RECOMMENDATION

1. That the Licensing Sub-Committee considers an application made by Rubel Ahmed for a Premises Licence to be granted under the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of the premises known as Ivory Arch Tandoori, 80 – 82 Walworth Road, London SE1 6SW.

Notes:

- a) This application forms a new application for a Premises Licence, under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003. The application is subject to representations from responsible authorities and interested parties and is therefore referred to the Sub-Committee for determination;
- b) Paragraphs 7 to 9 of this report provide a summary of the application the Premises Licence under consideration by the Sub-Committee (A copy of the full application is provided at Appendix A).
- c) Paragraphs 11 to 15 of this report deal with the representations received to the Premises Licence application. (Copies of the relevant representations are attached at Appendix B and C).

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Licensing Act 2003

- 2. The Licensing Act 2003 received Royal Assent on 10 July 2003. The Act provides a new licensing regime for
 - a) The sale of and supply of alcohol
 - b) The provision of regulated entertainment
 - c) The provision of late night refreshment

Within Southwark, this Council wholly administers the licensing responsibility.

- 3. The Act requires the licensing authority to carry out its functions under the Act with a view to promoting the four stated licensing objectives. These are
 - a) The prevention of crime and disorder;
 - b) The promotion of public safety
 - c) The prevention of nuisance; and
 - d) The protection of children from harm.

- 4. In carrying out its licensing functions, a licensing authority must also have regard to
 - a. The Act itself;
 - b. The Guidance to the act issued under Section 182 of the Act;
 - c. Secondary regulations issued under the Act;
 - d. The Licensing Authority's own Statement of Licensing Policy
 - e. The application, including the operating schedule submitted as part of the application
 - f. Relevant representations
- 5. The Act established a transitional period between 7 February 2005 and 6 August 2005 under which holders of existing Justices Licenses, Public Entertainment Licenses and Night Café Licenses were able to apply to the local licensing authority for "grandfather rights" conversion of those existing licenses into the relevant licenses under the new system. Licenses that were so converted were converted on existing terms, conditions and restrictions. The 6 August date having passed, operators must now apply for new licenses.
- 6. The premises licence application process involves the provision of all relevant information required under the Act to the licensing authority with copies provided by the applicant to the relevant responsible bodies under the Act. The application must also be advertised at the premises and in the local press. The responsible authorities and other interested parties within the local community may make representations on any part of the application where relevant to the four licensing objectives.

MATTERS FOR CONSIDERATION

The Premises Licence Application

- 7. On 14th April 2009, this Council received an application from Rubel Ahmed for the grant of a new Premises Licence in respect of the premises known as Ivory Arch Tandoori, 80 82 Walworth Road, London SE1 6SW.
- 8. The application, attached as Appendix A, is summarized as follows
- The provision of late night refreshment from 23.00-02.00 Sundays to Wednesdays, and 23.00-03.00 Thursdays to Saturdays.
- The sale of alcohol on and off the premises from 11.00-02.00 Sundays to Wednesdays, and 11.00-03.00 Thursdays to Saturdays.
- Opening hours from 11.00 to 02.00 Sundays to Wednesdays, and 11.00-03.00 Thursdays to Saturdays.
- 9. The Premises Licence application form provides the applicant company's operating schedule. Parts L, M, N, O and P set out the proposed operating hours and operating controls in full, with reference to the four licensing objectives as stated in the Licensing Act 2003.

Designated Premises Supervisor

10. The proposed designated premises supervisor under the licence is Izzazul Ahmed, who has been granted a personal licence by London Borough of Southwark.

Representations from Responsible Authorities

11. The Metropolitan Police Service has submitted a representation on the grounds that the applicant has not sufficiently addressed the licensing objective "The prevention of crime and

- disorder". Twenty six (26) conditions have been suggested for the applicant to adopt in order to promote that objective. The representation is attached as Appendix B.
- 12. The Council's Environmental Protection Team made a representation in relation to public nuisance and the issue of smokers. A condition has been suggested in order to meet this objective. The correspondence relating to this representation is attached as Appendix B.
- 13. No other Responsible Authorities have made representations, however the responses are attached as Appendix B.

Representations from Interested Parties

- **14.** Brookfield Developments (UK) Limited (redeveloping the site adjacent Ivory Arch Tandoori) have submitted a representation relating to the licensing objectives "*The prevention of crime and disorder*" "*Public safety*" and "*The prevention of nuisance*". The representation states that there are concerns that a late night alcohol licence would not be able to promote these objectives. There are also concerns that the premises remains in the same ownership as the previous premises licence, which led to the licence being revoked. The representation is attached as Appendix C.
- **15.** The Draper Tenants & Residents Association has lodged a representation. Their representation relates to the licensing objectives "The prevention of crime and disorder" "Public safety" and "The prevention of nuisance". They are concerned that the premises are run by the same management as with the previous licence, and therefore will not be able to promote these licensing objectives. The representation is attached as Appendix C.

