RECOMMENDATION

1. That the licensing sub-committee considers an application made by Morrisons Supermarkets PLC to vary the premises licence granted under the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of the premises known as Morrisons, Butterfly Walk, Denmark Hill, London, SE5 8RW.
2. Notes:
 - a) This application seeks to vary existing licensable activities held under current legislation in respect of the premises known as Morrisons Butterfly Walk, Denmark Hill, London SE5 8RW under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003. Existing permitted licensable activities are not the subject of representations and are not under consideration at this meeting. The variation application is subject to representations from responsible authorities and is therefore referred to the sub-committee for determination
 - b) Paragraphs 10 and 11 of this report provide a summary of the application under consideration by the sub-committee. A copy of the full application is attached as Appendix B.
 - c) Paragraphs 13 to 25 of this report deal with the representations received to the variation of premises licence application. Copies of the relevant representations and associated correspondence are attached as Appendix C and Appendix D.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Licensing Act 2003

3. The Licensing Act 2003 received royal assent on 10 July 2003. The Act provides a licensing regime for:
 - The sale of and supply of alcohol
 - The provision of regulated entertainment
 - The provision of late night refreshment
4. Within Southwark, this council wholly administers the licensing responsibility.
5. The Act requires the licensing authority to carry out its functions under the Act with a view to promoting the four stated licensing objectives. These are:
 - The prevention of crime and disorder

- The promotion of public safety
- The prevention of nuisance
- The protection of children from harm.

6. In carrying out its licensing functions, a licensing authority must also have regard to

- The Act itself
- The guidance to the act issued under Section 182 of the Act
- Secondary regulations issued under the Act
- The licensing authority's own statement of licensing policy
- The application, including the operating schedule submitted as part of the application
- Relevant representations

7. The premises licence application process involves the provision of all relevant information required under the Act to the licensing authority with copies provided by the applicant to the relevant responsible bodies under the Act. The application must also be advertised at the premises and in the local press. The responsible authorities and other persons within the local community may make representations on any part of the application where relevant to the four licensing objectives.

KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION

The current premises licence

8. The current licence in respect of the premises known as Morrisons, Butterfly Walk, Denmark Hill, SE5 8RW was issued on 27 February 2015. It allows the following licensable activities:

- Sale of alcohol (off the premises):
Monday to Sunday 06.00 to 23.00

9. A copy of the existing premises licence is attached as Appendix A.

The variation application

10. On 23 October 2015, Morrisons Supermarkets PLC applied to this Council to vary the premises licence issued in respect of the premises known as Morrisons, Butterfly Walk, Denmark Hill, London, SE5 8RW. The application is summarised as follows:

- To extend all licensable activities from 23.00 to 00.00 on Monday to Sunday
- To extend opening hours from 23.00 to 00.00 on Monday to Sunday.

11. The variation to the premises licence application form provides the applicant operating schedule. Parts A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I, J, K, L and M set out the operating controls in full, with reference to the four licensing objectives as stated in the Licensing Act 2003. Should a premises licence be issued in respect of the application the information provided in part P of the operating schedule will form the basis of conditions that will be attached to the licence. A copy of the application is attached to this report as Appendix B.

Designated premises supervisor

12. The designated premises supervisor under the existing premises licence is Simon Lambert, who holds a personal licence from Bexley Council.

Representations from responsible authorities

13. A representation has been received from trading standards. The representation is based on the licensing objective for protection of children from harm with regard to underage sales of alcohol.
14. Trading standards state that they would like to see the same "challenge 25" conditions on the licence as are on both the premises licences for Morrisons at 264 Walworth Road London SE17 2TE and at the Rye Lane branch.
15. Trading standards have proposed three conditions which they believe would adequately address concerns in relation to the licensing objective protection of children from harm.
16. A representation has been received from the environmental protection team (EPT). The grounds for the objection are on the basis that the council and Metropolitan Police Service have dealt with substantial problems in the past due to the on street population in Camberwell and are currently dealing with a significant recurrence of street nuisance in the Camberwell area. This service has no relevant records of public nuisance being caused directly by the premises, however there are no direct proposals within Part M to prevent a further public nuisance in the area.
17. The EPT further state that the supply of alcohol on the Sunday are not in accordance with the current requirements of the Sunday trading legislation due to the size of the store.
18. The Metropolitan Police Service submitted a representation in relation to the application. The Metropolitan Police Service proposed three conditions which they have stated they would welcome the opportunity to conciliate should the need arise.
19. Licensing as a responsible authority submitted a representation and state that should the application be granted the closing times of the premises affected by the variation will increase on Monday to Sunday from 23:00 to 00:00.
20. Licensing as a responsible authority also advised that on 3 November 2014 the council's licensing committee considered the partnership analysis of alcohol related violence etc. for Southwark 2013 and decided upon the basis of this, that the council's current cumulative impact policy for the Camberwell area remained appropriate and necessary.
21. Licensing as a responsible authority state that this policy has the effect of introducing a rebuttable presumption to refuse applications for new / extended licenses within the specified area where representations are raised that an application potentially adds to the concerns that gave rise to this policy decision.
22. Additionally licensing as a responsible authority state that this premises falls within the boundaries of the policy area. In view of the limited information contained on the application form, this application has the potential to add to the concerns raised within the analysis over high local levels of alcohol related violence / crime and disorder and / or London Ambulance Service call-outs.
23. Furthermore the licensing team has recently received concerns from Southwark anti social behaviour unit with regards to street drinking in the Camberwell area.
24. Licensing as a responsible authority make a representation under the prevention of crime and disorder and public nuisance licensing objectives. It should be for the applicant to demonstrate to the licensing committee that he has adequately addressed the concerns

