Following a lengthy debate between local residents, officers and Councillors about commuter parking - particularly in regard to Holmdene Avenue. The community council decided to endorse the officer recommendations which are:

- Notes the results of the 1st stage consultation on a controlled parking zone in the North Dulwich area
- Agrees to the implementation of a CPZ in Holmdene Avenue but not in other roads included in the 1st stage consultation
- The community council agreed as part of the 2nd stage (consultation) of the North Dulwich CPZ to consult on creating extra parking – in an arrangement similar to a 'home zone'. Residents would be given the opportunity to comment on this option of parking layout.

### **RECOMMENDATION(S)**

1. For the Dulwich Community Council to agree the £15,260 community funding.

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

The Community Council Fund provides revenue grants of between £100 and £1,000 for community projects. Applications are considered by the borough's eight community councils, for projects that will benefit the community.

### **KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION**

Appendix 2 contains the funding guidelines for the fund.

The Community Council Fund forms part of Southwark 2016 objectives of

- Improving life chances
- A better place for people
- Delivering quality services.

### **Community impact statement**

The allocation of the Dulwich Community Council fund will, in the main affect the people living in the Dulwich Community Council area. However, in making the area a better place to live and improving life chances for local people, the Community Fund activities will have an impact on the whole of Southwark.

The Dulwich community fund aims to increase community participation and activity within the area and provide such groups with the support that they would have not been able to access otherwise.

### **Resource implications**

The budget for the Dulwich Community Council Fund is £15,260 to be spent by the 31 March 2011.

### Legal/Financial implications

The Council has power under section 2 of the Local Government Act 2000 ("the Act") to do anything which it calculates is likely to promote or improve the economic, social or environmental well being of the area. This power can be exercised for benefit of the whole or any part of the council's area or for the benefits of any person resident or present in the area.

Section 2(3) of the Act requires the Council to have regard to its Community Strategy when determining whether or not to exercise this power. Section 2(4) of the Act specifies that this includes a power to give financial assistance to any person.

The Council has power under the Act to provide funding to voluntary organisations but in exercising this power regard must be had to the Council's sustainable community strategy. These grants, from the community fund, are from revenue budgets.

The Executive in November 2005 agreed for this to be done by the community councils. The money can be granted to community projects ranging from cultural celebrations to providing equipment for local sports teams.

### **RECOMMENDATION(S)**

1. It is recommended that the local parking amendments detailed in the appendices to this report are approved for implementation subject to the outcome of any necessary statutory procedures.

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

- 2. This report presents proposals for a number of local parking amendments, which are matters reserved to community council for decision.
- 3. The origins and reasons for the proposals are discussed in the main body of the report.

#### **KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION**

### **Sunray Avenue (1011Q1014)**

- 4. An application has been received by the network operations team for the installation of a disabled persons (blue badge) parking bay. The applicant met the necessary criteria for an origin, disabled persons parking bay.
- 5. The network development team has subsequently carried out a site visit to evaluate the network and ascertain the appropriate location for the disabled bay.

### Recommendation

6. It is recommended that this disabled bay be installed in Sunray Avenue outside the applicant's house. (Appendix 1).

### **Sydenham Hill (1011Q1015)**

- 7. An application has been received by the network operations team for the installation of a disabled persons (blue badge) parking bay. The applicant met the necessary criteria for an origin, disabled persons parking bay.
- 8. The network development team has subsequently carried out a site visit to evaluate the network and ascertain the appropriate location for the disabled bay.

### Recommendation

9. It is recommended that this disabled bay be installed in Sydenham Hill outside the applicant's property. (Appendix 2).

### Glengarry Road (1011Q1053)

- 10. An application has been received by the network operations team for the installation of a disabled persons (blue badge) parking bay. The applicant met the necessary criteria for an origin, disabled persons parking bay.
- 11. The network development team has subsequently carried out a site visit to evaluate the network and ascertain the appropriate location for the disabled bay.

### Recommendation

12. It is recommended that this disabled bay be installed in Glengarry Road outside the applicant's house. (Appendix 3).

### **Lytcott Grove (1011Q1054)**

- 13. An application has been received by the network operations team for the installation of a disabled persons (blue badge) parking bay. The applicant met the necessary criteria for an origin, disabled persons parking bay.
- 14. The network development team has subsequently carried out a site visit to evaluate the network and ascertain the appropriate location for the disabled bay.

### Recommendation

15. It is recommended that this disabled bay be installed in Lytcott Grove outside the applicant's house. (Appendix 4).

### Worlingham Road (1011Q1055)

- 16. An application has been received by the network operations team for the installation of a disabled persons (blue badge) parking bay. The applicant met the necessary criteria for an origin, disabled persons parking bay.
- 17. The network development team has subsequently carried out a site visit to evaluate the network and ascertain the appropriate location for the disabled bay.

### Recommendation

18. It is recommended that this disabled bay be installed in Worlingham Road outside the applicant's house. (Appendix 5).

### **POLICY IMPLICATIONS**

- 19. The recommendations contained within this report are consistent with the polices of the PEP and associated Local Implementation Plan (LIP)
- 20. The proposals will support the council's equalities and human rights policies and will promote social inclusion by:
  - improving junction and pedestrian safety, especially those with limited mobility or visual impairment

### **COMMUNITY IMPACT STATEMENT**

21. The policies within the Parking and Enforcement Plan are upheld within this report have been subject to an Equality Impact Assessment (EqIA).

### **RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS**

22. All costs arising from implementing the proposals, as set out in the report, will be fully contained within the existing local parking amendment budget.

### **CONSULTATION**

- 23. No informal consultation has been carried out.
- 24. Should the community council approve the item, statutory consultation will take place as part of the making of the traffic management order. A proposal notice will be erected in proximity to the site location and a press notice will be published in the Southwark News and London Gazette. If there are objections a further report will be re-submitted to the community council for determination.
- 25. The road network and parking manager has been consulted on the proposals and has no objections.
- 26. No consultation or comment has been sought from the borough solicitor & secretary or the chief finance officer.
