RECOMMENDATION

1. That the Licensing Sub-Committee considers an application made by Alvin and Avril Cole for a grant of a Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of the premises known as: Nivla Restaurant, Nivla Restaurant, 51 Camberwell Road, London SE5 0EZ.

2. Notes:

- a) This application forms a new application for a Premises Licence, under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003. The application is subject to representations from a Responsible Authority and Interested Parties and is therefore referred to the Sub-Committee for determination;
- b) Paragraphs 8 to 13 of this report provide a summary of the application the Premises Licence under consideration by the Sub-Committee (A copy of the full application is provided as Appendix a and appendix b amended schedule)
- c) Paragraphs 14 to 16 of this report deal with the representations received to the Premises Licence application. (A copy of each of the relevant representations are attached as Appendices c & d).

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Licensing Act 2003

- 3. The Licensing Act 2003 received Royal Assent on 10 July 2003. The Act provides a new licensing regime for
 - a) The sale of and supply of alcohol
 - b) The provision of regulated entertainment
 - c) The provision of late night refreshment
- 4. Within Southwark, the licensing responsibility is wholly administered by this Council.
- 5. The Act requires the licensing authority to carry out its functions under the Act with a view to promoting the four stated licensing objectives. These are
 - a) The prevention of crime and disorder;
 - b) The promotion of public safety
 - c) The prevention of nuisance; and
 - d) The protection of children from harm.
 - 6. In carrying out its licensing functions, a licensing authority must also have regard to

- a. The Act itself:
- b. The Guidance to the act issued under Section 182 of the Act;
- c. Secondary regulations issued under the Act;
- d. The Licensing Authority's own Statement of Licensing Policy
- e. The application, including the operating schedule submitted as part of the application
- f. Relevant representations
- 7. The applications process involves the provision of all relevant information required under the Act to the licensing authority with copies provided by the applicant to the relevant responsible bodies under the Act. The application must also be advertised at the premises and in the local press. The responsible authorities and other interested parties within the local community may make representations on any part of the application where relevant to the four licensing objectives.

MATTERS FOR CONSIDERATION

The Application for a New Grant

8. On 26 April 2010, an application was made by Alvin and Avril Cole for a grant of a Premises Licence in respect of both the basement and ground floor of the premises known as Nivla Restaurant, 51 Camberwell Road, London SE5 OEZ under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003. A copy of the application is attached to the report as appendix a.

Reduction in Hours

- 9. After considering representations received from both the Metropolitan Police and the Environmental Protection Team the operating schedule and hours requested have been amended. A copy of the statement requesting amendments to the application is attached as appendix b.
- 10. The application is therefore summarized as follows:

To permit the provision of regulated entertainment

- (recorded music and performance of dance)
 - o Monday to Thursday 11.00 to 00.00
 - o Friday and Saturday 10.00 to 02.00 on the day following
 - o Sunday between 14.00 hrs to 23.00
- To permit the provision of late night refreshment
 - Monday to Thursday 23.00 to 00.00
 - o Friday and Saturday 23.00 to 02.00 on the day following
 - Sunday between 14.00 hrs to 23.00
- To permit the sale and or supply of alcohol
 - Monday to Thursday 11.00 to 00.00
 - o Friday and Saturday 10.00 to 02.00 on the day following
 - Sunday between 14.00 hrs to 23.00
- Proposed opening hours of the premises are
 - Monday to Thursday from 07.00 to 00.30.
 - Friday and Saturday 07.00 to 02.30 on the day following

- Sunday from 13.00 hrs to 23.30
- 11. The application form provides the applicant's operating schedule. Parts F, G, L M and O set out the proposed operating hours in full.
- 12. Part P of the application and appendix b provides any additional steps that are proposed by the applicant to promote the four licensing objectives as set out in the Licensing Act 2003. In the event that the Sub-Committee should approve the application any proposals stated here must become conditions on any subsequent Premises Licence issued.

Designated Premises Supervisor

13. The proposed designated premises supervisor Licence is Avril Cole. Note (however, Avril Cole is in the process of qualifying and obtaining a personal licence).

Representations From Interested Parties

14. There are six representations lodged by interested parties. The same letter has been submitted by all parties). The representation is primarily concerned with the possibility of noise nuisance, and anti social behaviour that may be experienced as a result of the proposed grant. A copy of the representation is attached as appendix c to the report.

Representations From Responsible Authorities

15. There are two representations lodged by the Metropolitan Police and the Council's Environmental Protection Team (EPT). Both representations outline control measures that should be undertaken to reduce the risk of crime and disorder and noise nuisance if the licence is granted. Copies of the representations are attached as appendix d to the report.

Conciliation

16. Conciliation was offered as part of the application process. This led to an amendment of the operating schedule and the reduction in hours (see appendix b). However both the Metropolitan Police and EPT are not satisfied that noise and disorder issues have been resolved. Copies of the email detailing this are attached as appendix d1. As such the application is being submitted for determination by the Licensing Sub-Committee.

The Local Area

- 17. A map of the local vicinity is attached appendix e. For the purposes of scale only the circle on the map has a 100-metre radius. The operating terminal hours of the following premises licensed for regulated entertainment and late night refreshment are shown on the map.
 - T Bar, 39 45 Camberwell Road (Mon -Sun 03.30)
 - D'Eclipse Bar & Restaurant (Sun Thurs 00.30, Fri & Sat 03.00)
 - Alabarma, 11 John Ruskin Street (Sun Thurs -02.00; Fri & Sat until 03.00)
 - Alabarma, 13 John Ruskin Street (Sun Thurs -00.00; Fri & Sat until 01.00)
 - Emukay Restaurant 91 Camberwell Rd (Mon Sun: until 02:30hrs)

Late night refreshment

- Red Sea restaurant, 85 Camberwell Rd (Mon Sun until 01.00 hrs)
- Winner, 3 Westmoreland Road, SE17 (Mon Thurs till 00:00; Fri & Sa till 00.30; Sun till 23.30)

Southwark council statement of licensing policy

Council assembly approved the Southwark's statement of licensing policy on 4 November 2009. Sections of the statement that are considered to be of particular relevance to this application are.

