- 1. This supplementary paper sets out the delivery route for each scheme. As noted in paragraph 10 of the main report the council's new homes programme predominately adopts a direct delivery model whereby the council procures and appoints professional services and main contractors to build out schemes on council-owned land.
- Some schemes are being delivered by development agreement, an additional column has been added to the table below to clarify which of the schemes listed would be considered a development agreement (DA) or direct delivery (DD).
- 3. S106 monetary contributions for affordable housing are applied across the programme where additional council homes are being delivered and subject to eligibility as per the individual s106 conditions.
- 4. Development agreements typically involve a developer partner procuring the construction works on behalf of the council for all or part of a site; typically, the council has a land interest as part of the arrangement and may have funded part of the development during the construction phase. Development partners may offer the council the option to acquire additional affordable units towards the end of construction (these would not be eligible for s106 funding). Those schemes with development partnership arrangements in place are indicated by DA below.
- 5. The majority of schemes are council-led, that is direct delivery and are indicated in the table below as DD. For simplicity, we have extended this definition to include Leathermarket who were funded by the council to deliver new council homes.
