#### **RECOMMENDATION**

1. That the Licensing Sub-Committee considers an application made by Changez Rasaq and Shafiq Rasaq for a Premises Licence to be granted under the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of the premises known as Local Express, Unit 2, 202-206 Union Street, SE1 0LH.

#### Notes:

- a) This application forms a new application for a Premises Licence, under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003. The application is subject to representations from interested parties and a responsible authority and is therefore referred to the Sub-Committee for determination;
- b) Paragraphs 7 to 9 of this report provide a summary of the application the Premises Licence under consideration by the Sub-Committee (A copy of the full application is provided at Appendix A).
- c) Paragraphs 11 to 14 of this report deal with the representations received to the Premises Licence application. (Copies of the relevant representations are attached at Appendix B through to E).

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

#### The Licensing Act 2003

- 2. The Licensing Act 2003 received Royal Assent on 10 July 2003. The Act provides a new licensing regime for
  - a) The sale of and supply of alcohol
  - b) The provision of regulated entertainment
  - c) The provision of late night refreshment

Within Southwark, this Council wholly administers the licensing responsibility.

- 3. The Act requires the licensing authority to carry out its functions under the Act with a view to promoting the four stated licensing objectives. These are
  - a) The prevention of crime and disorder;
  - b) The promotion of public safety
  - c) The prevention of nuisance; and
  - d) The protection of children from harm.

- 4. In carrying out its licensing functions, a licensing authority must also have regard to
  - a. The Act itself;
  - b. The Guidance to the act issued under Section 182 of the Act;
  - c. Secondary regulations issued under the Act;
  - d. The Licensing Authority's own Statement of Licensing Policy
  - e. The application, including the operating schedule submitted as part of the application
  - f. Relevant representations
- 5. The Act established a transitional period between 7 February 2005 and 6 August 2005 under which holders of existing Justices Licenses, Public Entertainment Licenses and Night Café Licenses were able to apply to the local licensing authority for "grandfather rights" conversion of those existing licenses into the relevant licenses under the new system. Licenses that were so converted were converted on existing terms, conditions and restrictions. The 6 August date having passed, operators must now apply for new licenses.
- 6. The premises licence application process involves the provision of all relevant information required under the Act to the licensing authority with copies provided by the applicant to the relevant responsible bodies under the Act. The application must also be advertised at the premises and in the local press. The responsible authorities and other interested parties within the local community may make representations on any part of the application where relevant to the four licensing objectives.

#### MATTERS FOR CONSIDERATION

## **The Premises Licence Application**

- 7. On 31<sup>st</sup> March 2009, Changez Rasaq and Shafiq Rasaq applied to this Council for the grant of a new Premises Licence in respect of the premises known as Local Express, Unit 2, 202-206 Union Street, London SE1 0LH.
- 8. The application is summarized as follows
- The sale of alcohol off the premises from 00.00 to 00.00 each day of the week.
- Opening hours 24 hours each day of the week.
- 9. The Premises Licence application form provides the applicant operating schedule. Parts, M, O and P set out the proposed operating hours and operating controls in full, with reference to the four licensing objectives as stated in the Licensing Act 2003.

## **Designated Premises Supervisor**

10. The designated premises supervisor listed is Changez Rasaq who has obtained a personal licence from Brent Council.

#### **Representations from Interested Parties**

11. There are 24 representations lodged by local residents. Representations relate to the four licensing objectives - public nuisance, prevention of crime and disorder, ensuring public safety and protection of children from harm. (See Appendix B for copies of representations).

#### **Representations from Responsible Authorities**

- **12.** The Police made a representation. Concerns within this representation relate to crime and disorder and public nuisance. As the applicant has agreed to a number of conditions on the licence, the representation has now been withdrawn. The correspondence is attached as Appendix C.
- 13. The Fire Brigade made no representations against the application. The correspondence is attached as Appendix D.
- 14. The planning department has made a representation in respect of this application. A copy of the representation is attached as Appendix E.

## Letters of support for this application

15. There are no letters of support for this application.

#### **Planning**

16. The planning department has made a representation in respect of this application. A copy of the representation is attached as Appendix E.

#### **Disability Discrimination Act**

17. The Southwark Disablement Association has no comments regarding this application.

## Additional information on the past operating history of the premises.

18. The applicants submitted a previous premises licence application on 13<sup>th</sup> January 2009. There were representations from responsible authorities and interested parties and a conciliation meeting was arranged which failed to produce an agreement. A sub-committee hearing was arranged for 25<sup>th</sup> March 2009 at 10.00 am however it later transpired that the address given (Unit 2, 201-203 Union Street, London SE1) by the applicant did not exist as a result of this, the application was rejected and the hearing cancelled.