- Section 3 which sets out the purpose and scope of the policy and reinforces the four licensing objectives;
- Section 5 which sets out the council's approach with regard to the imposition of conditions including mandatory conditions to be attached to the licence;
- Section 6 details other relevant council and government policies, strategies, responsibilities and guidance, including the relevant articles under the Human Rights Act 1998:
- Section 7 provides general guidance on dealing with crime and disorder and deals with licensing hours;
- Section 8 provides general guidance on ensuring public safety including safe capacities;
- Section 9 provides general guidance on the prevention of nuisance; and
- Section 10 provides general guidance on the protection of children from harm.
- 18. The purpose of Southwark's statement of licensing policy is to make clear to applicants what considerations will be taken into account when determining applications and should act as a guide to the sub-committee when considering the applications. However, the sub-committee must always consider each application on its own merits and allow exceptions to the normal policy where these are justified by the circumstances of the application.

RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

19. A fee of £190.00 has been paid by the applicant in respect of this application being the statutory fee payable for premises within non-domestic rateable value Band B.

CONSULTATIONS

20. Consultation has been carried out on this application in accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. A public notice was placed in the 'Southwark News' and a similar notice exhibited outside of the premises.

COMMUNITY IMPACT STATEMENT

21. Each application is required by law to be considered upon its own individual merits with all relevant matters taken into account.

SUPPLEMENTARY ADVICE FROM OTHER OFFICERS

Strategic Director of Communities, Law & Governance

- 22. The Sub-Committee is asked to determine the application for a grant of a premises licence.
- 23. The Sub-Committee can only consider matters within the application that have been raised through representations from interested parties and responsible authorities. Interested Parties must live in the vicinity of the premises. This will be decided on a case-by-case basis.

- 24. Under the Human Rights Act 1998, the Sub-Committee needs to consider the balance between the rights of the applicant and those making representations to the application when making their decision. The Sub-Committee has a duty under Section 17 Crime and Disorder Act 1998 when making its decision to do all it can to prevent and crime and disorder in the Borough.
- 25. Interested Parties, Responsible Authorities and the applicant have the right to appeal the decision of the Sub-Committee to the Magistrates' Court within a period of 21 days beginning with day on which the applicant was notified by the licensing authority of the decision to be appealed against.
- 26. The principles that Sub-Committee members must apply are set out below.

Principles for making the determination

- 27. The general principle is that applications for Premises Licence applications must be granted unless relevant representations are received. This is subject to the proviso that the applicant has complied with regulations in advertising and submitting the application.
- 28. Relevant representations are those which
- Are about the likely effect of the granting of the application on the promotion of the licensing objectives
- Are made by an interested party or responsible authority
- Have not been withdrawn (in this case, the initial objections from the Fire Service have been withdrawn).
- Are not, in the opinion of the relevant licensing authority, frivolous or vexatious.
 - 29. If relevant representations are received then the Sub-Committee must have regard to them, in determining whether it is necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives to
- Add to, omit, and/or alter the conditions of the licence or,
- Reject the whole or part of the application

Conditions

- 30. The Sub-Committee's discretion is thus limited. It can only modify the conditions put forward by the applicant, or refuse the application, if it is necessary to do so. Conditions must be necessary and proportionate for the promotion of one of the four licensing objectives, and not for any other reason. Conditions must also be within the control of the licensee, and should be worded in a way which is clear, certain, consistent and enforceable.
- 31. The four licensing objectives are
 - a. The prevention of crime and disorder;
 - b. Public safety:
 - c. The prevention of nuisance; and
 - d. The protection of children from harm.
- 32. Members should note that each objective is of equal importance. There are no other licensing objectives, and the four objectives are paramount considerations at all times.

- 33. Conditions will not be necessary if they duplicate a statutory position. Conditions relating to late night refreshment and take away aspect of the license must relate to the night time operation of the premises and must not be used to impose conditions which could not be imposed on day time operators.
- 34. The Licensing Act requires mandatory conditions in respect of supply of alcohol, the exhibition of films and in respect of door supervisors.
- 35. Members are also referred to the DCMS guidance on conditions, specifically section 7, and Annexes D, E, F and G.

Reasons

36. If the Sub-Committee determines that it is necessary to modify the conditions, or to refuse the application, it must give reasons for its decision.

Hearing Procedures

- 37. Subject to the Licensing Hearing regulations, the Licensing Committee may determine its own procedures. Key elements of the regulations are that
- The hearing shall take the form of a discussion led by the authority. Cross examination shall not be permitted unless the authority considered that it is required for it to consider the representations
- Members of the authority are free to ask any question of any party or other person appearing at the hearing
- The committee must allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights to
 - Address the authority
 - o If given permission by the committee, question any other party.
 - o In response to a point which the authority has given notice it will require clarification, give further information in support of their application.
- The committee shall disregard any information given by a party which is not relevant
 - o to the particular application before the committee, and
 - the licensing objectives.
- The hearing shall be in public, although the committee may exclude the public from all
 or part of a hearing where it considers that the public interest in doing so outweighs the
 public interest in the hearing, or that part of the hearing, taking place in private.
- In considering any representations or notice made by a party the authority may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice (as applicable) either before the hearing or, with the consent of all the other parties, at the hearing.
 - 38. As this matter relates to the determination of an application for a grant under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003, regulation 26(1)(a) requires the Sub-Committee to make its determination at the conclusion of the hearing.

