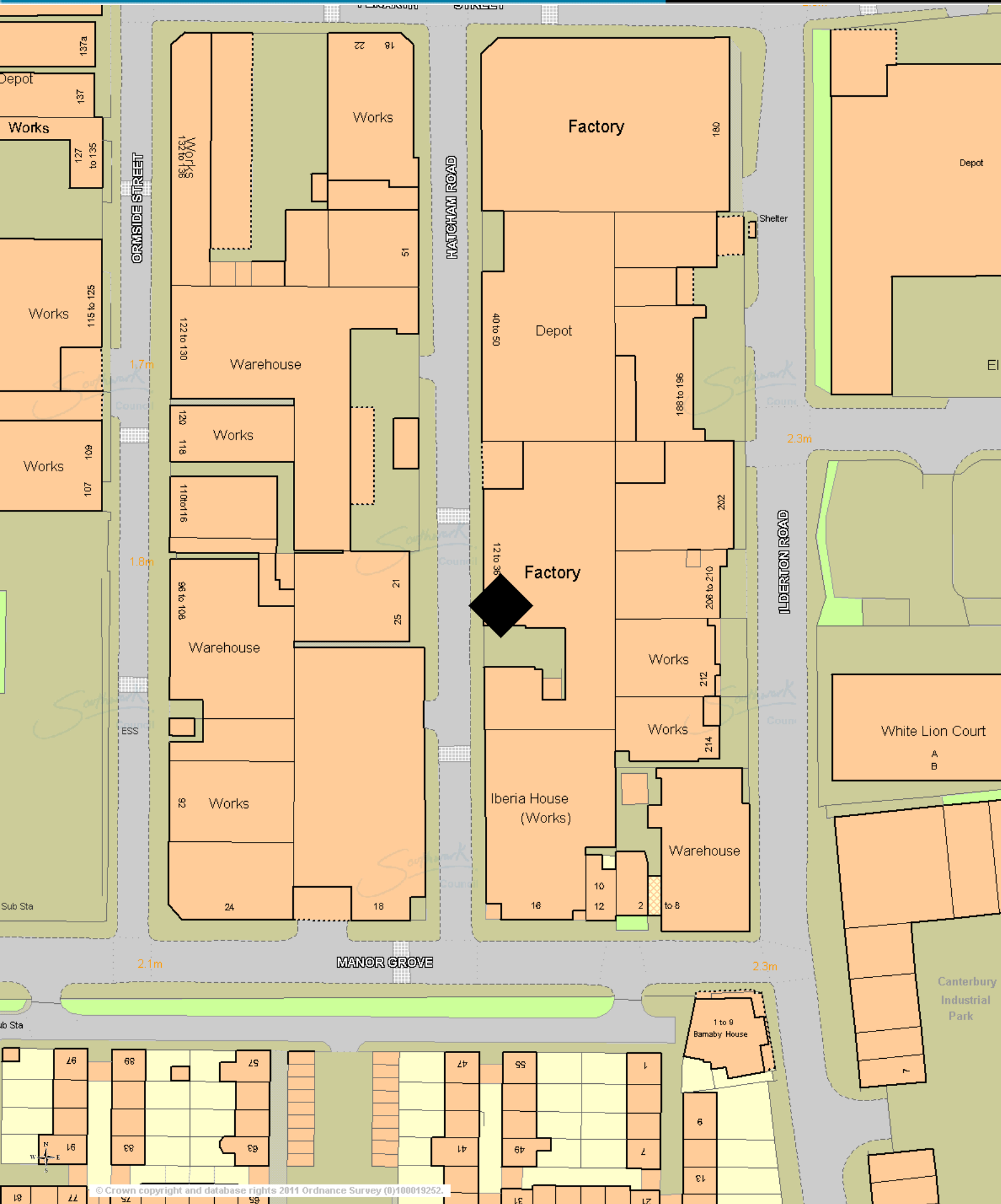