## **The Local Vicinity**

- 19. A map of the vicinity is attached at Appendix F. The premises are identified by a star at the centre of the map. For purposes of scale-only the circle on the map has a 100-metre radius. The following licensed premises are within the vicinity of the premises.

Licensable activities: late night refreshment, sale by retail of alcohol to be consumed on and off the premises

## **Southwark Council Statement of Licensing Policy**

- 20. Council Assembly approved the Southwark Statement of Licensing Policy on 8 December 2004. Sections of the Statement that are considered to be of particular relevance to this application are
  - g. Section 3 which sets out the purpose and scope of the policy and re-inforces the four licensing objectives
  - h. Section 5 which sets out the Council's approach with regard to the imposition of conditions including mandatory conditions to be attached to the licence
  - Section 6 details other relevant Council and Government policies, strategies, responsibilities and guidance, including the relevant Articles under the Human Rights Act 1998
  - j. Section 7 provides general guidance on dealing with crime and disorder and deals with licensing hours
  - k. Section 8 provides general guidance on ensuring public safety including safe capacities
  - I. Section 9 provides general guidance on the prevention of nuisance
  - m. Section 10 provides general guidance on the protection of children from harm.
- 21. The purpose of Southwark's Statement of Licensing Policy is to make clear to applicants what considerations will be taken into account when determining applications and should act as a guide to the Sub-Committee when considering the applications. However, the Sub-Committee must always consider each application on its own merits and allow exceptions to the normal policy where these are justified by the circumstances of the application.

## **RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS**

22. A fee of £190 has been paid by the applicant company in respect of this application being the statutory fee payable for premises within non-domestic rateable value Band B.

#### **CONSULTATIONS**

23. Consultation has been carried out on this application in accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. A public notice was placed in a local newspaper and a similar notice exhibited outside of the premises.

#### **EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES IMPLICATIONS**

24. Each application is required by law to be considered upon its own individual merits with all relevant matters taken into account.

#### CONCURRENT REPORT BY THE STRATEGIC DIRECTOR AND DEMOCRATIC SERVICES

- 25. The Sub-Committee is asked to determine the application for a Premises Licence under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 26. The principles which Sub-Committee members must apply are set out below.

#### Principles for making the determination

- 27. The general principle is that applications for Premises Licence applications must be granted unless relevant representations are received. This is subject to the proviso that the applicant has complied with regulations in advertising and submitting the application.
- 28. Relevant representations are those which
- Are about the likely effect of the granting of the application on the promotion of the licensing objectives
- Are made by an interested party or responsible authority
- Have not been withdrawn.
- Are not, in the opinion of the relevant licensing authority, frivolous or vexatious.
- 29. If relevant representations are received then the Sub-Committee must have regard to them, in determining whether it is necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives to
  - (a) to grant the licence subject to-
    - (i) The conditions mentioned in section 18 (2)(a) modified to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and
    - (ii) Any condition which must under section 19,20 or 21be included in the licence
  - (b) to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
  - (c) to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor;
  - (d) to reject the application.

#### **Conditions**

30. The Sub-Committee's discretion is thus limited. It can only modify the Conditions put forward by the applicant, or refuse the application, if it is necessary to do so. Conditions must be necessary and proportionate for the promotion of one of the four licensing objectives, and not for any other reason. Conditions must also be within the control of the licensee, and should be worded in a way which is clear, certain, consistent and enforceable.

- 31. The four licensing objectives are
  - The prevention of crime and disorder;
  - Public safety;
  - The prevention of nuisance; and
  - The protection of children from harm.
- 32. Members should note that each objective is of equal importance. There are no other licensing objectives, and the four objectives are paramount considerations at all times.
- 33. Conditions will not be necessary if they duplicate a statutory position. Conditions relating to night café and take away aspect of the license must relate to the night time operation of the premises and must not be used to impose conditions which could not be imposed on day time operators.
- 34. Members are also referred to the DCMS guidance on conditions, specifically section 7, and Annexes D, E, F and G.

#### Reasons

35. If the Sub-Committee determines that it is necessary to modify the conditions, or to refuse the application for a Premises Licence application, it must give reasons for its decision.