Council's multiple roles and the role of the Licensing Sub-Committee

- 39. Sub-Committee members will note that, in relation to this application, the Council has multiple roles. Council officers from various departments have been asked to consider the application from the perspective of the Council as authority responsible respectively for environmental health, trading standards, health and safety and as the planning authority.
- 40. Members should note that the Licensing Sub-Committee is meeting on this occasion solely to perform the role of licensing authority. The Sub-Committee sits in quasijudicial capacity, and must act impartially. It must offer a fair and unbiased hearing of the application. In this case, Members should disregard the Council's broader policy objectives and role as statutory authority in other contexts. Members must direct themselves to making a determination solely based upon the Licensing Law, Guidance and the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy.
- 41. As a quasi-judicial body the Licensing Sub-Committee is required to consider the application on its merits. The Sub-Committee must take into account only relevant factors, and ignore irrelevant factors. The decision must be based on evidence, that is to say material, which tends logically to show the existence or non-existence of relevant facts, or the likelihood or unlikelihood of the occurrence of some future event, the occurrence of which would be relevant. The Licensing Sub-Committee must give fair consideration to the contentions of all persons entitled to make representations to them.
- 42. The Licensing Sub-Committee is entitled to consider events outside of the premises if they are relevant, i.e. are properly attributable to the premises being open. The proprietors do not have to be personally responsible for the incidents for the same to be relevant. However, if such events are not properly attributable to the premises being open, then the evidence is not relevant and should be excluded. Guidance is that the licensing authority will primarily focus on the direct impact of the activities taking place at the licensed premises on members of the public, living, working or engaged in normal activity in the area concerned.
- 43. Members will be aware of the Council's Code of Conduct that requires them to declare personal and prejudicial interests. The Code applies to Members when considering licensing applications. In addition, as a quasi-judicial body, Members are required to avoid both actual bias, and the appearance of bias.

Guidance

44. Members are required to have regard to the DCMS Guidance in carrying out the functions of licensing authority. However, guidance does not cover every possible situation, so long as the guidance has been properly and carefully understood, members may depart from it if they have reason to do so. Full reasons must be given if this is the case.

Thanks for meeting with me yesterday in which we discussed appropriated steps required to satisfy the objections received.

In direct response to the objections from Environmental Protection Team, Metropolitan Police Services Licensing Office and Residences, the Management of Nivla Restaurant has decided to make the following amendment to its License application.

Provision of regulated entertainment

- e) Live Music: As a consequence of the objections received the management of Nivla Restaurant has decided to delete this activity from its application.
- f) **Recorded Music:** The following days and times will now apply: Monday to Thursday 11am 00:00 hrs, Friday to Saturday 10am 02:00hrs and Sunday from 14:00 23:00 hr.

This will be played on a mini hi fi system on the ground floor as background music.

The basement will double up as a restaurant/ lounge with low and more relaxing music on an amplified hi fi system. It will also be used for private functions such as parties, meeting etc which may involve some music and dancing and this will be based on customer's booking usually for Fridays and Saturdays but cannot say the frequency. We are therefore in the process of installing a sound sensor in the basement to be able to keep amplified music to an acceptable level.

In regards to noise during function that requires amplified music in the basement area, noise reducing foam has been installed into the roof cavity on both the basement and ground floors. Speakers will be redirected so that sound bounces off the floor instead of the walls and ceiling to reduce disturbance to neighbours and all the doors will be kept shut at from 10pm till closing time. Both exit doors in the basements are fire doors with insulations stripes which reduces escape of noise. The emergency exit via the secondary stairway direct to the street would be closed from 10pm during regulated activities to help reduces noise level during the night. Fire exits will be clearly identified, clear of obstruction and locked at all times.

No movement of musical or amplification equipment will take place from the premises between 12:00 midnight and 8:00 am. Infact as we no longer required live music and the provision of making music there will no be a need for movement of musical or amplification equipment.

g) **Performances of Dance**:. The following days and times will now apply: Monday to Thursday 11am - 00:00 hrs, Friday to Saturday 10am - 02:00hrs and Sunday from 14:00-23:00 hr. This will take place on the basement level of the premises. An extractor fan has been installed in the basement and currently there are two free standing circulating fans to provide ventilation. At present we are taking advice on the installation of several wall fans and other alternative cooling system. This process and imminent installation should happen by the end of June 2010.

Provision of entertainment facilities

- i) **Making Music**: As a consequence of the objections received the management of Nivla Restaurant has decided to delete this activity from its application.
- j) Facilities for dancing Dancing: As a consequence of the objections received the management of Nivla Restaurant has decided to delete this activity from its application

1) Provision of late night refreshment

The following days and times will now apply: Monday to Thursday 11pm - 00:00 hrs, Friday to Saturday 11pm - 02:00hrs.

With regards to people noise outside of the premises, we will limit the number of people going out for a cigarette to no more than five at a time. We will also not allow people to take there drinks with them when going out for a cigarette.

We are also going to put up notices on the exit and we will tell our patrons when they are paying there bills to leave the premises quietly and in and orderly manner without any disturbance.

We have installed a 6 camera CCTV system on the premises that is capable of capturing an image of every person that enters the premises from any entrance. The cameras will be live whenever the premise is in use. This will also act as a deterrent and as an additional control measure to anyone wanting to disturb this peace. The CCTV footage will be kept for a period of 30 days and will be available for inspection.

A personal licence holder will be on the premises most times but on the absent of the personal licence holder, permission will be given to a responsible individual.

m) Supply of Alcohol

The following days and times will now apply: Monday to Thursday 11am - 00:00 hrs, Friday to Saturday 10am - 02:00hrs and Sunday from 14:00 - 23:00 hr.

Staff will be trained to prevent the supply of alcohol to under age drinkers by adopting a challenge 21 policy for dealing with proof of age whereby staff will request customers to prove they are over 18 if they are believe to be under the age of 21.

To prevent drunkenness and disorderly conduct on the premises we will not sell or authorised to sell alcohol knowingly to a person who is drunk or who appears drunk.

We will not allow alcohol to be obtain for someone who is drunk

o) Hours open to public:

The following days and times will now apply: Monday to Thursday 7am - 00:30 hrs, Friday to Saturday 7am - 02:30hrs and Sunday from 13:00 - 23:30 hr.

Nivla Restaurant at the core of its operations seeks to provide a tranquil for people to come and enjoy some of the best home cooked food and music from sub Sahara Africa. It also seeks to provide facilities where business meeting, conferences and parties could be held up to the operating hours as and when required. It was never intended to be operated as a club. We will try and work with all relevant authorities to make the community a safer place to live and do business. We believe and business and brand will attracts descent clientele to the area.

We are committed to joining local scheme that prevent misuse of drugs, drunken and disorderly behaviour in the community. All matters relating to drugs will be in accordance with the Met Best Practice Guide on the handling of drugs.

Dear Sir/Madame,

I am writing to you to lodge an objection against license application no. 831905 submitted by Avril Cole and Alvin Cole for the premises of Nivla Restaurant at 51 Camberwell Road, SE5 0EZ.