Letters of Support for this application

16. There are no letters of support for this application.

Planning

17. There are no planning restrictions. See Appendix B for the response.

Disability Discrimination Act

18. The Southwark Disablement Association has no comments regarding this application.

Conciliation Meeting

19. A conciliation meeting has not been held as it was not deemed useful. A number of representations stated that conciliation would not placate them and that they were satisfied to attend the Sub-Committee hearing for the decision.

Additional information on the past operating history of the premises.

Under previous legislation the premises operated with a Justices "on licence", public entertainment licence, special hours certificate and supper hours certificate, and was converted and varied to a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003 in October 2005. These licences were held by Mr Bahar Uddin.

- In December 2003 the Police successfully applied for revocation of the Justices "on licence" under the Licensing Act 1964 that was held by Mr Bahar Uddin of the Ivory Arch. As a consequence, Mr Uddin was prohibited from obtaining a personal licence under the Licensing Act 2003 for a period of 5 years. He employed Mr Abdul Sahebzada as his DPS at Ivory Arch.
- The licensable activities authorised under the previous premises licence were live and recorded music, performance of dance, entertainment similar to live and recorded music, making music, dancing, entertainment similar to making music and dancing, late night refreshment and sale of alcohol on and off the premises. The opening hours were 10.00 to 04.00 Sunday to Wednesday, 10.00 to 05.00 Thursday to Saturday
- On 19th October 2006 a closure order applied for by Police was issued by Camberwell Green Magistrates Court. The Court was satisfied that closure was necessary in the interests of public safety.
- On 20th October 2006 an application for the review of the premises licence was received from PC Compton of the Metropolitan Police. The review was called as Police were investigating the attempted murder of two persons, one of whom was shot in the buttocks and the second in the rear of the head by a suspect who discharged between 5 & 6 rounds in the street outside the premises. Police had recorded numerous incidents reporting either the use of, or presence of, firearms being taken into the premises. The club had been associated with rival gangs using the premises.
- On 3rd November 2006 the Licensing Sub-Committee revoked the licence with immediate effect.
- Mr Bahar Uddin was the premises licence holder at the time of the revocation.
- Mr Bahar Uddin currently owns the freehold to the premises.

The Local Vicinity

- 20. A map of the vicinity is attached at Appendix D. The premises are identified by a triangle at the centre of the map. For purposes of scale-only the circle on the map has a 100-metre radius. The following licensed premises are within the vicinity of the premises.
 - The Beijing: 4 Hampton St, London, SE1 6SN Open 7 days a week: 13.30 – 00:20hrs

Licensable activities: late night refreshment.

 Chatkhara Restaurant: 84 Walworth Rd, London SE1 6SW Open 7 days a week: 12.00 – 02.00hrs

Licensable activities: late night refreshment.

• Bar South Central: 16 Elephant & Castle, London SE1 6TH Open Monday to Saturday 09.00 – 02.00, Sunday 09.00 – 23.30

Licensable activities: Recorded music, live music, performance of dance, entertainment similar to live/recorded music, facilities for making music, facilities for dancing, entertainment similar to making music/dancing, late night refreshment, sale of alcohol on and off the premises.

• **Distriandina:** Unit 6, Farrell Court, Elephant Rd, London SE17 1LB Open Monday to Thursday: 08.00am to 03.00am, Friday & Saturday 08.00 – 06.00, Sunday 08.00 – 00.00.

Licensable activities: Films, live music, recorded music, performance of dance, entertainment similar to live/recorded music, facilities for making music, facilities for

dancing, provisions similar to making music and dancing, late night refreshment, Sale of alcohol on and off the premises.

Southwark Council Statement of Licensing Policy

- 21. Council Assembly approved the Southwark Statement of Licensing Policy on 8 December 2004. Sections of the Statement that are considered to be of particular relevance to this application are
 - g. Section 3 which sets out the purpose and scope of the policy and re-inforces the four licensing objectives
 - h. Section 5 which sets out the Council's approach with regard to the imposition of conditions including mandatory conditions to be attached to the licence
 - Section 6 details other relevant Council and Government policies, strategies, responsibilities and guidance, including the relevant Articles under the Human Rights Act 1998
 - j. Section 7 provides general guidance on dealing with crime and disorder and deals with licensing hours
 - k. Section 8 provides general guidance on ensuring public safety including safe capacities
 - I. Section 9 provides general guidance on the prevention of nuisance
 - m. Section 10 provides general guidance on the protection of children from harm.
- 22. The purpose of Southwark's Statement of Licensing Policy is to make clear to applicants what considerations will be taken into account when determining applications and should act as a guide to the Sub-Committee when considering the applications. However, the Sub-Committee must always consider each application on its own merits and allow exceptions to the normal policy where these are justified by the circumstances of the application.

RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

- 23. A fee of £190 has been paid by the applicant company in respect of this application being the statutory fee payable for premises within non-domestic rateable value Band A. **CONSULTATIONS**
- 24. Consultation has been carried out on this application in accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. A public notice was placed in Southwark News (April 16, 2009 edition) and a similar notice exhibited outside of the premises.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES IMPLICATIONS

25. Each application is required by law to be considered upon its own individual merits with all relevant matters taken into account.

CONCURRENT REPORT BY THE STRATEGIC DIRECTOR OF COMMUNITIES, LAW & GOVERNANCE – LEGAL ISSUES

26. The Sub-Committee is asked to determine the application for a Premises Licence under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

27. The principles which Sub-Committee members must apply are set out below.

Principles for making the determination

- 28. The general principle is that applications for Premises Licence applications must be granted unless relevant representations are received. This is subject to the proviso that the applicant has complied with regulations in advertising and submitting the application.
- 29. Relevant representations are those which
- Are about the likely effect of the granting of the application on the promotion of the licensing objectives
- Are made by an interested party or responsible authority
- Have not been withdrawn.
- Are not, in the opinion of the relevant licensing authority, frivolous or vexatious.
- 30. If relevant representations are received then the Sub-Committee must have regard to them, in determining whether it is necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives to
 - (a) to grant the licence subject to-
 - (i) The conditions mentioned in section 18 (2)(a) modified to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and
 - (ii) Any condition which must under section 19,20 or 21be included in the licence
 - (b) to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
 - (c) to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor;
 - (d) to reject the application.

Conditions

- 31. The Sub-Committee's discretion is thus limited. It can only modify the Conditions put forward by the applicant, or refuse the application, if it is necessary to do so. Conditions must be necessary and proportionate for the promotion of one of the four licensing objectives, and not for any other reason. Conditions must also be within the control of the licensee, and should be worded in a way which is clear, certain, consistent and enforceable.
- 32. The four licensing objectives are
 - The prevention of crime and disorder;
 - · Public safety;
 - The prevention of nuisance; and
 - The protection of children from harm.
- 33. Members should note that each objective is of equal importance. There are no other licensing objectives, and the four objectives are paramount considerations at all times.

- 34. Conditions will not be necessary if they duplicate a statutory position. Conditions relating to night café and take away aspect of the license must relate to the night time operation of the premises and must not be used to impose conditions which could not be imposed on day time operators.
- 35. Members are also referred to the DCMS guidance on conditions, specifically section 7, and Annexes D, E, F and G.

Reasons

36. If the Sub-Committee determines that it is necessary to modify the conditions, or to refuse the application for a Premises Licence application, it must give reasons for its decision.

Hearing Procedures

- 37. Subject to the Licensing Hearing regulations, the Licensing Committee may determine its own procedures. Key elements of the regulations are that
- The hearing shall take the form of a discussion led by the authority. Cross examination shall not be permitted unless the authority considered that it is required for it to consider the representations
- Members of the authority are free to ask any question of any party or other person appearing at the hearing
- The committee must allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights to
 - Address the authority
 - o If given permission by the committee, question any other party.
 - o In response to a point which the authority has given notice it will require clarification, give further information in support of their application.
- The committee shall disregard any information given by a party which is not relevant
 - o to the particular application before the committee, and
 - o the licensing objectives.
- The hearing shall be in public, although the committee may exclude the public from all or part of a hearing where it considers that the public interest in doing so outweighs the public interest in the hearing, or that part of the hearing, taking place in private.
- In considering any representations or notice made by a party the authority may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice (as applicable) either before the hearing or, with the consent of all the other parties, at the hearing.
- 38. This matter relates to the determination of an application for a Premises Licence under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regulation 26(1)(a) requires the Sub-Committee to make its determination at the conclusion of the hearing.

Council's multiple roles and the role of the Licensing Sub-Committee

39. Sub-Committee members will note that, in relation to this application, the Council has multiple roles. Council officers from various departments have been asked to consider the application from the perspective of the Council as authority responsible respectively for environmental health, trading standards, health and safety and as the planning authority.