raised by the partnership analysis and that the premises is capable of being operated in the manner intended without adding further impact upon the local community.

25. Copies of these representations are attached as Appendix C.

Representations from other persons

26. A representation was received from one other person. A copy of this representation is attached at Appendix D

Operating history

27. In July 2005 the existing licences (justice's licence), were converted to a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003.
28. On the 22 June 2009, a premises licence was issued to WM Morrisons Plc to reflect Transfer of the premises licence from Somerfield Stores Ltd to WM Morrisons Plc.
29. On the 14 January 2009, a premises licence was issued to WM Morrisons PLC which varied the premises licence to permit the Sale by retail of alcohol to be consumed off premises from Monday to Sunday from 06.00 to 23.00.

Temporary event notices

30. There have been no temporary event notices for Morrisons within the last 12 months.

The local area

31. A map of the area is attached to this report as Appendix E. The premises is identified at the centre of the map. For purposes of scale-only the circle on the map has a 100 metre radius. The following licensed premises including terminal hours are within the radius shown on the map:

Southwark council saturation policy for Camberwell

32. Council assembly approved the introduction of a special policy for Camberwell on the cumulative impact of a concentration of licensed premises (saturation policy) on 12 October 2011.
33. The decision to introduce saturation policy was taken with regard to the committee's concern over rising trends of late night alcohol related violence against the person and late night disorder and rowdiness associated with late night licensed premises in the area.
34. The effect of this special policy is that is to create a presumption that applications for new premises licences or variations that are likely to add to the existing cumulative impact will normally be refused, following relevant representations, unless the applicant can

demonstrate in their operating schedule that there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives.

35. The applicant has been advised to address the committees concerns around cumulative impact at the meeting.

Southwark Council statement of licensing policy

36. Council Assembly approved Southwark's Statement of Licensing Policy 2011-14 on 12 October 2011. Sections of the statement that are considered to be of particular relevance to this application are:

- Section 3 which sets out the purpose and scope of the policy and reinforces the four licensing objectives
- Section 5 which sets out the council's approach with regard to the imposition of conditions including mandatory conditions to be attached to the licence.
- Section 6 details other relevant council and government policies, strategies, responsibilities and guidance, including the relevant articles under the Human Rights Act 1998.
- Section 7 provides general guidance on dealing with crime and disorder and deals with licensing hours.
- Section 8 provides general guidance on ensuring public safety including safe capacities.
- Section 9 provides general guidance on the prevention of nuisance.
- Section 10 provides general guidance on the protection of children from harm.

37. The purpose of Southwark's statement of licensing policy is to make clear to applicants what considerations will be taken into account when determining applications and should act as a guide to the sub-committee when considering the applications. However, the sub-committee must always consider each application on its own merits and allow exceptions to the normal policy where these are justified by the circumstances of the application.

Resource implications

38. A fee of £635 has been paid by the applicant in respect of this application being the statutory fee payable for premises within non-domestic rateable value band B.
39. Consultation has been carried out on this application in accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. A public notice was published in a local newspaper and a similar notice exhibited outside of the premises for a period of 28 consecutive days.

Community impact statement

40. Each application is required by law to be considered upon its own individual merits with all relevant matters taken into account

SUPPLEMENTARY ADVICE FROM OTHER OFFICERS

Director of Law and Democracy

The sub-committee is asked to determine the application to vary the premises licence under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003.

