REPRESENTATIONS RECEIVED

Councillor McCallum requested that the extension to the existing zone should only include the Shad Thames area due to parking pressures in the area around Bermondsey underground station, predominantly due to insufficient parking on the Keetons Estate. In addition, Councillor McCallum highlighted the effect on residents in car free developments who would no longer be able to park on-street due to the increased time restrictions.

Councillor McCallum made a representation post the statutory consultation period, this was included in the Individual Decision Making report.

Representations have been made to the Leader, Councillor Kieron Williams about the potential that parking will be greatly reduced for church visitors. In addition representations where received about regarding possible parking restrictions in the vicinity of The Most Holy Trinity Church, Dockhead.

ADDITIONAL ADVICE RECEIVED

The extension of the hours is intended to prioritise parking space for residents, businesses and organisations in the area. It is in close proximity to stations and key bus routes and suffers from commuter and leisure parking into the evening and weekends. It is council policy to encourage more sustainable modes of transport while also ensuring accessibility for those who cannot walk or cycle. There will remain available parking spaces in the TfL marked bays at the junction of Dockhead and Jamaica Road plus additional space for Blue Badge holders to park on double yellow lines for up to four hours where safe to do so. There are additional disabled parking bays on Wolseley Street, a short distance from the church. The church also has its own albeit limited parking facilities, with bus stops in close proximity.

Any changes to parking restrictions are reviewed six months to a year after implementation. During this time, we can review the restrictions around the church and propose minor changes such as additional disabled parking bays if there is a demonstrable need.

The extensive consultation undertaken in 2019 highlighted parking problems are more prevalent around Bermondsey Station. Consequently, extending the operating hours of the entire zone is considered to be the appropriate solution.

This recommendation is in line with Southwark's Movement Plan to reduce the amount of commuters travelling into the borough to park around Bermondsey Station and encourage sustainable modes of travel.

In addition, the recommendations are in line with the council policy for the whole Borough to have on street parking controls by 2025.