The reason for the objection is that the above license application proposes activities which would result in the depreciation of quality of life for the residents of . We are concerned that the sale of alcohol and the provision of live and recorded music entertainment and facilities for dancing from 10am to 4am seven days a week will result in a significant increase in the level of noise throughout and around the building and will deteriorate safety in the area.

Based on our past experience of similar activities at the premises, we fear that the proposed music entertainment would be heard throughout the building and would cause serious disturbance at night. The building is an old, period terrace house with timber floors and light weight plasterboard walls, which are most likely not up to todays construction standards in terms of resistance to the passage of sound as set out by part E of the Building Regulations. Therefore, when previous owners of the premises hosted events involving the same activities, despite the installation of a sound limiting device, the music sent reverberations through the structure and could be clearly heard throughout the building including our upper floor bedrooms. This has caused many sleepless nights and continuous conflicts with the operators of the premises. As far as I know, both the police and the Southwark Noise Team were notified on a number of occasions but, despite their actions, the nuisance continued. Although a sound limiting device was installed, the music remained audible and eventually forced the previous tenants to move out of the building.

Although, these events in the past took place under a different management, they are indicative of how granting the license this time around would affect us and other nearby residents. Knowing how parties held once or twice a week until about 2 am interrupted our lives, the prospect of having to face the same nuisance every single day and until even later into the morning is terrifying to all of the tenants. One can easily imagine the stress that prolonged sleep deprivation would cause and how that would affect our personal and professional lives. One can also easily imagine the devastating impact listening to thumping music in the night would have on the development of young children in the family residing

Besides the nuisance caused by the music played inside, the noise from party-goers spilling out onto the street in the middle of the night is also of grave concern to us. In the past, the occasional arguments or fights outside the premises or even just smokers talking

loudly or cars stopping to drop off or pick up guests have been clearly audible through our aged, single glazed sash windows.


In addition to the disturbance caused by the noise from the music and the guests loitering outside, we are also afraid of the implications that late night entertainment in combination with alcohol would have on safety in the area. In the past, we have witnessed a number of fights between guests of these premises and also fights connected to another similar establishment, the DEclipse Bar, located a few buildings further south on Camberwell Road. Some of these incidents involved knives and guns, which have made some of us feel uneasy about returning home or leaving the building at night. With the entrance door to our flats and the entrance door to Nivla Restaurant located on a narrow stretch of pavement we would potentially have to pass through a large number of alcohol influenced guests lingering outside the premises or queuing to be admitted to enter the stair hall to the flats. This, given the violent history of night clubs in the area, can in itself become an intimidating and uncomfortable experience due to the risk of being caught up in a conflict.

To sum up, on grounds of public safety and noise pollution we, the residents of the ask you not to grant license for the proposed activities. We strongly feel that this venue, in this building is not suitable for hosting the night club, which the proposed license would allow.

I write in respect of the above premises for which I wish to make the following representations/objections to the granting of a Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003.

Regrettably the applicant has failed to adequately address the four main Licensing Objectives by offering control measures that would ensure that there would be no detrimental effect upon the local community and indicate that the management of the premises have given sufficient consideration to the licensing objectives. The applicant has applied for extended hours on each day of the week, but has not offered any additional control measures that would normally be placed on a premises licence that operates such extended hours.

Therefore I have attached a list of sample conditions for the applicant to consider and which Police would like to see placed on the varied premises licence.

- 1. That there shall be no movement of musical or amplification equipment from the premises between the hours of 12.00 midnight and 8.00 am.
- 2. That SIA registered Door Supervisors, at least one of whom shall be a female, shall be employed at all times after 22.00hrs and the terminal hour that the premises are in use under this licence and provided with Hand held metal detection units in order to ensure that searches are carried out in respect of all admissions to the premises, whether members of the public or performers and their assistants and Mechanical counting devices to ensure that the maximum accommodation limit of the premises is not
- 3. That signs shall be displayed in the entrance foyer to the premises that state 'Drugs Free Zone' and 'No Search No Entry, Management reserve the right to refuse entry'

- 4. That all matters relating to drugs shall be in accordance with the Metropolitan Police Best Practice Guide on the handling of drugs in pubs and clubs
- 5. That suitable notices shall be displayed and announcements made requesting people to leave the premises in a quiet and orderly manner so as not to disturb local residents
- 6. That a CCTV system be installed at the premises and be maintained in good working order and be continually recording at all times the premises are in use under the licence. The CCTV System must be capable of capturing an image of every person who enters the premises.
- 7. That all CCTV footage shall be kept for a period of thirty one (31) days and shall, upon request, be made immediately available to Officers of the Police and the Council
- 8. That you shall require any regular and external promoters hiring the premises to complete the 'Venue Hire Agreement' provided by Southwark Council and, once completed, you shall ensure that a copy of the agreement is provided to the Police and Licensing Unit a minimum of fourteen days prior to the date of hire.
- 9. That a Personal Licence holder is on the premises and on duty at **all** times that intoxicating liquor is supplied.
- 10. That the Premises Licence holder and/or Designated Premises Supervisor join and support a local Pub Watch Scheme should there be one in existence for the area in which the premises is located.
- 11. There shall be no new entry or re-entry to the premises after 02.00am.
- 12. Customers shall use no outside area after 22.00hrs other than those who temporarily leave the premises to smoke a cigarette. Those who do temporarily leave for this reason shall be the subjected to the requirement of a further search.
- 13. Customers shall use no outside area after 22.00hrs other than those who temporarily leave the premises to smoke a cigarette. Those who do temporarily leave for this reason shall be the subjected to the requirement of a further search.

Police would welcome the opportunity of a conciliation meeting with all interested parties.

The applicant seeks a license for live and recorded music and dancing 7 days a week until 0400

The premises is a ground floor bar and restaurant with steps down the basement beneath residential accommodation fronting Walworth Road. There is a history of noise disturbance arising from music affecting the residents above during its two previous management arrangements, which need to be taken into account in both the applicants operating schedule and the refurbishment of the premises - which was ongoing at time of visit.

