RECOMMENDATIONS

1. To approve the allocation of funds for the 2012-13 Cleaner Greener Safer programme in the Rotherhithe Community Council area from the list of applications set out in appendix 1.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2. The Council's Cleaner Greener Safer programme has been running since 2003.
- 3. In the first seven years of the CGS programme £21,503,000 has been allocated to Community Councils leading to 1,111 projects being approved.
- 4. In the Rotherhithe Community Council area, £2,433,000 has been allocated to 155 projects, 148 of which have been completed to date.
- 5. Examples of the types of projects that have been funded include:
 - Parks, community gardens, landscaping, tree planting and wildlife areas.
 - Children's playgrounds, youth facilities, ball courts and cycle tracks.
 - Lighting, security measures, pavements, streets, and tackling 'grot spots'.
- 6. There was no new funding allocated for CGS in 2011/12, in part due to other pressures on the Council's capital budgets and also to allow a backlog of approved or outstanding projects from previous years to be delivered.

KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION

- 7. There is £229,071 for the 2012/13 CGS programme in the Rotherhithe Community Council area.
- 8. Eligible proposals must bring about a permanent improvement and make an area cleaner, greener or safer.
- 9. Proposals with revenue costs, including salaries or computer equipment, feasibility studies, costs for events, festivals, workshops or other one-off events are not eligible. CCTV proposals, internal improvements to housing property, works on schools where there is no access to the general public are also not eligible. Works on private property are not eligible unless there is a long-term guarantee of public access or a demonstrable public benefit.

10. This year, the application form invited expressions of interest for the applicants to deliver projects themselves. A due diligence exercise to ensure that this is both practical and realistic has been undertaken as part of the feasibility process. In such cases, the council would give the funding allocation to the applicant in the form of a capital grant, with appropriate conditions attached.

Policy implications

11. The Cleaner Green Safer programme is fully aligned with the council's policies around sustainability, regeneration and community engagement.

Community impact statement

- 12. The roles and functions of Community Councils include the promotion of involvement of local people in the democratic process and taking decision-making closer to local people. Community Councils take decisions on local matters including environmental improvement and community safety as well as consultation on a wide range of policies and strategies that affect the area.
- 13. An explicit objective within Community Councils is that they be used to actively engage as widely as possible with, and bring together, Southwark's diverse local communities on issues of shared or mutual interest. The Cleaner Greener Safer programme is an important tool in achieving community participation.
- 14. All ideas for CGS projects come directly from the local community via a simple project nomination form. Specific schemes will then be agreed by Community Councils and will reflect local needs and priorities.

Resource implications

- 15. The funding for the 2012/13 CGS programme was approved by the cabinet and is part of the council's overall capital programme as detailed in Appendix 2.
- 16. All professional fees related to the project are also allowed to be treated as the capital costs of the project. Where projects are awarded as a grant to organisations, the community council award letter will not include the professional fees which will be charged direct to project costs.
- 17. CGS projects must be completed within two years of award of funding. Projects that are unlikely to be completed within two years will be reported to Community Council and available budgets may be reallocated to other projects.
- 18. After the defects and liability period, or three year maintenance period in the case of planting works, all future maintenance is assumed by the asset owner, for example Housing, Parks, Highways, or in some cases external asset owners. Therefore, there are no revenue implications to the Public Realm projects business unit as a result of approving the proposed allocation.

Consultation

19. All Cleaner Greener Safer projects require consultation with stakeholders, including the project applicant, local residents, Tenants and Residents Associations and local community groups where appropriate.

SUPPLEMENTARY ADVICE FROM OTHER OFFICERS

Strategic Director of Communities, Law & Governance

- 20. This report is recommending that the Rotherhithe Community Council approve the allocation of funds to the individual projects specified at appendix 1. The power for this function is derived from Part 3H paragraph 13 of the Constitution which states that Community Councils have the power of "approval of the allocation of funds to cleaner, greener, safer capital schemes of a local nature, using the resources identified by the cabinet".
- 21. The Cabinet Member for Transport Environment and Recycling has already noted the allocation of the Cleaner Greener Safer funds in October 2011 by exercising his powers under Part 3D paragraph 2 of the Constitution, therefore this is the next constitutional step in the process.
- 22. Community Council Members also have powers under paragraph 14 of Part 3H of the Constitution to oversee and take responsibility for the development and implementation of the local schemes.

Finance Director (NR/F&R/1/3/12)

- 23. This report recommends approval of the allocation of funds for the 2012-13 Cleaner Greener Safer programme in the Rotherhithe Community Council area from the list of applications set out in appendix 1.
- 24. The Finance Director notes the resource implications contained within the report, and confirms that the capital funding for the CGS programme has been approved as part of the overall council capital programme.
- 25. Officer time to effect the recommendation will be contained within existing budgeted revenue resources.