## **Hearing Procedures**

- 36. Subject to the Licensing Hearing regulations, the Licensing Committee may determine its own procedures. Key elements of the regulations are that
- The hearing shall take the form of a discussion led by the authority. Cross examination shall not be permitted unless the authority considered that it is required for it to consider the representations
- Members of the authority are free to ask any question of any party or other person appearing at the hearing
- The committee must allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights to
  - Address the authority
  - o If given permission by the committee, question any other party.
  - o In response to a point which the authority has given notice it will require clarification, give further information in support of their application.
- The committee shall disregard any information given by a party which is not relevant
  - to the particular application before the committee, and
  - o the licensing objectives.
- The hearing shall be in public, although the committee may exclude the public from all or part of a hearing where it considers that the public interest in doing so outweighs the public interest in the hearing, or that part of the hearing, taking place in private.
- In considering any representations or notice made by a party the authority may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice (as applicable) either before the hearing or, with the consent of all the other parties, at the hearing.
- 37. This matter relates to the determination of an application for a Premises Licence under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regulation 26(1)(a) requires the Sub-Committee to make its determination at the conclusion of the hearing.

### Council's multiple roles and the role of the Licensing Sub-Committee

- 38. Sub-Committee members will note that, in relation to this application, the Council has multiple roles. Council officers from various departments have been asked to consider the application from the perspective of the Council as authority responsible respectively for environmental health, trading standards, health and safety and as the planning authority.
- 39. Members should note that the Licensing Sub-Committee is meeting on this occasion solely to perform the role of licensing authority. The Sub-Committee sits in quasijudicial capacity, and must act impartially. It must offer a fair and unbiased hearing of the application. In this case, Members should disregard the Council's broader policy objectives and role as statutory authority in other contexts. Members must direct themselves to making a determination solely based upon the Licensing Law, Guidance and the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy.
- 40. As a quasi-judicial body the Licensing Sub-Committee is required to consider the application on its merits. The Sub-Committee must take into account only relevant factors, and ignore irrelevant factors. The decision must be based on evidence, that is to say material, which tends logically to show the existence or non-existence of relevant facts, or the likelihood or unlikelihood of the occurrence of some future event, the occurrence of which would be relevant. The Licensing Sub-Committee must give fair consideration to the contentions of all persons entitled to make representations to them.
- 41. The Licensing Sub-Committee is entitled to consider events outside of the premises if they are relevant, i.e. are properly attributable to the premises being open. The proprietors do not have to be personally responsible for the incidents for the same to be relevant. However, if such events are not properly attributable to the premises being open, then the evidence is not relevant and should be excluded. Guidance is that the licensing authority will primarily focus on the direct impact of the activities taking place at the licensed premises on members of the public, living, working or engaged in normal activity in the area concerned.
- 42. Members will be aware of the Council's Code of Conduct which requires them to declare personal and prejudicial interests. The Code applies to Members when considering licensing applications. In addition, as a quasi-judicial body, Members are required to avoid both actual bias, and the appearance of bias.
- 43. The Sub-Committee can only consider matters within the application that have been raised through representations from interested parties and responsible authorities. Interested parties must live in the vicinity of the premises. This will be decided on a case to case basis.
- 44. Under the Human Rights Act 1998. the Sub Committee needs to consider the balance between the rights of the applicant and those making representations to the application when making their decision. The Sub-Committee has a duty under section 17 Crime and Disorder Act 1998 when making its decision to do all it can to prevent crime and disorder in the Borough.
- 45. Interested Parties, Responsible Authorities and the applicant have the right to appeal the decision of the Sub-Committee to the Magistrates' Court within a period of 21 days beginning with the day on which the applicant was notified by the licensing authority of the decision to be appealed against.

## Guidance

46. Members are required to have regard to the DCMS Guidance in carrying out the functions of licensing authority. However, guidance does not cover every possible situation, so long as the guidance has been properly and carefully understood, members may depart from it if they have reason to do so. Full reasons must be given if this is the case.





I would like to make the following objections to the Licence application by Local Express, Unit 2, 202-206 Union Street, London SE1 which I understand I have to make in writing and I trust you will accept by email as I do not have an accessible printer.

- I object to any 24/7 alcohol premises in a vulnerable area where we have had considerable problems from drinking and drug taking from people living in hostels and temporary residencies such as the hotel next door. These premises are directly next to Nelson Square Gardens and the Rochester estates which have considerable problems with street drinkers and excessive noise on Union Street.
- 2. These premises are already opposite a public house and I am concerned that drinkers will simply go across and sit in the accesible gardens in the early hours or go into Nelson Square's Park where we have had many problems in the past. This is already designated a no drinking zone but drunk people will not care about that. The high rise developments like Palestra have turned the area into an echo chamber at night and this potentially disturbs up to 1,000 people. I wish to oppose the application for a 24 hour alcohol licence and indeed any licence for these premises for the following reasons:

Union Street/Blackfriars road is an area in which alcohol related problems have been the source of deep local disquiet. Large meetings in November 08 and March 09, involving many local tenants associations, were held to discuss this problem with relevant agencies. At this meeting it was clear that major problems are being caused by local street drinkers and by rowdy behaviour by those who are drunk at night.