It is understood that both ground floors and basement will be equipped with sound making equipment. It is not clear from the applicant the extent of current amplification and speaker equipment which is to be re-utilised or how the amplification systems is to be managed and regulated.

The ground floor entrance is lobbied, however the doors are ill-fitting and are a potential source of sound escape. There is no means of ventilating the premises, which may lead to the entrance doors being opened during performance of regulated entertainment late into the night

The basement is entered form a stairway down from the ground floor, there would be potential for sounds to generate to the ground floor. This basement is not equipped with ventilation other than a portable circulating fan which is to be re-used. The emergency exit via secondary stairway direct to street, would appear to have been used as the location of /or route to a smoking area and has the potential to sound escape.

I do not believe the terminal hours for patrons to be on/ or leaving could be accommodated until 0400 7 days a week.

The applicant has not adequately addressed the prevention of public nuisance from music sounds and / or patron use in the application.

I have discussed my concerns with the applicant regarding entrance and exit doors, inadequacy of ventilation and potential for and sound escape with the applicant. However more information will be required on the sound making equipment and facilities, its location and control, and extent of sound insulation measures undertaken both during refurbishment and that proposed before I can propose conditions

I therefore object to the application

Applicant advises in process of installing sound sensor.

EPT: The applicant proposal may not be adequate and has not been examined

Suggested Condition: that all the proposed amplification and speakers be installed in their proposed operational positions, that all amplification circuits be controlled through a sound limitation installation, which shall be set after completion of sound insulation works, to a level in the presence of EPT and in conjunction with assessment in adjoining residential accommodation. That once set no additional speakers or amplification be brought onto the premises or the layout re- configured without consent and re-checking of the Sound Limiter Level. The sound limiter control equipment shall be kept in a secure location and shall not be interfrred with.

Sound insulation has been installed

Applicant advises in process of installing sound insulation to 'roof' cavity of basement and ground floor. EPT: The applicant proposal may not be adequate and has not been examined; there is concern that music sounds may penetrate up through the open stairway and also may be structure borne through the flank wall

Suggested Condition: that works of sound insulation / isolation shall be adequate to resist both air borne and structure borne sounds from affecting the adjoining residential accommodation when tested under operational levels in conjunction with the sound limitation installation . Speakers shall be floor mounted where practical using isolation material; where wall mounted brackets shall be isolated from wall and /or columns.

Fire Exit door to stairway up to street will be kept shut except in emergency

Agreed by EPT

I am not satisfied that the free standing circulating fans will provide adequate ventilation to the basement to accommodate regulated entertainment to the terminal hour without a means of chilling and replacing air.

Applicant advises that taking advice on installation of wall fans or alternative cooling EPT: The applicants proposal may not be adequate

Suggested Condition: that suitable and sufficient permanent means of ventilation be installed in the basement and operated during performance of regulated entertainment to ensure both extraction and replacement of fresh / chilled air [approx 10-12 air changes per hour with capability iof 18°C]


With regard to people noise outside of the premises, we need to consider a limit on the number of smokers, a condition which does not permit drinks to be taken out by smokers and more robust arrangement to ensure patrons leave the vicinity on departure without disturbance.

Applicants have indicated that they will limit numbers of smokers outside to 5 at any one time and that Agreed EPT they will not be permitted to take drinks with them

At this stage I am not in a position to fully withdraw my reprenstsation until the suggested conditions have been agreed

RECOMMENDATION

1. That the licensing sub-committee considers an application made by Richard Bennetts to vary the premises licence granted under the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of the premises known as Wazobia Restaurant, 670 Old Kent Road, London, SE15 1JF.

2. Notes:

- The application seeks to vary existing licensable activities held under current legislation in respect of the premises known as Wazobia Restaurant, 670 Old Kent Road, London, SE15 1JF under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003. Existing permitted licensable activities are not the subject of representations and are not under consideration at this meeting. The variation application is subject to representations from interested parties and is therefore referred to the Sub-Committee for determination:
- Paragraphs 12 to 15 of this report provide a summary of the application under consideration by the Sub-Committee (A copy of the full application is provided as appendix A). and
- Paragraphs 17 21 of this report deals with the representations and comments received to the application. (copies of relevant representations and conciliations are attached as appendices C and D).

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Licensing Act 2003

- 3. The Licensing Act 2003 received royal assent on 10 July 2003. The Act provided a new licensing regime for the following activities:
 - The sale of and supply of alcohol
 - The provision of regulated entertainment
 - The provision of late night refreshment
- 4. Within Southwark, this council wholly administers the licensing responsibility.
- 5. The Act requires the licensing authority to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the four stated licensing objectives. These are
 - The prevention of crime and disorder;
 - The promotion of public safety
 - The prevention of nuisance; and
 - The protection of children from harm.

- 6. In carrying out its licensing functions, a licensing authority must also have regard to
 - The Act itself;
 - The Guidance to the act issued under Section 182 of the Act;
 - Secondary regulations issued under the Act;
 - The licensing authority's own Statement of Licensing Policy
 - The application, including the operating schedule submitted as part of the application
 - Relevant representations
- 7. The Act provides licensing schemes for premises licences, club premises certificates, personal licences and temporary event notices.
- 8. In order to apply for a new premises licence or to vary an existing premises licence the applicant is required to provide all relevant information required to the licensing authority and to provide copies to the relevant responsible bodies under the Act. The application must also be advertised at the premises and in the local press. The responsible authorities and other interested parties within the local community may make representations on any part of the application where relevant to the four licensing objectives.

KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION

The current premises licence

- 9. The current licence in respect of the premises known as Wazobia Restaurant, 670 Old Kent Road, London, SE15 1JF was issued 23rd April 2009. It allows the following licensable activities.
 - Sale and Supply of alcohol to be consumed on the premises: Sunday - Thursday from 12.00- 00.00;
 Friday and Saturday from 12.00- 02.00
 - Late night refreshment: Sunday - Thursday from 23.00- 00.00; Friday and Saturday from 23.00- 02.00
 - Opening hours of the premises:
 Sunday Thursday from 12.00- 00.00;
 Friday and Saturday from 12.00- 02.00
- 10. A copy of the existing premises licence is attached as appendix B.