- 40. Members should note that the Licensing Sub-Committee is meeting on this occasion solely to perform the role of licensing authority. The Sub-Committee sits in quasijudicial capacity, and must act impartially. It must offer a fair and unbiased hearing of the application. In this case, Members should disregard the Council's broader policy objectives and role as statutory authority in other contexts. Members must direct themselves to making a determination solely based upon the Licensing Law, Guidance and the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy.
- 41. As a quasi-judicial body the Licensing Sub-Committee is required to consider the application on its merits. The Sub-Committee must take into account only relevant factors, and ignore irrelevant factors. The decision must be based on evidence, that is to say material, which tends logically to show the existence or non-existence of relevant facts, or the likelihood or unlikelihood of the occurrence of some future event, the occurrence of which would be relevant. The Licensing Sub-Committee must give fair consideration to the contentions of all persons entitled to make representations to them.
- 42. The Licensing Sub-Committee is entitled to consider events outside of the premises if they are relevant, i.e. are properly attributable to the premises being open. The proprietors do not have to be personally responsible for the incidents for the same to be relevant. However, if such events are not properly attributable to the premises being open, then the evidence is not relevant and should be excluded. Guidance is that the licensing authority will primarily focus on the direct impact of the activities taking place at the licensed premises on members of the public, living, working or engaged in normal activity in the area concerned.
- 43. Members will be aware of the Council's Code of Conduct which requires them to declare personal and prejudicial interests. The Code applies to Members when considering licensing applications. In addition, as a quasi-judicial body, Members are required to avoid both actual bias, and the appearance of bias.
- 44. The Sub-Committee can only consider matters within the application that have been raised through representations from interested parties and responsible authorities. Interested parties must live in the vicinity of the premises. This will be decided on a case to case basis.
- 45. Under the Human Rights Act 1998. the Sub Committee needs to consider the balance between the rights of the applicant and those making representations to the application when making their decision. The Sub-Committee has a duty under section 17 Crime and Disorder Act 1998 when making its decision to do all it can to prevent crime and disorder in the Borough.
- 46. Interested Parties, Responsible Authorities and the applicant have the right to appeal the decision of the Sub-Committee to the Magistrates' Court within a period of 21 days beginning with the day on which the applicant was notified by the licensing authority of the decision to be appealed against.

Guidance

47. Members are required to have regard to the DCMS Guidance in carrying out the functions of licensing authority. However, guidance does not cover every possible situation, so long as the guidance has been properly and carefully understood, members may depart from it if they have reason to do so. Full reasons must be given if this is the case.



I write to acknowledge receipt of an application by Rubel Ahmed for the grant of a Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of the above premises.

It should be noted that these premises are quite close to many residential properties and, indeed, are actually situated directly below and adjacent to some such properties.

Police would wish to offer a representation to this application on the grounds that the applicant has not sufficiently addressed the Licensing Objective regarding the prevention of Crime and Disorder.

There are many and varied conditions that could be added to any Premises Licence that the Licensing Committee may choose to grant for these premises in order to assist in the promotion of the said Licensing Objective. I have listed below those which the applicant, should he decide that the hours sought in this application are necessary for the running of his business, may wish to consider adopting:

(1) That SIA registered door supervisors shall be employed at the premises after 9.00pm each night and be provided with a hand held metal detection unit and a mechanical counting device in order to supervise admissions to and departures from the premises and to ensure that the premises maximum accommodation limit is not exceeded.



- (2) That signs shall be displayed in the entrance foyer to the premises that state 'Drugs Free Zone' and 'No Search, No Entry. Management Reserve The Right To Refuse Entry'
- (3) That an anti-drugs statement shall be displayed prominently at the entrance to the premises and arrangements made with Southwark Police in accordance with the Best Practice Guide prepared by the Metropolitan Police.
- (4) That you shall require any person hiring the premises to complete the 'Venue Hire Agreement' provided by the Metropolitan Police and, once completed, and, once completed, the Premises Licence holder or their nominated representative shall ensure that a copy of the agreement is provided to the Police and Licensing * Unit a minimum of fourteen days prior to the date of hire.
- (5) That a drugs drop box, which must be secure and have a tamper proof entrance, shall be fixed to the wall in the entrance foyer to the premises and an agreement must be established with the local Police over the emptying and collection of any drugs deposited in the box.
- (6) That notices shall be prominently displayed stating 'Over 21's only'
- (7) That a device shall be fitted to all Fire Doors and be maintained so that a warning light is switched on above the door inside the premises whenever any Fire Door is opened.
- (8) That suitable numbers of staff shall be employed outside the premises for up to one hour after the terminal hour to take all reasonable steps to ensure that patrons leave in a quiet and orderly manner so as not to disturb local residents.
- (9) That there shall be no movement of musical or amplification equipment from the premises between the hours of 12.00 midnight and 8.00 am and any vehicle carrying such equipment shall be parked as far away from residential premises as reasonably practicable.
- (10) That all external doors and windows (excepting any that have to be locked open to ensure public safety) shall be kept shut and under strict management supervision and allow access and egress only whilst entertainment is being provided.
- (11) That no outside parts of the curtilage shall be used for events of a licensable nature, or shall be used whilst events are in progress.
- (12) That only bottles and glasses made from toughened glass shall be used during the sale or supply of any drinks, whether alcoholic or not, to customers.
- (13) That a Personal Licence holder be on the premises at all times that intoxicating liquor is sold or supplied