41. The principles which sub-committee members must apply are set out below.

Principles for making the determination

42. Section 35 of the Licensing Act 2003 sets out the licensing authority's powers and duties in considering the determination of an application for variation.

43. The general principle is that applications for variation must be granted unless relevant representations are received. This is subject to the proviso that the applicant has complied with regulations in advertising and submitting the application.

44. Relevant representations are those which:

- Are about the likely effect of the granting of the application on the promotion of the licensing objectives
- Are made by an other party or responsible authority
- Have not been withdrawn
- Are not, in the opinion of the relevant licensing authority, frivolous or vexatious.

45. If relevant representations are received then the sub-committee must have regard to them, in determining whether it is necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives to

- Add to, omit, and/or alter the conditions of the licence or,
- Reject the whole or part of the application for variation

Conditions

46. The sub-committee's discretion is thus limited. It can only modify the conditions put forward by the applicant, or refuse the variation, if it is necessary to do so. Conditions must be necessary and proportionate for the promotion of one of the four licensing objectives, and not for any other reason. Conditions must also be within the control of the licensee, and should be worded in a way which is clear, certain, consistent and enforceable.

47. The four licensing objectives are:

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of nuisance; and
- The protection of children from harm.

48. Members should note that each objective is of equal importance. There are no other licensing objectives, and the four objectives are paramount considerations at all times.

49. Conditions will not be necessary if they duplicate a statutory position. Conditions relating to late night refreshment and take away aspect of the licence must relate to the night time

operation of the premises and must not be used to impose conditions which could not be imposed on day time operators.

50. The Licensing Act requires mandatory conditions in respect of supply of alcohol, the exhibition of films and in respect of door supervisors. The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2003 introduced 3 new conditions in respect of irresponsible promotions, the oral dispensing of alcohol and free tap water. In October 2010 an additional 2 conditions will come into force – age verification policy and smaller measures for alcoholic drinks.
51. Members are also referred to the DCMS guidance on conditions, specifically section 7, and Annexes D, E, F and G.

Reasons

52. If the sub-committee determines that it is necessary to modify the conditions, or to refuse the application for to vary the premises licence, it must give reasons for its decision.

Hearing procedures

53. Subject to the licensing hearing regulations, the licensing committee may determine its own procedures. Key elements of the regulations are that:
 - The hearing shall take the form of a discussion led by the authority. Cross examination shall not be permitted unless the authority considered that it is required for it to consider the representations.
 - Members of the authority are free to ask any question of any party or other person appearing at the hearing.
 - The committee must allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights to:
 - Address the authority
 - If given permission by the committee, question any other party.
 - In response to a point which the authority has given notice it will require clarification, give further information in support of their application.
 - The committee shall disregard any information given by a party which is not relevant to the particular application before the committee and the licensing objectives.
 - The hearing shall be in public, although the committee may exclude the public from all or part of a hearing where it considers that the public interest in doing so outweighs the public interest in the hearing, or that part of the hearing, taking place in private.
 - In considering any representations or notice made by a party the authority may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice (as applicable) either before the hearing or, with the consent of all the other parties, at the hearing
54. This matter relates to the determination of an application to vary a premises licence under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003. Regulation 26(1) (a) requires the sub-committee to make its determination at the conclusion of the hearing.

Council's multiple roles and the role of the licensing sub-committee

55. Sub-committee members will note that, in relation to this application, the council has multiple roles. Council officers from various departments have been asked to consider the application from the perspective of the council as authority responsible respectively for environmental health, trading standards, health and safety and as the planning authority.
56. Members should note that the licensing sub-committee is meeting on this occasion solely to perform the role of licensing authority. The sub-committee sits in quasi-judicial capacity, and must act impartially. It must offer a fair and unbiased hearing of the application. In this case, members should disregard the council's broader policy objectives and role as statutory authority in other contexts. Members must direct themselves to making a determination solely based upon the licensing Law, Guidance and the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy.
57. As a quasi-judicial body the licensing sub-committee is required to consider the application on its merits. The sub-committee must take into account only relevant factors, and ignore irrelevant factors. The decision must be based on evidence, that is to say material, which tends logically to show the existence or non-existence of relevant facts, or the likelihood or unlikelihood of the occurrence of some future event, the occurrence of which would be relevant. The licensing sub-committee must give fair consideration to the contentions of all persons entitled to make representations to them.
58. The licensing sub-committee is entitled to consider events outside of the premises if they are relevant, i.e. are properly attributable to the premises being open. The proprietors do not have to be personally responsible for the incidents for the same to be relevant. However, if such events are not properly attributable to the premises being open, then the evidence is not relevant and should be excluded. Guidance is that the licensing authority will primarily focus on the direct impact of the activities taking place at the licensed premises on members of the public, living, working or engaged in normal activity in the area concerned.
59. Members will be aware of the council's code of conduct which requires them to declare personal and prejudicial interests. The code applies to members when considering licensing applications. In addition, as a quasi-judicial body, members are required to avoid both actual bias, and the appearance of bias.
60. Under the Human Rights Act 1998, the sub committee needs to consider the balance between the rights of the applicant and those making representations to the application when making their decision. The sub-committee has a duty under section 17 Crime and Disorder Act 1998 when making its decision to do all it can to prevent crime and disorder in the borough.
61. Other persons, responsible authorities and the applicant have the right to appeal the decision of the sub-committee to the Magistrates' Court within a period of 21 days beginning with the day on which the applicant was notified by the licensing authority of the decision to be appealed against.