The variation application

11. On the 26th of April 2010, Richard Bennetts applied to this council to vary the existing premises licence issued in respect of the premises known as Wazobia Restaurant, 670 Old Kent Road, London, SE15 1JF under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003.

Details of the variation application

- 12. The variation application is summarized as follows:
 - To extend the hours permitted for the sale / supply of alcohol: Friday and Saturday from 02.00 04.00;
 - To extend the hours permitted for late night refreshment: Friday and Saturday from 02.00 04.00;

- To extend the opening hours of the premises Friday and Saturday from 02.00 04.30;
- To allow the provision of live music, recorded music, facilities for making music & facilities for dancing:

Sunday - Thursday from 12.00- 00.00; Friday and Saturday from 12.00- 04.00

- To change the time stated in conditions 315 & 424 from 22.00 to 01.00
- 13. A copy of the variation application is attached as appendix A to the report.
- 14. The variation application form provides the applicant's operating schedule. Parts E, F, I, J, L, M and O set out the proposed operating hours in full.
- 15. Part P of the variation application provides any additional steps that might be proposed by the applicant to promote the four licensing objectives as set out in the Licensing Act 2003. In the event that the sub-committee should approve the application any proposals stated here must become licence conditions.

Designated premises supervisor

16. The designated premises supervisor under the existing premises licence is Richard Bennetts who holds a personal licence issued by Hertsmere Borough council.

Representations from interested parties

17. There are representations submitted by seven local residents. The representations are primarily concerned with the prevention of public nuisance and the prevention of crime and disorder. The representations are attached as appendix C to the report.

Representations from responsible authorities

- 18. A representation was submitted by the metropolitan police. The representation was concerned that the licensing objectives had not been sufficiently addressed in regards to the proposed variation. The police suggested conditions that they recommended be applied to licence should the variation be granted.
- 19. After conciliation and agreement with the applicant, the applicant agreed to amend the application to include conditions suggested by the police and also to amend the proposed variation to the existing conditions of the licence. The police have withdrawn their representation and the correspondence is attached as appendix D to the report.
- 20. A representation was submitted by the council's Environmental Protection Team. The representation was concerned that the proposed variation could give rise to public nuisance.
- 21. After conciliation and agreement with the applicant, the applicant agreed to amend the application to include measures suggested by the Environmental Protection Team. The Environmental Protection Team have withdrawn their representation and the correspondence is attached as appendix D2 to the report.

Conciliation

22. It was not possible to reach a conciliation between the applicant and the interested parties.

Disability discrimination act

23. The Southwark Disablement Association has not made comments regarding this application.

Operating History of the premises

- 24. The current licensee, Mr. Richard Bennetts, applied for the premises licence that has been issued in respect of the premises on the 12 of January 2009. At the time of the application representations were submitted by interested parties and the police. The applicant was able to conciliate with the police but not the interested parties. A licensing sub-committee hearing was subsequently held on the 15th of April 2009 and the licence was approved with amendments to the permitted operating hours of the premises and permitted hours for licensable activities. A premises licence was duly granted in respect of the premises on the 23rd of April 2009.
- 25. On the 24th of October 2009 licensing officers conducted an inspection of the premises. During the inspection two breaches of licence were noted. The breaches related to a lack of signage requesting that customers leave the premises quietly and the lack of an SIA registered door supervisor being on duty. A warning letter was sent to the licensee in regards to the aforementioned breaches of licence. A copy of the warning letter is attached to this report as Appendix F.
- 26. On the 10th of March 2010 a re-inspection of the premises was conducted. At the time of the inspection the premises was found to be operating in full compliance with the premises licence issued in respect of the premises. A compliance letter was subsequently sent to the premises. A copy of the compliance letter is attached to this report as Appendix G.
- 27. On 26th April 2010 Richard Bennetts applied to this council to vary the existing premises licence issued in respect of the premises known as Wazobia Restaurant, 670 Old Kent Road, London, SE15 1JF under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003.

The local area

28. A map of the local area is attached as appendix E. The premises are identified by a diamond at the centre of the map. For purposes of scale-only a circle with a 100 meter radius is shown on the map. The following licensed premises are also shown on the map:

Southwark council Statement of Licensing Policy

- 29. Council assembly approved the Southwark Statement of Licensing Policy on 2 April 2008. Sections of the statement that are considered to be of particular relevance to this application are
 - Section 3 which sets out the purpose and scope of the policy and reinforces the four licensing objectives;
 - Section 5 which sets out the council's approach with regard to the imposition of conditions including mandatory conditions to be attached to the licence;
 - Section 6 details other relevant council and government policies, strategies, responsibilities and guidance, including the relevant articles under the Human Rights Act 1998;
 - Section 7 provides general guidance on dealing with crime and disorder and deals with licensing hours, as well as relating to cumulative effect and saturation policies;
 - Section 8 provides general guidance on ensuring public safety including safe capacities;
 - Section 9 provides general guidance on the prevention of nuisance
 - Section 10 provides general guidance on the protection of children from harm.
- 30. The purpose of Southwark's statement of licensing policy is to make clear to applicants what considerations will be taken into account when determining applications and should act as a guide to the sub-committee when considering the applications. However, the sub-committee must always consider each application on its own merits and allow exceptions to the normal policy where these are justified by the circumstances of the application.

RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

31. A fee of £190.00 has been paid by the applicant in respect of this application being the statutory fee payable for a premises within non-domestic rateable value band B.

CONSULTATIONS

32. Consultation has been carried out on this application in accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. A public notice was placed in a local news and a similar notice exhibited outside of the premises.

COMMUNITY IMPACT STATEMENT

33. Each application is required by law to be considered upon its own individual merits with all relevant matters taken into account.

