A new youth hub is to be built in Belair Park it will house an outdoor education centre which will be a borough wide resource. It will support more young people into accessing The Duke of Edinburgh qualification.

Building work was due to start in February 2010 ready for completion in November 2010 in partnership with the environment and housing (leisure) department.