Guidance

62. Members are required to have regard to the Department for Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) guidance in carrying out the functions of licensing authority. However, guidance does not cover every possible situation, so long as the guidance has been properly and

carefully understood, members may depart from it if they have reason to do so. Full reasons must be given if this is the case.

Strategic Director of Finance and Governance

63. The head of community safety and enforcement has confirmed that the costs of this process are borne by the service.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

100 No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence -

a. At a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence; or

b. At a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended.

101 Every supply of alcohol under the Premises Licence must be made, or authorised by, a person who holds a Personal Licence.

488 (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either

(a) a holographic mark; or

(b) an ultraviolet feature.

491 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purpose of the condition set out in paragraph (1):

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula

$$P = D + (D \times V),$$

where-

(i) P is the permitted price,

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale

or supply of the alcohol;



I am aware that on 3 November 2014 the Council's Licensing Committee considered the Partnership Analysis of Alcohol Related Violence Etc. for Southwark 2013 and decided upon the basis of this, that the council's current cumulative impact policy for the Camberwell area remained appropriate and necessary. This policy has the effect of introducing a rebuttable presumption to refuse applications for new / extended licenses within the specified area where representations are raised that an application potentially adds to the concerns that gave rise to this policy decision. This premises falls within the boundaries of the policy area. It is my opinion that, in view of the limited information contained on the application form, this application has the potential to add to the concerns raised within the analysis over high local levels of alcohol related violence / crime and disorder and / or London Ambulance Service call-outs.

Furthermore the Licensing unit has recently received concerns from Southwark Anti Social Behavior Unit with regards to street drinking in the Camberwell Area.

Given this I would wish to make a representation under the prevention of crime and disorder and public nuisance licensing objectives. It should be for the applicant to demonstrate to the licensing committee that he has adequately addressed the concerns raised by the partnership analysis and that the premises is capable of being operated in the manner intended without adding further impact upon the local community.

The Environmental Protection Team has reviewed the Variation application above mention premises. I writing to objection to the granting of the variation.

The grounds for the objection are as follow: -

1. The Authority and Metropolitan Police have dealt with substantial problems in the past due to the on – street population in Camberwell and are currently dealing with a significant recurrence of street nuisance in the Camberwell area. This service has no relevant records of public nuisance being caused directly by the premises, however there are no direct proposals within Part M to prevent a further public nuisance in the area.
2. The hours of operation and the supply of alcohol on the Sunday are not in accordance with the current requirements of the Sunday Trading legislation due to the size of the store.

326 - All staff involved in the sale of alcohol shall be trained in the "challenge 25" policy and a record of the training, including the dates that each member of staff is trained, shall be kept and produced on request by the Council authorised officers or the Police

331 - Signs shall be displayed at the alcohol display area and at the till to inform customers that a "challenge 25" policy is in place and customer purchasing age restricted products should be prepared to show their proof of age when buying alcohol. A log of refused sales of alcohol shall be maintained

334 - The premises shall operate a "challenge 25" policy whereby customers purchasing alcohol who look under 25 years of age will be asked for proof to validate their age. Proof of age shall include a driving licence, passport or PASS accredited card.

The Council's street cleaning contractors
may change more if it becomes evident
that more alcohol-related littering occurs.

Any change at all in the accessibility to purchase
alcohol at the premises will increase littering,
anti-social behaviour and criminal offences
potentially. Alcoholism is often linked to
mental health deterioration, and addiction
which is usually going to lead to a bad outcome.

I would advise a decrease rather than the
proposed increase in availability of alcohol
at the premises.

Note that law enforcement services are being reduced because of public funding reductions at this time.