It was also pointed out that we have a very high concentration of local agencies and hostels dealing with those with substance abuse problems. There are already a large number of premises selling alcohol in the vicinity including two a little further up the Cut and a pub directly opposite the premises in question. At an earlier mediation meeting on the applicants previous application, they stated that their customers in the early hours and through the night would be residents from the Travelodge hotel, which is next to them. However, I note that Travelodge has its own 24 hour licence for residents.

The area almost opposite the premises contains four blocks of flats and high numbers of children and young people. The flats also house people who have or are recovering from mental health (and substance-abuse issues). Additionally, as a resident in Union street (almost opposite these premises) I would add:

Up to 2 and 3am there is rowdy behaviour (screaming, singing, shouting etc) by drunken people in Union Street presumably returning from clubs in the area. This new premises licence would give them yet another place to buy alcohol.



The area behind Union Street is Nelson Square. Another alcohol outlet would further encourage drinkers to buy their drink there and drink it in the Square. The Square contains a children's playground and is the only green space for locals and local workers.

Those purchasing alcohol at night are most likely to cross the road and drink it in the grounds of our flats (Rowland Hill House). On the ground floor of Rowland Hill House there are several elderly and disabled people who would be greatly disturbed by this.

There are also likely to be disturbances in and around the shop by drunken people whether sold or refused alcohol.

There would be problems of noise, litter and the general seediness that a 24 hour licensed premises brings with it.

In short, my objections are that:

 Such a licence would present real and continuing problems for local people in terms of rowdy behaviour and would have a severe impact on Rowland Hill House.

It would endanger public safety by allowing already drunk people to buy

more alcohol at night

- It would potentially threaten the safety of local children as it could lead to Nelson Square becoming an area for the local street drinkers. This applies to any licensing hours for this premises as street drinkers congregate during the day. (This is further emphasized by the fact that Lambeth has enforced its no drinking zone and pushed the street drinkers into the Southwark side of the area).
- It will add to the noise, litter and disturbance in the local area which is caused by the over-availability of drink.



I wish to object to a 24 hr licence.

### 1.Crime and disorder

a) the premises are situated close to the boundary of the drinking control area - LBLambeth (Alcohol Consumption in designated public places) (Waterloo) Order 2003 - in neighbouring Lambeth. The shop will therefore be used by people unable to buy drink/drink in the street in Lambeth.

b) There is also currently an alcohol saturation zone in Blackfriars Road, imposed as a result of many

disorder problems resulting from easy access to alcohol.

c) The council is currently consulting on an alcohol saturation zone in this area, due to the violence against the person statistics for the Blackfriars Rd area.

The applicant recently submitted an identical application for a premises located at Unit 2, 201-203 Union Street SE1 0LH which has been conciliated by Police after agreement was reached in respect of a number of conditions that were to be placed on the Premises Licence. It would appear that part of this application applies to the postal address of part of the original application I.E. 202-203. Is this new application a re-adjustment of the original postal address or is it to increase the size of the original application in larger units? Has the original application been granted and if it has it been surrendered back to the London Borough of Southwark Licensing?

However irrespective of the reasons for the new application the grounds for submitting a representation appear to remain constant. 

Planning permission ref. no. 05-AP-0673 was granted in 2006 for erection of an eight storey building for hotel use with retail or restaurant (Classes A1/A3) use on ground floor

The permission was granted with conditions. Condition 5 state that "the use hereby permitted for A3 purposes shall not be carried on outside of the hours 9.00 to 23.30 on Sunday to Thursday or 9.00 to midnight on other days.

". The reason for imposing this condition is to ensure no loss of amenity through noise and disturbance to the adjoining residential occupiers, in accordance with policy 3.2 'Protection of Amenity' of the Southwark Plan.

The applicant would need to submit a planning application for permission to vary the aforementioned condition. The Planning Department has no record of such permission being sought or granted.

As such, the Planning Department objects to the licensing application on the grounds that the premises licence being sought for the supply of alcohol, and opening hours for 24 hours daily is likely to result in loss of amenity through noise and disturbance to the adjoining residential occupiers.