- (14) That a CCTV system shall be installed both inside and outside the premises in conjunction with advice from the local Police and be maintained in good working order. This system shall be continually recording at all times that the premises are in use under the Premises Licence. All such CCTV footage shall be kept for a period of thirty-one (31) days and shall, upon request, be made immediately available to officers of the Police or Council.
- (15) That one CCTV camera shall be installed in such a position as to enable a clear facial image of every person passing through the security arch to be recorded and shall be maintained in working order at all times.
- (16) That there shall be no new admissions or readmissions to the premises after 1.00am on the days following Sunday to Wednesday and after 2.00am on the days following Thursday to Saturday - except for persons leaving the premises in order to smoke. Such persons shall be supervised at all times and subject to being re-searched on re-entry to the premises.
- (17) That the last permitted time for ordering a meal to be 1.00am on the days following Sunday to Wednesday and 2.00am on the days following Thursday to Saturday
- (18) The adoption and implementation of a recognised Proof of Age scheme
- (19) That all staff concerned with the sale or supply of intoxicating liquor undergo a recognised Training scheme for such duties and a record of such training is kept and made available for inspection, on request to officers of the Police or Council.
- (20) That there shall be no irresponsible drinks promotions undertaken at the premises
- (21) That there shall be an arrangement made with a local licensed cab office to enable patrons of the venue to call responsible cabs and leave the area as necessary when they have concluded their business at the premises
- (22) That there shall be no children permitted on the premises after 9.00pm
- (23) That an identification Recognition System (ClubScan or similar) shall be installed and maintained in working order at all times. Every person, including staff and agents, entering the premises during opening hours shall be required to submit their details to the system prior to entry being granted.
- (24) That the Licensee / Duty manager shall maintain a register indicating the numbers of staff, including any Door Supervisors and all performers, who are present when the public are present. This register shall be produced immediately on the request of an Authorised Officer.



- (25) That a duty roster must be maintained for all SIA staff and shall be made available to the Metropolitan Police on request.
- (26) That an incident Log must be maintained at all times and made available to the Metropolitan Police and the London Borough of Southwark Authorised Officers on request.

Should the applicant agree to these, it will go some way in order to prevent and manage the potential for Public Disorder and Public Nuisance.

The applicant proposes late night refreshment and supply of alcohol only until 0200 Sunday to Wednesday and 0300 Thursday to Saturday i.e no live or recorded music has been applied for. It is assumed from the application that there is to be no outside area for these facilities or any home delivery to the take away element of the business.

I acknowledge the prevention of public measures set out in the application, however this has not addressed the potential for smokers to gather outside in numbers and impact on the residents [and future residents] in the vicinity. This could be controlled by limitation imposed by condition including an assurance that drinks are not taken off the premises by smokers. Generally I believe that the locality is such that premises could operate to the proposed hours without significant impact.

I need therefore to make representation whilst the point above is considered by the applicant.

I am writing on behalf of Brookfield Developments (UK) Limited to object to the application for the supply of alcohol and late night refreshment to the above premises. We believe that three of the four objectives of the Licensing Act 2003 would be contravened should this application be granted, namely:

- 1. The prevention of crime and disorder
- 2. Public safety
- 3. The prevention of nuisance

Brookfield Developments (UK) Limited act as Development Manager for the redevelopment of the site known as Castle House, 2-20 Walworth Road, London SE1 6SP, immediately adjacent to the Ivory Arch premises. Comprising the first significant private development to be undertaken as part of the Elephant & Castle (E&C) regeneration, our scheme will deliver 408 market and affordable homes and 4 (A1/A3/A5) commercial units to the area by April next year (2010).

Our company (previously known as Multiplex) and myself in particular have been actively involved with this part of London since January 2005. We have worked closely with local people, businesses and Southwark Council officers throughout the years in the planning, development, approval and implementation of our project. We understand the local community and their fears, hopes and aspirations for this part of the Elephant very well.

This representation is made as both a business operating in that vicinity and a body representing persons who live in that vicinity - the existing local community (supporting groups such as the Draper Tenants & Residents Association) and the circa 757 residents and tenants of our development who will be Southwark Council tax payers within the next 12 months or so.

During public consultation on our evolving planning proposals (July 2005-March 2006), we received clear direction from residents that late night drinking venues and the direct consequences of their operation were having a materially detrimental effect on their quality of life and the residential amenity of the area as a whole. It was for this reason that we removed the option for a public house from the commercial element at the base of our development and reduced the operating hours for our proposed A1/A3 and A5 uses to





11.00pm. We also supported the local community and police and made representations to the Licensing Unit when the Ivory Arches previous licence was reviewed and revoked following the fatality.

The Ivory Arch remains in the same ownership and we have no reason to believe that the reintroduction of a late night alcohol licence to these premises would result in anything other than public nuisance ultimately leading to crime, disorder and further safety concerns for already beleaguered local residents.

This is clearly an established residential area. Late night drinking venues are never suitable in close proximity to people's homes and allowing this contradiction to occur only leads to nuisance. Hindsight demonstrates that a late night drinking licence never was appropriate in this location and cannot be reasonably justified, especially given the Council's and our commitment to the locality's future as an attractive area for people to come and live in the revitalised E&C.