If the Council approves this application it will be reducing the effectiveness of the alcohol-dependency remedial health services that are currently in place. These services are already very over-stretched and the Council tax-payers should not be burdened with an expansion of services to those persons driven to self-inflicted harm and who expect others to pick up the costs of the consequences.

Southwark Council should appreciate, as also should Morrison's, the honourable work of the Salvation Army. Their William Booth College is at Champion Hill, Camberwell where officers are trained and advise against intemperance.


The Hospital accident and emergency services e.g. at King's College Hospital, Camberwell frequently deal with alcohol-related problems which delays treatments to

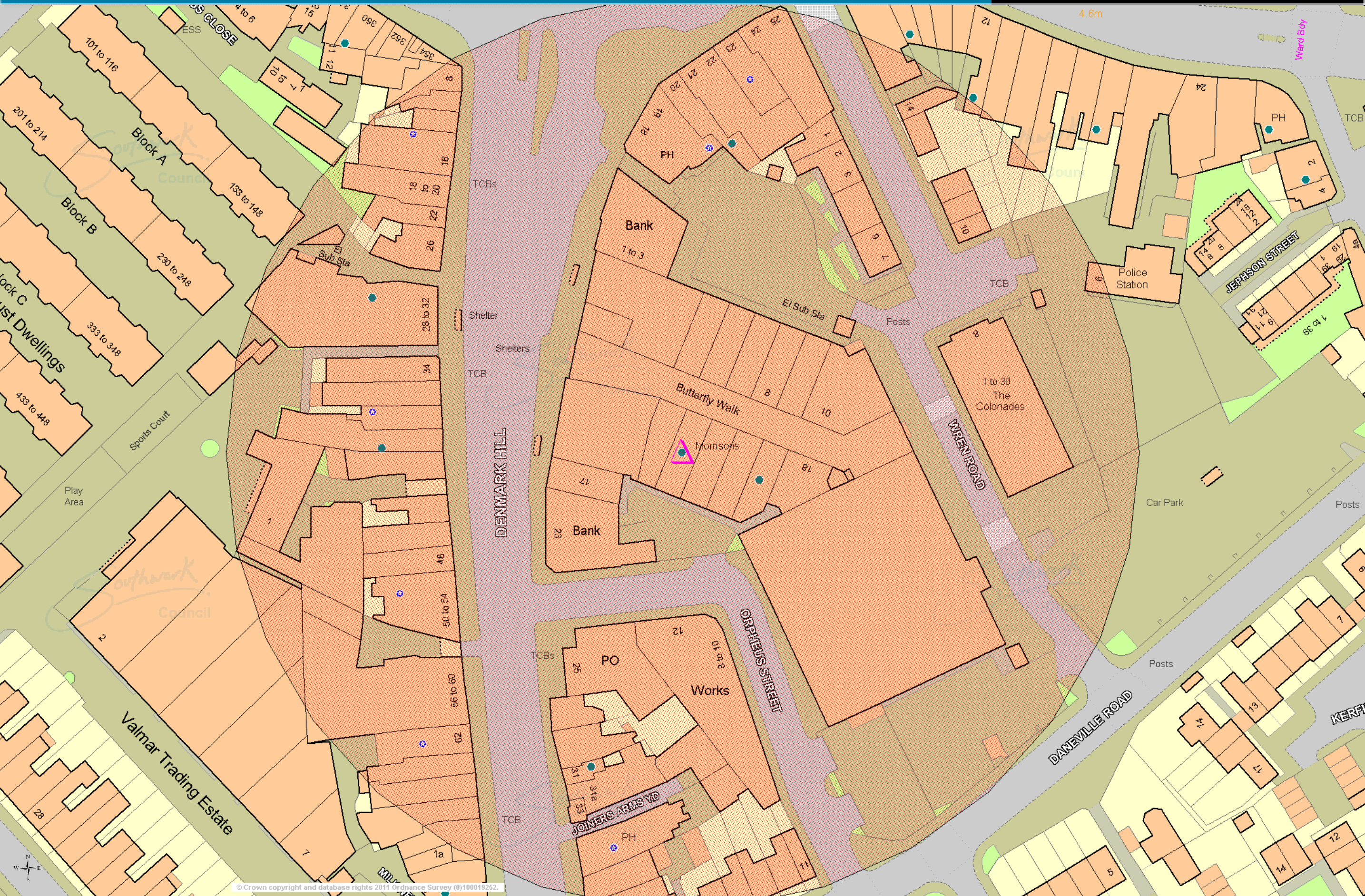
other emergencies.