SUPPLEMENTARY ADVICE FROM THE STRATEGIC DIRECTOR OF COMMUNITIES, LAW & GOVERNANCE

- 34. The sub-committee is asked to determine the application for a variation of a converted premises licence.
- 35. The requirement is to give all parties a fair, unbiased hearing.
- 36. The sub-committee can only consider matters within the application that have been raised through representations from interested parties and responsible authorities. Interested parties must live in the vicinity of the premises. This will be decided on a case-by-case basis.
- 37. Under the Human Rights Act 1998, the sub-committee needs to consider the balance between the rights of the applicant and those making representations to the application when making their decision. The sub-committee has a duty under Section 17 Crime and Disorder Act 1998 when making its decision to do all it can to prevent and crime and disorder in the borough.
- 38. Interested parties, responsible authorities and the applicant have the right to appeal the decision of the sub-committee to the Magistrates' Court within a period of 21 days beginning with day on which the applicant was notified by the licensing authority of the decision to be appealed against.
- 39. The principles that sub-committee members must apply are set out below.

Principles for making the determination

- 40. Section 35 of the Licensing Act 2003 sets out the licensing authority's powers and duties in considering the determination of an application for variation.
- 41. The general principle is that applications for variation must be granted unless relevant representations are received. This is subject to the proviso that the applicant has complied with regulations in advertising and submitting the application.
- 42. Relevant representations are those which
 - Are about the likely effect of the granting of the application on the promotion of the licensing objectives
 - Are made by an interested party or responsible authority
 - Have not been withdrawn
 - Are not, in the opinion of the relevant licensing authority, frivolous or vexatious.
- 43. If relevant representations are received then the sub-committee must have regard to them, in determining whether it is necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives to
 - Add to, omit, and/or alter the conditions of the licence or,
 - Reject the whole or part of the application for variation

Conditions

- 44. The sub-committee's discretion is thus limited. It can only modify the conditions put forward by the applicant, or refuse the variation, if it is necessary to do so. Conditions must be necessary and proportionate for the promotion of one of the four licensing objectives, and not for any other reason. Conditions must also be within the control of the licensee, and should be worded in a way which is clear, certain, consistent and enforceable.
- 45. The four licensing objectives are
 - The prevention of crime and disorder;
 - Public safety;
 - The prevention of nuisance; and
 - The protection of children from harm.
- 46. Members should note that each objective is of equal importance. There are no other licensing objectives, and the four objectives are paramount considerations at all times.
- 47. Conditions will not be necessary if they duplicate a statutory position. Conditions relating to late night refreshment and take away aspect of the licence must relate to the night time operation of the premises and must not be used to impose conditions which could not be imposed on day time operators.
- 48. The Licensing Act requires mandatory conditions in respect of supply of alcohol, the exhibition of films, in respect of door supervisors, irresponsible drinks promotions, alcohol dispensing, free tap water and minimum measures.
- 49. Members are also referred to the DCMS guidance on conditions, specifically section 7, and Annexes D, E, F and G.

Reasons

50. If the Sub-Committee determines that it is necessary to modify the conditions, or to refuse the application for variation, it must give reasons for its decision.

Hearing Procedures

- 51. Subject to the Licensing Hearing regulations, the Licensing Committee may determine its own procedures. Key elements of the regulations are that
 - The hearing shall take the form of a discussion led by the authority. Cross examination shall not be permitted unless the authority considered that it is required for it to consider the representations
 - Members of the authority are free to ask any question of any party or other person appearing at the hearing
 - The committee must allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights to
 - Address the authority
 - If given permission by the committee, question any other party.
 - In response to a point which the authority has given notice it will require clarification, give further information in support of their application.
 - The committee shall disregard any information given by a party which is not relevant
 - to the particular application before the committee, and
 - the licensing objectives.

- The hearing shall be in public, although the committee may exclude the public from all or part of a hearing where it considers that the public interest in doing so outweighs the public interest in the hearing, or that part of the hearing, taking place in private.
- In considering any representations or notice made by a party the authority may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice (as applicable) either before the hearing or, with the consent of all the other parties, at the hearing.
- 52. As this matter relates to the determination of an application to vary under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003, regulation 26(1)(a) requires the sub-committee to make its determination at the conclusion of the hearing.

Council's multiple roles and the role of the licensing sub-committee

- 53. Sub-committee members will note that, in relation to this application, the council has multiple roles. Council officers from various departments have been asked to consider the application from the perspective of the council as authority responsible respectively for environmental health, trading standards, health and safety and as the planning authority.
- 54. Members should note that the licensing sub-committee is meeting on this occasion solely to perform the role of licensing authority. The sub-committee sits in quasi-judicial capacity, and must act impartially. It must offer a fair and unbiased hearing of the application. In this case, Members should disregard the Council's broader policy objectives and role as statutory authority in other contexts. Members must direct themselves to making a determination solely based upon the licensing law, Guidance and the council's Statement of Licensing Policy.
- 55. As a quasi-judicial body the licensing sub-committee is required to consider the application on its merits. The sub-committee must take into account only relevant factors, and ignore irrelevant factors. The decision must be based on evidence, that is to say material, which tends logically to show the existence or non-existence of relevant facts, or the likelihood or unlikelihood of the occurrence of some future event, the occurrence of which would be relevant. The Licensing Sub-Committee must give fair consideration to the contentions of all persons entitled to make representations to them.
- 56. The licensing sub-committee is entitled to consider events outside of the premises if they are relevant, i.e. are properly attributable to the premises being open. The proprietors do not have to be personally responsible for the incidents for the same to be relevant. However, if such events are not properly attributable to the premises being open, then the evidence is not relevant and should be excluded. Guidance is that the licensing authority will primarily focus on the direct impact of the activities taking place at the licensed premises on members of the public, living, working or engaged in normal activity in the area concerned.
- 57. Members will be aware of the council's Code of Conduct that requires them to declare personal and prejudicial interests. The code applies to members when considering licensing applications. In addition, as a quasi-judicial body, Members are required to avoid both actual bias, and the appearance of bias.

Guidance

58. Members are required to have regard to the DCMS Guidance in carrying out the functions of licensing authority. However, guidance does not cover every possible situation, so long as the guidance has been properly and carefully understood,

members may depart from it if they have reason to do so. Full reasons must be given if this is the case.

Dear Sir/Madam,

We write with objections regarding the Notice of application for a Premises Licence made under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of the Wazobia Restaurant at 670 Old Kent Road, London SE15 1JF.

We have lived at our address (4 doors away from the new restaurant) for just over 40 years and have obviously seen many changes during that time. The main ones being an increase in crime, safety in our area, noise, nuisance, traffic and parking.