Through the implementation of our significant S106 contributions we are improving the external environment and security of this part of the Elephant. The car park to the rear of our site, previously frequented by Ivory Arch's late night customers, was one of Southwark's crime hot spots. We do not wish to see this area go backwards in terms of residential amenity and public safety

As this is largely a matter of principle, it is highly unlikely that any measures proposed by the applicant during any conciliation meeting (other than the withdrawal of their licence application) will be sufficient to address our substantive concerns. Consequently we are prepared to pursue this beyond conciliation and committed to attend the public hearing if required.

We strongly urge the Council's Licensing Sub Committee to refuse this application and look forward to receiving your acknowledgement of this formal objection.

I am writing on behalf, and in my elected position as Chair, of the Draper Tenants & Residents Association to object to this application for a licence to supply alcohol and late night entertainment.

This objection was unanimously agreed after discussion at a general meeting of the Draper Estate held on Monday 11th May 2009.

We firmly believe that this application is of a similar enough content to the one that was refused/revoked at a previous licensing hearing and should be rejected for the same reasons.

The Ivory Arch is still under the same ownership as before and we can see no way in which the granting of this licence will have any less a detrimental and anti-social effect on the local area and local population as has been previously seen. The type of premises and the clientele attracted are a constant cause of public nuisance, anti-social behaviour, crime, including but not limited to drug offences, violent crime which has led to both knife crime and shootings. There are no assurances or guarantees that can be offered to prevent this happening again.

This is a highly populated residential area and the granting of such licences can do nothing but cause problems to the people who live in this area. Past experience shows that such establishments are in no way beneficial or desired by the people who have to live here and live with the daily consequences of such licensing.


While we are sure the applicant will offer various assurances, the Draper Estate will only be placated by the total withdrawal of this application. Yours sincerely,

RECOMMENDATION

1. That the licensing sub-committee considers an application made by Waheed Allahgul, for a premises licence to be granted under the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of the premises known as Costcutter, 257-259 Southwark Park Road, London SE16 3TP.

Notes:

- a) This application forms a new application for a premises licence, under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003. The application is subject to representations from seven interested parties and one responsible authority and is therefore referred to the subcommittee for determination;
- b) Paragraphs 7 to 10 of this report provide a summary of the application the premises licence under consideration by the sub-committee (A copy of the full application is provided at Appendix A)
- c) Paragraphs 15 to 17 of this report deal with the representations received to the premises licence application and to the premises licence holder. (Copies of the relevant representations are attached at Appendices C & D).

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Licensing Act 2003

- 2. The Licensing Act 2003 received royal assent on 10 July 2003. The Act provides a new licensing regime for
 - a) The sale of and supply of alcohol
 - b) The provision of regulated entertainment
 - c) The provision of late night refreshment

Within Southwark, this council wholly administers the licensing responsibility.

- 3. The Act requires the licensing authority to carry out its functions under the Act with a view to promoting the four stated licensing objectives. These are
 - a) The prevention of crime and disorder;
 - b) The promotion of public safety
 - c) The prevention of nuisance; and
 - d) The protection of children from harm.

- 4. In carrying out its licensing functions, a licensing authority must also have regard to
 - a) The Act itself;
 - b) The guidance to the Act issued under Section 182 of the Act;
 - c) Secondary regulations issued under the Act;
 - d) The licensing authority's own statement of licensing policy
 - e) The application, including the operating schedule submitted as part of the application
 - f) Relevant representations
- 5. The Act established a transitional period between 7 February 2005 and 6 August 2005 under which holders of existing justices licenses, public entertainment licenses and night café licenses were able to apply to the local licensing authority for "grandfather rights" conversion of those existing licenses into the relevant licenses under the new system. Licenses that were so converted were converted on existing terms, conditions and restrictions. The 6 August date having passed, operators must now apply for new licenses.
- 6. The premises licence application process involves the provision of all relevant information required under the Act to the licensing authority with copies provided by the applicant to the relevant responsible bodies under the Act. The application must also be advertised at the premises and in the local press. The responsible authorities and other interested parties within the local community may make representations on any part of the application where relevant to the four licensing objectives.

MATTERS FOR CONSIDERATION

The premises licence application

- 7. On the 9th April 2009, Waheed Allahgul applied to this council for the grant of a new premises licence in respect of the premises known as Costcutter, 257-259 Southwark Park Road, London, SE16 3TP. Mr Allahgul also listed himself as the designated premises supervisor.
- 8. A copy of the application for the new premises licence is attached to the report as Appendix A
- 9. The premises licence application form provides the applicant company's operating schedule. Parts M and O set out the proposed operating hours and operating controls in full, with reference to the four licensing objectives as stated in the Licensing Act 2003.
- 10. The application is summarized as follows
 - For the sale by retail of alcohol (to be consumed off the premises) from 00.00 to 23.59 on each of the days Monday to Sunday.
 - The proposed opening hours are 23.59 to 00.00 on each of the days Monday to Sunday.