RECOMMENDATION

1. To agree the works to be funded from the shortlisted schemes as set out in Appendices 1 and 2.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2. A report was presented to the Community Council with officer recommended candidate roads for consideration as set out in Appendix 1 of this report on 2 November 2011. The Community Council deferred its decision and requested officers to undertake further investigations of additional schemes and present the information for its consideration. Officers facilitated a workshop in which local residents voted to identify the schemes they would like the Community Council to consider.
- 3. The revised schemes from the original instruction have been investigated and the cost estimates are presented in Appendix 1. Also, the outcome of the workshop, the schemes identified and their cost estimates are presented in appendix 2.
- 4. The Community Council should note that Hawkstone Road, one of the roads identified by residents for improvement in appendix 2, is a principal road. TfL normally funds the council's principal roads network renewals through its annual Principal Roads Renewals programme and this road does not qualify for funding via this programme.

KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION

- 4. The overall budget available to the Community Council is £100,000.
- 5. The deadline for Community Councils to agree the schemes they wish to fund is 31 March 2012. The timetable is to enable officers to plan and programme these works and takes account of the Olympics and other factors such as the ongoing Thames Water Victoria Mains replacement works.

Community Council Selections

6. This money can be spent on any asset renewal or replacement project selected by the Community Council with the caveats that it cannot be spent on traffic safety or parking schemes, non functional or decorative installations and / or non-essential works. In addition to the resurfacing selections provided it, the money (or part thereof) could be spent on minor patching and pothole repairs should a Community Council wish to do so.

Delivery

7. Once the Community Council has made their selections by the method of their choice they will be designed and delivered as soon as possible in 2012/13. Any under spends or projected overspends will be reported back to Community Council for resolution or reallocation.

Community Impact Statement

8. There are no specific community impact issues arising from the recommendations.

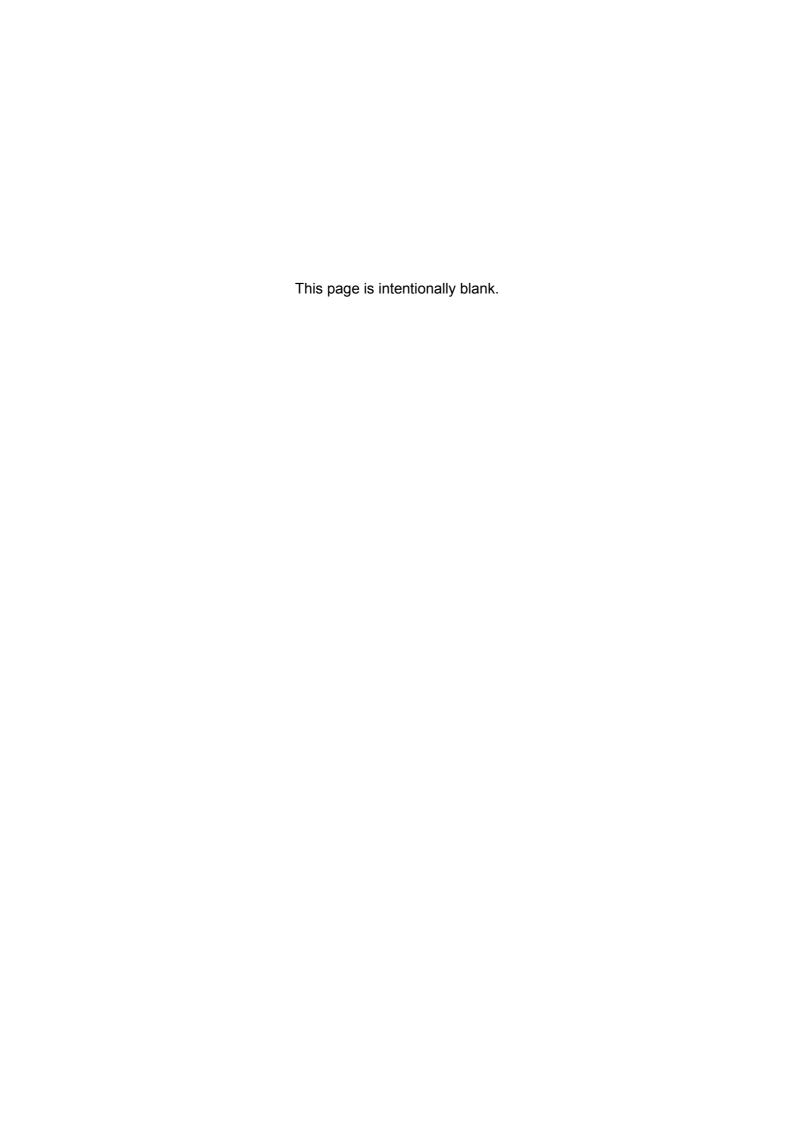