Unfortunately, we are already subjected to late night noise and nuisance from a club in Ruby Street which is a side road directly off of the Old Kent Road on the opposite side to us. The nuisance begins very late at night when cars and people on foot are making their way to the club, and then again when cars and again people on foot are leaving the club in the early hours of the morning. There is always the noise of cars tooting on their horns, people shouting and calling out to each other and of course where they have parked on the main road, the slamming of car doors. From time to time fights breaking out on the street, this in turn usually means that the police arrive with their sirens going, often 2-3 cars, but we have known as many as 7 police cars and also ambulances arriving where people have been injured in the fights. The police, we are sure will verify this.

All of the above, as already mentioned, are the existing problems we experience from a club on the opposite side of the road down a side turning. We are therefore aware of how this will increase if the licence application is granted at 670 Old Kent Road as the restaurant will only be 4 doors away from us and on the same side of the road.

As a point of interest there was a restaurant at 670 Old Kent Road a number of years ago, we were not aware at the time of an application for a licence for alcohol, nor a licence for music. The police attended on a weekly basis and the noise from music, drunken people on the street, cars illegally parked etc was very disturbing. We understand that the police finally took steps to have the restaurant closed down.

With regard to the current application, we assume a music licence has not been applied for or granted and are surprised therefore, that a restaurant would want to be open between midnight and 6.am.

Our immediate neighbours are in agreement to object to the application and have therefore signed this letter. Unfortunately, many of the other residents nearby are renting on a short time basis and therefore will be moving on.

We write with objections regarding the Notice of Application to Vary a Premises Licence made under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of Wazobia Restaurant at 670-672 Old Kent Road, London SE15 1JF.

At the beginning of last year the Wazobia Restaurant made an application for a Premises Licence made under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003. Objections were made in writing by us and others in a letter to you dated 9th February 2009 (copy attached). At a meeting attended by us and held by Southwark Council's Licensing Sub-Committee on 15th April 2009 at Peckham Town Hall the premises licence was approved with conditions. In a letter dated 21st April 2009 from Southwark Council, the Notice of Decision gave under Reasons:- "The sub-committee believed that to grant any hours additional to those granted would have the likely effect of resulting in noise disturbance to local residents, in particular noise from customers smoking and entering and leaving the premises".

The current application is to have these conditions changed by:-

Extending opening hours (to 04.30 hours Friday – Saturday)
Extend hours for the retail sale of alcohol and late night refreshments
Add regulated entertainment

All of our original objections in our letter of 9th February 2009 are still applicable to the current application. We also felt that the decision made by the Sub-Committee on 15th April 2009 to restrict opening hours in particular to 02.00 hours Friday – Saturday to be acceptable.

This having been said we are still disturbed on a weekly basis late at night from noise on the street by people we assume leaving the Wazobia Restaurant and that of The Prince of Wales Club which is situated behind Hyndman Street/Ruby Street which are

directly across from the Wazobia Restaurant. Only this weekend at just after 05.00 on Sunday 16th May we were woken by a disturbance immediately outside the Minicab office at 662 Old Kent Road by people leaving the club and waiting on the street for a cab. At the same time an ambulance and at least 2 police vehicles arrived at the junction of Old Kent Road/Hyndman Street, (directly opposite the Wazobia Restaurant) in connection with another incident.

We feel as local residents that we are disturbed enough already by noise and ongoing street problems and feel that if the Wazobia Restaurant has its application granted the level of disturbance will increase and may even add to crime as both The Prince of Wales club and the Wazobia Restaurant will be closing at around the same times. Further, if granted, we feel that the addition of regulated entertainment which we understand to cover live and recorded music and facilities for dancing, is veering more towards a club environment rather than the all seated restaurant against which the original premises licence was applied for. The music will again add to possible disturbances particularly if we should get a good summer whereby the Wazobia Restaurant might have its window shutters open. Further, surely the type of customer the Wazobia Restaurant is now looking to attract is in complete contradiction to that made when applying for the original Premises Licence namely "Our main target audience are families, churches in the area as well as all ethnic community"

We would like to add that it is good to see any business succeed, particularly in our current economic climate, however we feel this should not be to the detriment of local residents, many of whom have lived here for over 30 years and as much as possible want to be able to enjoy a reasonable quality of life in their own homes.



I write in respect of the above premises for which I wish to make the following representations/objections to the granting of a Variation to the Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003.

Regrettably the applicant has failed to adequately address the four main Licensing Objectives by offering control measures that would ensure that there would be no detrimental effect upon the local community and indicate that the management of the premises have given sufficient consideration to the licensing objectives. The applicant has applied for extended hours on Friday and Saturday's nights and at the same time appears to be requesting a relaxation of the control measures that are on the current premises licence, namely condition 315 restricting the use of outside areas and condition 424 the requirement of SIA Door Staff.

It would appear eminently sensible that in order to address adequately the four the main licensing objectives, for additional conditions to be required as the premises is requesting longer operating hours and not a relaxation of the current licence conditions as the applicant appears to be advocating.

Police would also require the following additional conditions to be placed onto the premises licence should extended hours be granted:

> 1. That you shall require any regular and external promoters hiring the premises to complete the 'Venue Hire Agreement' provided by Southwark Council and, once completed, you shall ensure that a copy of

- the agreement is provided to the Police and Licensing Unit a minimum of fourteen days prior to the date of hire.
- 2. That a Personal Licence holder is on the premises and on duty at all times that intoxicating liquor is supplied.
- 3. That the Premises Licence holder and/or Designated Premises Supervisor join and support a local Pub Watch Scheme should there be one in existence for the area in which the premises is located.
- 4. Customers shall use no outside area after 22.00hrs other than those who temporarily leave the premises to smoke a cigarette. Those who do temporarily leave for this reason shall be the subjected to the requirement of a further search.

Therefore Police oppose the variation to condition 315 & 424 but do not oppose the request for additional operating hours, with the proviso of the additional conditions as shown above.

Police would welcome the opportunity of a conciliation meeting with all interested parties.

I respectfully submit this representation in order that it is given consideration by your Licensing Committee and would be obliged if you could acknowledge receipt.

- 3) That condition 4's time be changed to 00.00hrs