Operating History

11. There is no prior operating history relating to these premises.

Designated premises supervisor

- 12. The proposed designated premises supervisor for the premises known as Costcutter, 257-259 Southwark Park Road, London, SE16 3TP is Mr Ghasem Abbasi who has been granted a personal licence by the City of Westminster.
- 13. The application submitted by Mr Allahgul initially listed himself as the designated premises supervisor. However a representation was lodged by the Metropolitan Police Service in respect of Mr Allahgul being the premises licence holder and the designated premises supervisor.
- 14. Copies of the representations were forwarded to the applicant's representative who made an application on 10th June 2009 to vary the designated premises supervisor from Mr Allahgul to Mr Abbasi. A copy of this application is attached as appendix B. An application was also made to transfer the licence from Mr Allahgul, however as the licence had not been issued no transfer application could be accepted.

Representations from interested parties

15. There are seven representations from interested parties. They are attached to this report as appendix C. One of the representations is from a local tenants and residents association, who has asked their ward councillor to represent them. The representations relate to public nuisance and crime and disorder.

Representations from responsible authorities

- 16. One representation has been received from the metropolitan police service. A copy of this representation is attached to this report as appendix D. The representation objected to Mr Allahgul being the premises licence holder and the designated premises supervisor.
- 17. Further correspondence has been received from the police and applicant's representative and is attached as appendix E to this report. The correspondence confirms that the police would withdraw their representations subject to the variation of the designated premises supervisor and to confirmation that the applicant has agreed to the proposed conditions requested by the police. The police also wish the premises licence to be transferred. The police have been notified that the application cannot be transferred and as such the police have requested that their representation remains.

Disability discrimination act

18. The Southwark Disablement Association have no comments regarding this application.

The local vicinity

- 19. A map of the local vicinity is attached as appendix F. The premises is identified at the centre of the map as a black diamond and labelled as Costcutter. For the purposes of **scale only** the circle on the map has a 100-metre radius. Other licensed premises within the local vicinity are also shown on the map.
- 20. Council assembly approved the third revision of Southwark's statement of licensing policy on 2 April 2008. Sections of the statement that are considered to be of particular relevance to this application are
 - a) Section 3 which sets out the purpose and scope of the policy and re-inforces the four licensing objectives
 - b) Section 5 which sets out the council's approach with regard to the imposition of conditions including mandatory conditions to be attached to the licence

- Section 6 details other relevant council and government policies, strategies, responsibilities and guidance, including the relevant articles under the Human Rights Act 1998
- d) Section 7 provides general guidance on dealing with crime and disorder and deals with licensing hours
- e) Section 8 provides general guidance on ensuring public safety including safe capacities
- f) Section 9 provides general guidance on the prevention of nuisance
- g) Section 10 provides general guidance on the protection of children from harm.
- 21. The purpose of Southwark's statement of licensing policy is to make clear to applicants what considerations will be taken into account when determining applications and should act as a guide to the sub-committee when considering the applications. However, the sub-committee must always consider each application on its own merits and allow exceptions to the normal policy where these are justified by the circumstances of the application.

RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

22. A fee of £190 has been paid by the applicant company in respect of this application being the statutory fee payable for premises within non-domestic rateable value band B.

CONSULTATIONS

23. Consultation has been carried out on this application in accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. An inspection of the premises was carried out on the 22nd of April 2009 and the notice was displayed correctly.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES IMPLICATIONS

24. Each application is required by law to be considered upon its own individual merits with all relevant matters taken into account.

CONCURRENT REPORT BY THE STRATEGIC DIRECTOR OF COMMUNITIES, LAW & GOVERNANCE

- 25. The sub-committee is asked to determine the application for a premises licence under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 26. The principles which sub-committee members must apply are set out below.

Principles for making the determination

- 27. The general principle is that applications for premises licence applications must be granted unless relevant representations are received. This is subject to the proviso that the applicant has complied with regulations in advertising and submitting the application.
- 28. Relevant representations are those which
- Are about the likely effect of the granting of the application on the promotion of the licensing objectives
- Are made by an interested party or responsible authority

- Have not been withdrawn.
- Are not, in the opinion of the relevant licensing authority, frivolous or vexatious.
- 29. If relevant representations are received then the sub-committee must have regard to them, in determining whether it is necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives to
 - (a) to grant the licence subject to-
 - (i) The conditions mentioned in section 18 (2)(a) modified to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and
 - (ii) Any condition which must under section 19,20 or 21be included in the licence in the licence
 - (b) to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
 - (c) to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor;
 - (d) to reject the application.

