Visitors will not be able to park in the evenings or weekends</p>	<p>Significant consultation has taken place for this scheme in the past few years. There was sufficient interest then to warrant progressing the change of times for this CPZ. Parking was becoming a problem for many residents, more so at weekends. Visitors will still be able to park within the zone with the use of the visitor permits, which are readily available from the council. By changing the zone times this should ensure that there are more parking space available than is presently the case, specifically for visitors of residents to make use of. Currently places are known to be taken by non-residents who have no connection to the residents who live in those roads within the current CPZ.</p>	<p>Reject</p>
	<p>The only winners will be Southwark Council with the money they will make from the changes</p>	<p>Southwark officers follow laid down procedures in order to progress all CPZs. This CPZ is no exception. All CPZs have cost elements and enforcement being one ongoing cost to the council. Payment received from permits rarely cover these costs, however any monies recovered above the expenditure costs are fed back into Southwark revenue streams in order to fund other public projects, as decided by elected members for the benefit of all Southwark residents.</p>	<p>Reject</p>

	<p>A number of residents had not received information about this consultation. /</p> <p>The change of operation of the CPZ will adversely affect residents or business./</p> <p>The whole consultation process was flawed /</p> <p>I did not receive anything previous to this consultation.</p>	<p>Significant consultation has taken place for this scheme to ensure the design meets the needs of residents and businesses. Residents were contacted directly and they would have received engagement packs, sent to all addresses identified in the current CPZ area. Various exhibitions were held around the R&SD area. Residents groups, as with all residents and businesses, then had the opportunity to respond to the informal consultation either by completing the online survey. Various churches and residents groups have responded to this consultation.</p> <p>That said, the CPZ operating hours will be reviewed in line with normal council policy after implementation. If any changes are required they will be identified then. Minor amendments needed to the parking zone would be included as part of that review. 	Some residents reported that they objected to the revised times of operation purely on the basis that they were not eligible to obtain a parking permit from the council	The requirements for who can apply for a permit are laid down in council policy and this should be known (or can be asked) before the person moves into the area. Some large blocks or areas have their own parking areas, and some residents are not eligible due to planning constraints on some new builds. It is up to the resident to ensure that they determine the requirements for being able to obtain a parking permit (or visitor permits too)	Reject