Conditions

30. The sub-committee's discretion is thus limited. It can only modify the conditions put forward by the applicant, or refuse the application, if it is necessary to do so. Section 18 (5) of the Act states that conditions are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

Conditions must be necessary and proportionate for the promotion of one of the four licensing objectives, and not for any other reason. Conditions must also be within the control of the licensee, and should be worded in a way which is clear, certain, consistent and enforceable.

- 31. The four licensing objectives are
 - The prevention of crime and disorder;
 - Public safety;
 - The prevention of nuisance; and
 - The protection of children from harm.
- 32. Members should note that each objective is of equal importance. There are no other licensing objectives, and the four objectives are paramount considerations at all times.
- 33. Conditions will not be necessary if they duplicate a statutory position. Conditions relating to night café and take away aspect of the license must relate to the night time operation of the premises and must not be used to impose conditions which could not be imposed on day time operators.
- 34. Members are also referred to the DCMS guidance on conditions, specifically section 7, and Annexes D, E, F and G.

Reasons

35. If the sub-committee determines that it is necessary to modify the conditions, or to refuse the application for a premises licence application, it must give reasons for its decision

Hearing procedures

- 36. Subject to the licensing hearing regulations, the licensing committee may determine its own procedures. Key elements of the regulations are that
- The hearing shall take the form of a discussion led by the authority. Cross examination shall not be permitted unless the authority considered that it is required for it to consider the representations
- Members of the authority are free to ask any question of any party or other person appearing at the hearing
- The committee must allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights to
 - Address the authority
 - o If given permission by the committee, question any other party.
 - o In response to a point which the authority has given notice it will require clarification, give further information in support of their application.
- The committee shall disregard any information given by a party which is not relevant
 - o to the particular application before the committee, and
 - o the licensing objectives.
- The hearing shall be in public, although the committee may exclude the public from all or part of a hearing where it considers that the public interest in doing so outweighs the public interest in the hearing, or that part of the hearing, taking place in private.
- In considering any representations or notice made by a party the authority may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice (as applicable) either before the hearing or, with the consent of all the other parties, at the hearing.
- 37. This matter relates to the determination of an application for a premises licence under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regulation 26(1) (a) requires the sub-committee to make its determination at the conclusion of the hearing.

Council's multiple roles and the role of the licensing sub-committee

- 38. Sub-committee members will note that, in relation to this application, the council has multiple roles. Council officers from various departments have been asked to consider the application from the perspective of the council as authority responsible respectively for environmental health, trading standards, health and safety and as the planning authority.
- 39. Members should note that the licensing sub-committee is meeting on this occasion solely to perform the role of licensing authority. The sub-committee sits in quasijudicial capacity, and must act impartially. It must offer a fair and unbiased hearing of the application. In this case, members should disregard the council's broader policy objectives and role as statutory authority in other contexts. Members must direct themselves to making a determination solely based upon the licensing law, guidance and the council's statement of licensing policy.
- 40. As a quasi-judicial body the licensing sub-committee is required to consider the application on its merits. The sub-committee must take into account only relevant factors, and ignore irrelevant factors. The decision must be based on evidence, that is to say material, which tends logically to show the existence or non-existence of relevant facts, or the likelihood or unlikelihood of the occurrence of some future event, the occurrence of which would be relevant. The licensing sub-committee must give fair consideration to the contentions of all persons entitled to make representations to them.

- 41. The licensing sub-committee is entitled to consider events outside of the premises if they are relevant, i.e. are properly attributable to the premises being open. The proprietors do not have to be personally responsible for the incidents for the same to be relevant. However, if such events are not properly attributable to the premises being open, then the evidence is not relevant and should be excluded. Guidance is that the licensing authority will primarily focus on the direct impact of the activities taking place at the licensed premises on members of the public, living, working or engaged in normal activity in the area concerned.
- 42. Members will be aware of the council's code of conduct which requires them to declare personal and prejudicial interests. The code applies to members when considering licensing applications. In addition, as a quasi-judicial body, members are required to avoid both actual bias, and the appearance of bias.
- 43. The sub-committee can only consider matters within the application that have been raised through representations from interested parties and responsible authorities. Interested parties must live in the vicinity of the premises. This will be decided on a case to case basis.
- 44. Under the Human Rights Act 1998. The sub committee needs to consider the balance between the rights of the applicant and those making representations to the application when making their decision. The sub-committee has a duty under section 17 Crime and Disorder Act 1998 when making its decision to do all it can to prevent crime and disorder in the borough.
- 45. Interested parties, responsible authorities and the applicant have the right to appeal the decision of the sub-committee to the Magistrates' Court within a period of 21 days beginning with the day on which the applicant was notified by the licensing authority of the decision to be appealed against.

Guidance

46. Members are required to have regard to the DCMS guidance in carrying out the functions of licensing authority. However, guidance does not cover every possible situation, so long as the guidance has been properly and carefully understood, members may depart from it if they have reason to do so. Full reasons must be given if this is the case.


